SYNOPSIS:

The Reporting Agent, Agent-in-Charge KIRBY LEWIS, and Agents from the Colorado Bureau of Investigation responded to the Arapahoe High School to assist in the investigation of a school shooting. This report documents the initial response.

ACTION TAKEN:

On December 13, 2013, Arapahoe County Sheriff GRAYSON ROBINSON spoke with Colorado Bureau Of Investigation (CBI) Deputy Director (DD) STEVE JOHNSON and requested assistance in the investigation of a shooting at the Arapahoe High School. Initial investigation revealed a student from the high school entered the facility, shot a fellow student, and walked to the school library. Once inside the library, the suspect fired a shotgun again then shot himself.

Agents from the CBI Investigations and Forensic Services units responded to the scene. All investigative agents stayed in the cafeteria prepared to assist the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) as needed. Agents TAMMY LEE, JERRY MEANS and KELLON HASSENSTAB assisted Forensic Services personnel with documenting the crime scene (Please refer to their supplemental reports for specific actions). All other CBI personnel were released from the cafeteria at approximately 9:00 p.m. DD JOHNSON and I remained at the school until approximately 1 a.m. to provide staff with additional resources if needed.

On December 14, 2013, I returned to the school to be available in a support function for ACSO or CBI personnel.

The investigation is on-going.

SYNOPSIS:

On Friday, December 13, 2013, at approximately 2:45pm, I, Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Agent TAMMY LEE, was asked to respond to the Arapahoe High School in Centennial, Colorado, to assist the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) with a school shooting incident. At approximately 8:00pm, I was assigned to Crime Scene Team #2, which was tasked with photographing, diagramming, and locating possible evidence in a designated portion of the Library Media Center inside the school.

ACTION TAKEN:

On Friday, December 13, 2013, at approximately 2:45pm, I, Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Agent TAMMY LEE, was asked to respond to the Arapahoe High School in Centennial, Colorado, to assist the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) with a school shooting incident. I responded to the command post next to Chase Bank, which was located directly across the street from the Arapahoe High School. Upon arrival, I was briefed about the investigation.

At approximately 8:00pm, I was assigned to Crime Scene Team #2, which was tasked with photographing, diagramming, and locating possible evidence in a designated portion of the Library Media Center. Members of crime scene team #2 also included: Criminalist ERICK BRYANT (ACSO), Agent JERRY MEANS (CBI Denver), Agent KELLON HASSENSTAB (CBI Denver), Laboratory Agent KEVIN TORRES (CBI Pueblo), Laboratory Agent JENNIFER DAHLBERG (CBI Denver), and Laboratory Agent-in-Charge BARRY SHEARER (CBI Denver).

At approximately 8:56pm, Crime Scene Team #2 entered the Library Media Center. My duties inside the Library included diagramming/sketching an area of the Library with Agent MEANS and Laboratory Agent DAHLBERG, which included the front counter area, administrative offices, editing room, and test taking area. In addition, we were asked to diagram/sketch the hallway immediately outside the main doors of the Library.

At approximately 12:00am (Saturday, December 14, 2013), Crime Scene Team #2 completed the diagram/sketch, photographs, and immediate evidence location.

At the southeast of the entry counter, a pattern of shot pellet strikes was observed on the top of the counter. A trash can that was nearly the height of the top of the counter was adjacent to the top of the desk at the east. The liner on the east of the trash can also appeared to have apparent shot pellet strikes. Following that apparent trajectory, I observed two book carts on the south wall off the media storage area. The northern (of the two) book carts appeared to have shot pellet strikes near its top, west facing portion.

South of the entry counter and east of the Editing Room, was an area that contained private desk work stations. The desk work stations did not have any computers or electronics, except for personally owned items that had been left behind. The desk work station portion of the room had a dividing wall on the north end that separated that area from the media storage/work area, and was open at the northwest (near the entry counter area). To the west of the desk work station area was the adjoining wall with the Editing Room.

There was a south and west wall in the desk work station area. A blue AT&T cell phone was located in the middle row of desks, and initially marked as evidence marker 2-5. A white iPhone was on a desk located along the south wall of the room, and marked as evidence marker 2-6. Those items were later not collected as evidence, per ACSO. Various backpacks, books and personal belongings were located on several desks. At the north wall, on the far western corner, a spent shotgun shell was located and marked as evidence marker 2-4.

North of the desk work stations and east of the entry counter, was a media storage area. That area contained bookcases on the south wall and east wall, which had text books, audio book and various media on them. A circular table was just north of the south wall, with two rectangular tables (long sides on the east/west) to the north of it. In the walking path from the entry counter to the media storage area, a suspected single shot pellet from a shotgun shell was marked as 2-7, and a box with suspected pellet holes was on the ground. The box was marked 2-8. An apparent portion of shotgun shell wadding was marked as evidence marker 2-3.

On the far north table in the media storage area, I observed uneaten food at the table, which included the remaining corner of a sandwich, yogurt, an open coca cola can, grapes, chips and an almond joy. It appeared that someone was possibly in the process of eating before being interrupted. To the immediate north and east of that seating area, I observed what appeared to be a shotgun pellet pattern on the east wall. To the south and east of that pattern, and east of the table, two items were marked as 2-12 and 2-13, which appeared to be part of the wadding from a fired shotgun shell. To the south of the shotgun pellet pattern, I observed what appeared to be outlying shot pellet strikes in the top of the bookcase area. Portions of the west side of the table in the middle of the room also had what appeared to be possible shot pellet strikes.

To the north of the table seating area was an entrance to another, smaller office, which was the Instructional Coach's Office. That office did not appear to contain any items of apparent evidentiary note. It did have a door along the north wall that went into the greater Library/Media Center, and was near an exit door from the greater library area to the exterior at the east.

To the west of the media storage seating area, I observed what appeared to be a staff work/kitchenette area, which included staff work space, various electronics, sink, refrigerator, cabinets, printers, and a fax machine. West of the cabinets along the north wall, beyond a wall, was a desk. That desk, based on written items, appeared to belong to a staff member named TRACY MURPHY, who I later learned, was a target of the suspect. There was a black Motorola Verizon cell phone on the desk, which was marked as evidence marker 2-10. Another staff work desk was south of MURPHY's desk, which appeared to belong to KARLA BRACHTENBACH, based on paperwork on the desk.

South of the hallway doors of the library, a hallway extended north and south. That hallway contained locker [REDACTED], which I was informed belonged to the suspect. That locker was also near a "T" junction with an east/west hallway. I was present while photographs were taken of the locker, which was open, and consisted primarily of school books and school materials.

To the west of the hallway doors of the library, at the extreme southwest end of the hallway, I observed a spent shotgun shell, which was marked as evidence marker 2-15.

Note: Please refer to scene photos, diagrams and image scans for full details of the assigned area. The above-description is not all-inclusive.

At approximately 9:10 p.m., our team's processing of the assigned area began. I assisted by creating a photo log as TORRES began taking digital photos of the scene. He took photos of the scene, which included evidence identified at markers 2-1 through 2-15 (Note: not all initially identified evidence was ultimately collected). The scene processing lasted until approximately 11:55 p.m., when we were advised to discontinue until the next day. I later sent a typed photo log to Agent TORRES for his review and completion.

I arrived at Arapahoe High School at approximately 9:30 a.m., on Saturday, December 14, 2013, for further investigation. I was later assigned to take digital photographs within various areas of the school, which were apparently uninvolved in the shooting incident. I was requested to take an exterior (door) photo, as well as an interior view photo of each classroom/area.

I took digital photographs of classrooms C-1, S-1, S-2, S-3, the DECA offices and store, and several rooms within the business office. Additionally, I took classroom photos of the first floor and second floor portions of the science wing of the school, which included classrooms W-101, W-102, W-103, W-104, W-105, W-106, W-107, W-201, W-202, W-203, W-204, W-205, W-206, W-207 and the first floor science office and science work room. I also took photos of the unmarked storage area under the 1st floor science area.

I collected photographs of the main gym (W-111), auxiliary gym, study center, weight room (W-112), women's coaches PE office, training room, trainer's office, men's coaches office, fitness room (W-119), pool, pool entrance, girl's locker, boy's locker room, upper gym (W-108), and several unmarked storage areas within the western wing of the school, which consisted primarily of athletic facilities, classrooms and offices.

After taking the photographs, I utilized the compact disc burner on scene to create an "original" evidentiary compact disc of the images, which I provided to BRYANT with my business card.

At approximately 4:00 p.m., I cleared Arapahoe High School as there was no additional assignments necessary. This report concludes my involvement in the scene investigation, and should be forwarded to the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office.

It should also be noted that connecting case reports include CBI Forensic Services D13-2756 and ACSO CT13-44545.

SYNOPSIS:

On Friday, December 13, 2013, I (Agent KELLON HASSENSTAB of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation) responded to Arapahoe High School in reference to a shooting that occurred at that location. This report documents my assistance with the crime scene processing on December 13, 2013 and December 14, 2013.

ACTION TAKEN:

On Friday, December 13, 2013, at approximately 2:30 p.m., I was off-duty and contacted via telephone by Colorado Bureau of Investigation ("CBI") Agent-in-Charge ("AIC") CHRIS ANDRIST regarding a shooting that occurred at Arapahoe High School (2201 E. Dry Creek Road, Centennial, Colorado.). AIC ANDRIST advised that CBI Denver Investigations Agents were directed to respond to the Chase Bank parking lot at E. Dry Creek Road and S. University Blvd., I arrived at that location at approximately 3:45 p.m.

At approximately 5:30 p.m., I entered Arapahoe High School with other assigned investigators, and went to the cafeteria within the school to await further assignment.

At approximately 7:50 p.m., I was assigned to work with one of the crime scene teams in processing the shooting scene, which was identified as Team 2. The leader of Team 2 was ERICK BRYANT, a Criminalist with Arapahoe County Sheriffs Office ("ACSO"). The rest of the team consisted of CBI field and lab agents TAMMY LEE, JENNIFER DAHLBERG, JERRY MEANS, KEVIN TORRES and BARRY SHEARER. At approximately 8:50 p.m., BRYANT conducted a "walk-through" of the crime scene for Team 2 to identify the scope of our assigned area within the context of the investigation. Our team was assigned to process the interior hallway outside of the library, as well as the southeast portion of the Library/Media Center. My initial assignment on the team was to be a scribe.

BRYANT requested that I complete a description of the scene that was assigned to Team 2. The following are my observations of the area, which is non-inclusive of the entirety of the area:

To the east of outside of the hallway entry doors of the Library/Media Center there was what appeared to be a cloth (evidence marker 2-14) on the ground. Upon entering the library, there are three 3M magnetic media/book scanners. Beyond the media/book scanners, the assigned area to team 2 was generally to the east, southeast and northeast, extending north to a wall that enclosed the media storage, desk areas, and staff areas beyond the entry counter area.

To the east beyond the entry scanners, was a generally semi-circle shaped semi-enclosed library entry counter with a chair and computer at its north end. On the interior side of the library entry counter, I observed a shattered water bottle, noted as evidence marker 2-9. There was what appeared to be broken plastic from the water bottle to the east of the counter. To the west of the counter, a dime on the ground was noted at evidence marker 2-1. Just south of the east portion of the entry counter, an apparent spent shotgun shell casing was observed and noted as evidence marker 2-2.

To the south of the entry desk, a small room was labeled as the "Editing Room." That room contained four computer systems (tower and monitor) and four chairs along the east wall. No apparent evidence was observed in that room, which extended to the south wall of the Library/Media Center.

SYNOPSIS:

On December 18, 2013, Agent MARK HODGES and I spoke with student [REDACTED], [REDACTED] at the Shepard of the Hills church near Arapahoe High School. [REDACTED] had witnessed an incident involving KARL PIERSON on December 11, 2013 in Ms. LOMBARDI'S classroom, [REDACTED]. During that incident, PIERSON got very angry with the teacher and students because he was accidentally locked out of the class. After the incident, [REDACTED] discussed PIERSON'S outburst and his concerns for his safety because PIERSON seemed like the type of person who could bring a gun to school.

ACTION TAKEN:

On December 18, 2013, Agent MARK HODGES and I were assisting the Arapahoe County Sheriff's office with their investigation into the shooting at Arapahoe High School. We were asked to respond to the Shepard of the Hills church near Arapahoe High School to interview a student who had been speaking with a counselor and had information he wanted to report to law enforcement.

We verbally identified ourselves to the student, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and his mother, who was not identified. We spoke with [REDACTED] in the sanctuary at the church. His mother said it was ok for us to speak with him without her being present.

[REDACTED] said he and the suspect, KARL PIERSON, are in Ms. LOMBARDI'S classroom during period 5, which he said was classroom [REDACTED]. On Wednesday, December 11, 2013, [REDACTED] was in Ms. LOMBARDI'S class and he locked the door to the hallway. Apparently the classroom doors are locked once the class starts. [REDACTED] said after he locked the doors, one of his other classmates told him that KARL was in the hall. KARL had gone in the hall possibly to get water for his water bottle. [REDACTED] said something about playing it off as a joke then. [REDACTED] said when KARL returned to the classroom door, he shook the handle and when nobody open it right away, he began pounding on the door and yelling. He said KARL'S face was red. When somebody opened the door for KARL, Ms. LOMBARDI asked him why he didn't just knock. KARL was yelling, "You locked me out, what is this" and other things. He said KARL'S face was very red and he was making a fist. Since KARL was acting so strangely and seemed way too angry for simply being locked out, Ms. LOMBARDI asked KARL if he was serious. KARL told her he was serious like a heart attack and continued to be upset. Ms. LOMBARDI asked KARL to please wait in the hall and she would talk to him there. As KARL left the classroom, he said to the class, "Fuck you all." [REDACTED] said that was the last thing KARL said to the class.

KARL did not come back to the class and one of the assistant principals, Mr. KOLASO, came to the classroom to talk with Ms. LOMBARDI. [REDACTED] said they talked in the hall. Since Ms. LOMBARDI did not know it was [REDACTED] who locked the door, after class [REDACTED] told her he was the one who locked the door. He said Ms. LOMBARDI told him not to worry about it and she had taken responsibility to Mr. KOLASO for locking the door.

[REDACTED] said after class, he talked to some students, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] about the incident with KARL. [REDACTED] was not in the class on Wednesday so [REDACTED] told him about the incident. He said he specifically told them that KARL was scary and [REDACTED] was concerned that KARL could hurt them. He told them he thought KARL was the type of person who could bring a gun to school. He exchanged texts with [REDACTED] around 6:00 PM on

Wednesday night (December 11) and [REDACTED] showed me the text messages. The text of the messages is below:

[REDACTED]: Karl is literally crazy tho

[REDACTED]: He's insane!!! Went way overboard today! [REDACTED] heard the banging next door...

[REDACTED]: The worlds language office heard it. He's honestly scary. Like he's going to hurt us. I'm a little nervous

[REDACTED]: I mean I'd be nervous too...And I am for you, but he can't hurt you. Stay calm and defensive

[REDACTED]: But like who does that? He obviously has the potential to be a threat if little stuff like that make him yell at a teacher

I took photos of the messages between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and they have been entered as an attachment to this report.

[REDACTED] said KARL did not have any outbursts like that during class. He said KARL had an "attitude" but he never yelled like that before.

[REDACTED] discussed what happened in the classroom on the day of the shooting. He said when they were locked down they could hear KARL yelling but he couldn't completely understand what KARL was saying but it sounded like he was saying "Murphy!" After they heard the yelling, Ms. LOMBARDI told them it was KARL. When they first started the lockdown someone in the class joked that it was KARL but they were kidding because they didn't realize it was gunshots they were hearing.

[REDACTED] said he didn't know who KARL'S friends were but he sat near two students named [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

We contacted Agent in Charge CHRIS ANDRIST and told him what we had learned in the interview and he relayed that information to the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office so they could determine if they wanted to speak with [REDACTED]. A short time later two detectives from the ACSO arrived and spoke with [REDACTED]

Agent HODGES provided [REDACTED] mother with a business card so she could contact us if she had any questions.

The interview was audio recorded and a copy of that recording has been entered as an attachment to this case. This report is a summary of the interview. Reference the recording for more information.

SYNOPSIS:

██████████, a student from Arapahoe High School, who knew KARL PIERSON was interviewed on December 19, 2013. PIERSON did show ██████████ photos of PIERSON's shotgun, PIERSON's removal from the debate team impacted PIERSON and PIERSON may have been planning the shooting before the day of the shooting.

ACTION TAKEN:

On Thursday December 19, 2013, Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Agent KEVIN HYLAND, the Reporting Agent (RA), and CBI Agent JEFF SCHIERKOLK interviewed ██████████, a student from Arapahoe High School. The interview was conducted at the Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church, 7691 S. University Blvd., Centennial, CO 80122, where the speech and debate team was meeting for a white elephant gift exchange. Littleton Public Schools also was conducting counseling sessions at that location as well. ██████████ was not at the church for religious or counseling reasons.

██████████ was directed to the auxiliary area of the church and the interview was conducted after the party. ██████████ was advised that he did not need to speak with us, could leave at any time he wanted, and could refuse to answer any of our questions. ██████████ questioned if his parents were required to be present for the interview and it was explained that they were not required to be there and if he wanted to provide a statement he could. After being apprised of the identity of the interviewing agents, provided business cards and the nature of the interview, ██████████ voluntarily provided the following information concerning the Arapahoe High School shooting on Friday December 13, 2013. The interview was recorded and lasted approximately 1 hour.

- ██████████ knew KARL PIERSON for 4 years having met him through speech and debate as a freshman.
- ██████████ usually spoke to PIERSON about economics and politics.
- They were friends at school and speech debate meets but did not associate outside of school. Did not really text and Facebook most of the conversations were face to face.
- ██████████ believes that PIERSON opinions changed from a Christian/Conservative to Atheist and a Liberal view.
- PIERSON began to withdraw about 3 or 4 months ago, stopped interacting and was not expressing his opinion, after being removed from debate team.
- ██████████ believes that PIERSON may have been thinking about conducting a school shooting well before it occurred. ██████████ said that he was surprised to hear that PIERSON was the shooter.
- ██████████ also believes that the reason that PIERSON began to limit his interactions was a concern that PIERSON's actions would reflect negatively on PIERSON's ideology.

- [REDACTED] did see PIERSON on Thursday December 12th and did speak together on Wednesday the 11th about history.

PIERSON showed a picture of his shotgun to [REDACTED] and another student [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who was more familiar with weapons, commented that the ammunition sleeve that PIERSON had on the stock of the shotgun would interfere with PIERSON's ability to aim the weapon. PIERSON suggested a bandoleer as a way to store additional ammunition. This discussion occurred about one week prior to the shooting. [REDACTED] believes that PIERSON may have purchased the shotgun because PIERSON was an eagle scout and had an interest in joining the military.

- [REDACTED] spoke to PIERSON that he had been reading the Dresden Files and that book had explained the many uses of a shotgun including different types of ammunition.
- PIERSON had asked a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] she said that she would think about it but never responded to PIERSON. PIERSON held a grudge against [REDACTED] because of this. Two or three weeks before the shooting PIERSON asked what [REDACTED] class schedule was. Someone responded that she had [REDACTED] in the second period.
- PIERSON explained to [REDACTED] that it only took about two hours to buy the shotgun. [REDACTED] expressed concern that someone could buy a weapon so quickly and that person would not have time to calm down before they used it at a school. PIERSON reacted with shock. In retrospect [REDACTED] believes that PIERSON reacted the way he did because PIERSON thought [REDACTED] knew what was in PIERSON's mind.
- [REDACTED] does feel terrible about what happened but thinking back he is not shocked and that PIERSON may have been thinking about his plan well before the shooting.
- PIERSON described having problems with his mom but generally [REDACTED] and PIERSON really did not discuss personal problems.
- PIERSON was talking about joining the military to pay for college or that PIERSON would join ROTC in college.
- [REDACTED] when talking to PIERSON about the likelihood of being a victim of a school shooting was very low because of the size of their school and that an active shooter would be stopped quickly, in 90 seconds to 4 minutes.
- [REDACTED] was in [REDACTED] at the time of the shooting.
- PIERSON did not speak to [REDACTED] about any problems associated with Mrs. LOMBARDI's class but PIERSON seemed sad on Wednesday.

- [REDACTED] said that he and another student were practicing speech on Thursday and another student said that he had seen PIERSON in the hall on Saturday walking down the hallway outside of C-15.
- Again [REDACTED] said that he was upset and saddened and that PIERSON had thrown his life away but [REDACTED] is not blaming himself for what happened and has not spoken with others about these things. [REDACTED] mentioned having trouble sleeping.
- PIERSON spoke about possibly going to the University of Colorado to study economics.
- PIERSON and [REDACTED] did discuss gun control specifically, they both agreed to the right of an individual to purchase a gun subject to background checks. Switzerland's gun policy was discussed as a model for gun control. [REDACTED] believes that the gun was purchased on November 22nd or 29th a Friday.
- [REDACTED] thought that the shotgun had been purchased because of PIERSON's association with Boy Scouts or because PIERSON was going into the military.
- [REDACTED] saw the picture of the shotgun twice and that PIERSON had named the shotgun.
- [REDACTED] does not believe that he was in PIERSON's close circle of friends and [REDACTED] listed PIERSON's close friends as [REDACTED] (sp), [REDACTED] (sp), [REDACTED] (sp) who is very upset, [REDACTED] (sp) and [REDACTED] (last name unknown).
- PIERSON and [REDACTED] did not discuss specific school incidents such as Sandy Hook, Platte Canyon or Columbine.
- [REDACTED] is familiar with Columbine High School because it is close to his home.
- PIERSON spoke to [REDACTED] that after being kicked off the debate team he was very depressed but [REDACTED] does not recall a suicide comment.
- PIERSON worked very hard over Thanksgiving break on a physics mobile class assignment. PIERSON used his ribbons from the speech debate awards in this project. [REDACTED] said that the project was funny, a little pretentious but it was very well done.
- PIERSON's grades were about 2.8 or 2.9.
- About [REDACTED] PIERSON's class schedule question came out of the blue and [REDACTED] thought that PIERSON was planning to embarrass her.
- [REDACTED] believes that PIERSON would not have used anyone to assist him in the shooting because he would not have wanted them involved.

- [REDACTED] believes that the week PIERSON crashed his car was the week that he yelled at TRACY MURPHY. PIERSON said that he lost his cell phone at the time of the crash and could not call MURPHY and tell him that he would not be at debate practice. [REDACTED] also heard that PIERSON did not really lose his cell phone but did not have MURPHY's number.
- After yelling at MURPHY, PIERSON was gone for a couple of days but denied to [REDACTED] that he had been suspended.
- [REDACTED] had heard from [REDACTED] that the night of the MURPHY kicked off the speech debate team incident, PIERSON had threatened to kill MURPHY. PIERSON's mom and [REDACTED] were there at the time.
- According to [REDACTED] speech and debate were PIERSON's life and that he had been the Captain of the Extemporaneous speech and debate team.
- PIERSON's mom judges debate and speech.
- To [REDACTED] knowledge PIERSON did not attend the Tuesday and Thursday meetings but could still attend the tournaments.
- [REDACTED] (sp) is on cross country and on the speech and debate team.
- PIERSON stated that he had gotten drunk a couple of times and smoked marijuana a couple of times.
- PIERSON ditched school on Friday December 13th [REDACTED] and PIERSON had a physics test that day.

The interview was then concluded.

ACTION TAKEN:

(Note the King Soopers is located just to the South of the school) As ██████████ walking into the store she saw PIERSON in the store buying some food. ██████████ said Hi to PIERSON and he asked how college was going. ██████████ said OK and asked PIERSON how he was doing he responded as fine then they said goodbye. ██████████ said that PIERSON "stormed off". PIERSON was wearing a tee shirt and pants but ██████████ did not recall if he was wearing baseball cap. ██████████ did not hear any threats by PIERSON. ██████████ did notice that PIERSON had writing on his right arm that looked Chinese. No one was with PIERSON.

██████████ said that she dropped her sister off at 10:45 in the West parking lot at Arapahoe High School. ██████████ did not go into the school.

██████████ knew PIERSON because they had taken drivers education together when she was a sophomore and PIERSON was a freshman. ██████████ said that they also would hang out together outside of class.

██████████ claimed to have been interviewed by a lot of news stations but when pressed she said that it was one TV station in Colorado Springs. ██████████ said that she also had a drama class with CLAIRE DAVIS.

██████████ had not spoken to PIERSON since her graduation. PIERSON had mentioned he wanted to buy a gun when he turned 18 but never spoke of school shootings.

SYNOPSIS:

Agents of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation assisted the Arapahoe County Sheriff's office with interviews of students who attended Arapahoe High School.

Of interest were students who were part of the school's Debate and Speech team, which the suspect also belonged and had attachment to.

Other students were also interviewed that were [REDACTED].

ACTION TAKEN:

On December 19, 2013, I (JEFF SCHIERKOLK/Reporting Agent) assisted the Arapahoe County Sheriff's office with interviews of students who attended Arapahoe High School.

Of interest were students who were part of the school's Debate and Speech team, which the suspect also belonged and had attachment to.

At approximately 3:00 PM, members of the Arapahoe High School Debate and Speech team gathered at the Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church to have a 'White Elephant Party'. CBI Agent KEVIN HYLAND and I were there with the intent of interviewing three individuals previously identified as members of the team that we had been tasked to interview.

Agent HYLAND and I interviewed consensually [REDACTED] and he stated the following:

- He had been a friend of the suspect for four years.
- He did not see any expressions of anger from the suspect, but the suspect was prone to insulting his friends.
- The suspect had trouble getting dates and would be sullen about that. He tried to obtain dates with girls who were "out of his league" or unavailable.
- He was not around the suspect when he might have discussed anything violent. He knew of the issue with the debate coach Mr. MURPHY.
- [REDACTED] was shown the gun or a photo of the gun.
- The suspect was frustrated over being kicked off the team and losing his position as the Extemp Captain as debate was "his life".
- He did see the suspect attempt to assault Mr. MURPHY, the librarian and coach of the debate team back in September 2013.
- He spoke to the suspect about being kicked off the team, but the suspect didn't mention any violence.
- He last spoke to the suspect on Monday or Tuesday of the week of the shooting. he was in the cafeteria with friends and the suspect sat down with them.
- The suspect identified himself as a Socialist and wore communist clothing and memorabilia reminiscent of the old Soviet era "as a joke".
- The suspect never spoke about an 'Anarchist Cookbook', but did mention reading it at one point.
- Not surprised who the suspect was when he was identified. However, there was no prior indication of the suspect being able to do the shooting.
- He would occasionally hang out with the suspect after school, go to movies, play video games, etc.

- The suspect spoke to him about working at a McDonalds inside of a Walmart and the people he served there.
- The suspect never spoke about difficulties at home.
- The suspect wanted to attend the Air Force Academy after graduation, but he didn't know if the suspect made any attempt at applying.
- The suspect in the last few months began to develop racist beliefs and make remarks, jokes and used the "N" word often. The suspect began to speak on how people who were on welfare were having additional children to stay on welfare or gain additional welfare benefits. It was his belief that the suspect's personal beliefs were changing.

The interview with [REDACTED] was audio recorded and attached to this report.

Agent HYLAND and CBI Agent GREG ZENTNER then consensually interviewed [REDACTED] and he stated the following:

- He just joined the speech and debate team and only knew the suspect for a short time.
- He had no experiences with the suspect.
- He didn't recall the debate in which there had been the incident between the suspect and Mr. MURPHY.
- He was in [REDACTED] when the shooting occurred.

On December 20, 2013, I interviewed several sophomore and freshmen students who were in [REDACTED] which was [REDACTED]. I filled out Witness Information sheets on all individuals interviewed and turned them all into the representatives of ACSO. Nothing of interest was obtained from those interviews.

On December 19, 2013, I interviewed [REDACTED] at the Shepherd of the Hills Church. [REDACTED] was identified as a member of the Speech and Debate Team at Arapahoe High School (AHS). [REDACTED] was interviewed regarding his possible knowledge or contact with the suspect, KARL PIERSON, who also participated in Speech and Debate.

[REDACTED] stated he knew PIERSON through his participation in Speech and Debate Team at AHS, but was not friends with PIERSON. [REDACTED] explained that PIERSON had "bullied" him by calling him names such as "moron", "stupid" and "fat." [REDACTED] stated he avoided PIERSON as much as possible due to PIERSON'S behavior.

[REDACTED] also detailed another instance during an English class when an unidentified student was giving a speech and PIERSON belittled the student in front of the class.

[REDACTED] stated that he remembered PIERSON telling other students, possibly [REDACTED] how he (PIERSON) had purchased a weapon in two hours. [REDACTED] was not part of the conversation, but believed it took place about a week prior to the shooting.

[REDACTED] said PIERSON referred to the gun as "Curt Cobain." [REDACTED] said he thought PIERSON said the gun was for hunting.

[REDACTED] recalled one instance when military recruiters were on campus and organized a pull-up contest. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] did more pull-ups than PIERSON and PIERSON told [REDACTED] "Don't make me get Curt Cobain," referring to the firearm.

[REDACTED] said PIERSON'S good friends were [REDACTED] who [REDACTED] described as PIERSON'S mentor, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] said he did not observe any unusual outbursts or behavior by PIERSON.

When the shooting occurred [REDACTED] was in classroom S-15 attending an AP Calculus class taught by Miss BRETT. [REDACTED] said they heard three shots and went into "lock down" in the classroom. [REDACTED] said they stayed in the classroom until the police evacuated them.

SYNOPSIS:

On Friday, December 13, 2013, a student entered Arapahoe High School, located at 2201 East Dry Creek Road in Centennial, Colorado, with a shotgun and discharged several rounds inside the school. The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Department (ACSD) requested the assistance of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in identifying and briefly interviewing witnesses (students) to this incident. The following is a synopsis of these interviews conducted by CBI Agent GREG ZENTNER during Friday, December 20, 2013.

NOTE: CBI Agent GREG ZENTNER was assigned to interview any students who were in room C-22 at the time of the shooting incident on Friday, December 13, 2013. Room C-22 is a computer/media lab and the room is always locked. A cursory search of room C-22 showed there were no backpacks or other indication of students in the room at the time of the incident. There is a connecting interior door between room C-22 and the World Language Offices which are the offices for the foreign language teachers. There were indications of five students in the office at the time of the incident. The following interviews are from those five students.

SYNOPSIS:

Between Friday, December 13, 2013, and Friday, December 20, 2013, Colorado Bureau of Investigation agents assisted Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators with their criminal investigation of the Arapahoe High School shooting that transpired at 1:33 PM on Friday, December 13, 2013.

ACTION TAKEN:

On Friday, December 13, 2013, at approximately 2:00 PM, I learned that there had been a shooting at the Arapahoe High School, located at 2201 East Dry Creek Road, Centennial, Arapahoe County, Colorado 80122. Initial reports indicated that the gunman had injured at least one student prior to taking his own life. On Friday, December 13, 2013, at approximately 2:30 PM, I received a call from Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Agent-in-Charge (AIC) CHRIS ANDRIST, requesting that I respond to Arapahoe High School to assist the Arapahoe Sheriff's Department with their investigation.

I arrived on scene at approximately 4:00 PM and stood by at the Arapahoe Sheriff's Department mobile command post, while the school was secured by police tactical teams. Once the school was declared secure, I assisted with the creation of the initial crime scene log and subsequently turned over a hand written crime scene log to Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators. I then stood by for further assignment until I was ultimately released by Arapahoe Sheriff's staff at approximately 9:30 PM on Friday, December 13, 2013.

On Tuesday, December 17, 2013, at 3:00 PM, I responded to the Arapahoe Sheriff's Department headquarters and participated in an investigation update briefing. During the briefing I learned that Arapahoe Sheriff's investigators believed the deceased suspect in the Arapahoe High School shooting, KARL PIERSON, specifically targeted the [REDACTED] and possibly [REDACTED] at the school. Investigators indicated that PIERSON had written [REDACTED] on his forearm and advised that the [REDACTED] where he committed suicide had been [REDACTED]. Arapahoe Sheriff's Department command staff then requested assistance from the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) regarding interviewing possible witnesses.

On Wednesday, December 18, 2013, at 7:30 AM, I responded to Arapahoe High School and participated in a briefing led by Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators. During the briefing I learned that the Arapahoe High School teaching and administrative staff were scheduled to meet at the school between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM. I also learned that school officials and teaching staff were upset that law enforcement personnel were on scene at the school.

After the initial briefing, it was determined that law enforcement personnel would not actively contact school staff. Instead, law enforcement personnel were asked to stand by in the school auditorium and the school staff were reportedly asked to check in with law enforcement prior to leaving for the day. I then stood by in the auditorium from 9:00 AM until approximately 1:30 PM. However, during that time not one Arapahoe High School staff member attempted to contact law enforcement and investigators ultimately left the school without conducting any staff interviews.

On Thursday, December 19, 2013, at 7:30 AM, I again responded to Arapahoe High School and participated in a briefing led by Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators. During the briefing I learned that the junior and senior classes of Arapahoe High School were scheduled to return to the school between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM, to meet with their teachers and gather personal belongings. I also learned that law enforcement personnel would be deployed to [REDACTED] that corresponded with [REDACTED]. I was then assigned to classroom [REDACTED] and asked to identify possible witnesses.

I subsequently responded to [REDACTED] along with other members of both the CBI and FBI and contacted the teacher responsible for that classroom, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was informed that agents wished to speak with the students that had been present in his classroom on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting. Agents informed [REDACTED] that both he and the students were under no obligation to speak to law enforcement. [REDACTED] stated that he would ask the applicable students to contact agents, but requested that all law enforcement personnel wait outside of the classroom, so as not to disturb the students.

Based on [REDACTED] request, agents stood by outside of [REDACTED] and waited to be contacted by students. ██████████ confirmed that he had been in ██████████ on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting. ██████████ reported that nothing had been out of the ordinary on that date prior to hearing gunshots coming from the direction of the library. ██████████ confirmed the account of events given by ██████████ and ██████████ and also claimed not to have been friends with PIERSON. ██████████ provided no further relevant information.

██████████ advised that he had been in ██████████ on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting and confirmed that nothing had been out of the ordinary on that date prior to hearing gunshots. ██████████ reported hearing four gunshots coming from the direction of the library and confirmed the account of events given by ██████████, and J██████████. ██████████ stated he had not been friends with PIERSON and provided no further relevant information.

██████████ stated that she had been in ██████████ on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting and confirmed the general account of events given by her classmates ██████████ ██████████ ██████████ and ██████████ ██████████ also advised that she had been friends with PIERSON and PIERSON's close friend, ██████████. ██████████ said that she had both PIERSON and ██████████ in her ██████████ class and had frequently had interactions with them in class. ██████████ described PIERSON as generally being humorous and fun, but also stated that he had a bad temper and liked to win arguments. ██████████ said that she knew PIERSON liked guns, but claimed that she had not been aware that PIERSON owned a firearm. ██████████ also claimed that she had never associated with PIERSON outside of school and classes.

██████████ told me that on the date of the shooting both PIERSON and ██████████ missing from her ██████████ class. ██████████ advised that approximately fifteen minutes before the shooting transpired, she spoke with ██████████ by phone and he told her that he was sick from being out in the cold the previous night attending a Broncos football game. ██████████ told me that she did not think about PIERSON and ██████████ missing class until later when the shooting happened and she ultimately learned PIERSON was the shooter. However, ██████████ was adamant that she did not believe ██████████ had any prior knowledge of PIERSON's plans.

After completing my witness interviews on Thursday, December 19, 2013, I participated in a debriefing led by Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators. During the debriefing, I conveyed all relevant information acquired during the student interviews and specifically provided the name (██████████) as a possible investigative lead. During the debriefing, agents were also given additional assignments and asked to locate and interview members of the Arapahoe High School debate team. On Thursday, December 19, 2013, at approximately 2:00 PM, I accompanied Agent LEE to [REDACTED]. On scene, agents contacted [REDACTED] and his mother, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] and his mother were informed that agents were attempting to locate witnesses and both were informed that [REDACTED] was under no obligation to speak to agents. Both [REDACTED] and his mother communicated that they understood and both invited agents into their residence to speak further. For further information regarding [REDACTED] interview, see Agent LEE's supplemental report.

After concluding our contact with [REDACTED] Agent LEE and I received information that the Arapahoe High School debate team was holding a holiday party at the Shepherd of the Hills Church, located at 7691 South University Boulevard, in the City of Centennial, Arapahoe County, Colorado 80122. Agent LEE and I then proceeded to the Shepherd of the Hills Church to attempt to locate and interview [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. However, both [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] failed to attend the debate team holiday party. [REDACTED] was ultimately interviewed by Agent LEE by phone and to date [REDACTED] had not been interviewed. For further information regarding [REDACTED] interview, see Agent LEE's supplemental report.

While on scene at the Shepherd of the Hills Church, I was contacted by the Arapahoe High School assistant debate team coach, GINGER GLODOWSKE (Date of Birth: 02-16-1965).

Teacher interview

(GINGER GLODOWSKE)

GLODOWSKE informed me that she was a substitute teacher in the Littleton School District and had also served as the Arapahoe High School assistant debate team coach for two years. GLODOWSKE advised that she had frequent contact in the past with PIERSON; but stated that she had been suffering from health issues recently and had not seen PIERSON in over six weeks. GLODOWSKE described PIERSON as a talented and passionate debate team member. GLODOWSKE stated that PIERSON had never acted inappropriately in her presence. However, GLODOWSKE did say that she had been aware that PIERSON and the head debate team coach, Mr. MURPHY, did not get along.

GLODOWSKE advised that she knew Mr. MURPHY had removed PIERSON from his position as debate team captain in September 2013. GLODOWSKE told me that she had no firsthand knowledge of events, but stated that she heard PIERSON threatened to harm Mr. MURPHY in September 2013, after he lost his team captain status. GLODOWSKE said that it was her understanding that PIERSON was never suspended for threatening Mr. MURPHY, even though the school administration was aware of the threats. GLODOWSKE stated that she was very shocked and saddened by what PIERSON had done and provided no further information of investigative value.

On Friday, December 20, 2013, at 7:30 AM, I again responded to Arapahoe High School and participated in a briefing led by Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators. During the briefing I learned that the freshman and sophomore classes of Arapahoe High School were scheduled to return to the school between 8:00 AM and 1:00 PM, to meet with their teachers and gather personal belongings. I also learned that law enforcement personnel would again be deployed to [REDACTED] that corresponded with [REDACTED]. I was then assigned to [REDACTED] and asked to identify possible witnesses. It should be noted that at the time of the shooting on Friday, December 13, 2013, [REDACTED]

I subsequently responded to [REDACTED] along with other members of both the CBI and FBI and contacted [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was informed that agents wished to speak with the students that had been present in her classroom on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting. Agents informed [REDACTED] that both she and the students were under no obligation to speak to law enforcement and advised that agents would wait outside of [REDACTED] for students to contact them. [REDACTED] agreed and stated that she would have students contact agents.

Between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM on Friday, December 20, 2013, I was only personally contacted outside of [REDACTED] by [REDACTED], while additional agents contacted the other applicable students. Prior to speaking with [REDACTED] I informed him that law enforcement was attempting to identify witnesses and advised him that he was under no obligation to speak with me. I also provided [REDACTED] with my CBI business card that contained my name and contact information.

██████████ stated that he had been in ██████████ on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting. ██████████ advised that there had not been anything out of the ordinary about that day and said that he first knew there was a problem at the school when he heard four gun shots coming from what sounded like the library area of the school. ██████████ reported hearing one initial gun shot, followed by three more shots in rapid succession. ██████████ said the school initiated the campus lockdown procedure and he and his classmates then hid inside of ██████████ with ██████████ until they were later rescued by police.

██████████ advised that he had not been friends with PIERSON and said he only knew him from ██████████. ██████████ also advised that PIERSON had been kicked out of Mrs. LOMBARDI's class two days before the shooting for losing his temper after he was accidentally locked out of the classroom. ██████████ provided not further relevant information.

After completing my witness interview on Friday, December 20, 2013, I participated in a cumulative investigation debriefing led by Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators. During the debriefing, I provided Arapahoe Sheriff's Department investigators with all relevant details that I had learned during my witness interviews.

This concludes my involvement in this case, nothing further at this time.

SYNOPSIS: On December 30, 2013, I, CBI Agent MARK HODGES, along with Arapahoe County Sheriff's Deputy ANTONIO HERNANDEZ, interviewed [REDACTED] in reference to the Arapahoe High School shooting which took place on December 13, 2013. Phone records located by detectives indicated [REDACTED] had communicated with the suspect, KARL PIERSON.

ACTION TAKEN:

[REDACTED] was interviewed in her residence at [REDACTED]. Although [REDACTED] is an adult, her parents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were also present during the interview.

[REDACTED] stated she first met PIERSON in November 2013 when she went to a McDonald's restaurant to buy french fries. [REDACTED] mother was also present. [REDACTED] said PIERSON was working there and asked for her phone number and she gave it to him. [REDACTED] said she and PIERSON began to communicate via text messaging. (Although [REDACTED] indicated they began to communicate in late November, a review of text messages indicated they began communicating November 3, 2013.) [REDACTED] is a [REDACTED] and attends [REDACTED] so she did not know PIERSON prior to this.

[REDACTED] said their conversation was primarily about "teenager getting to know you stuff", such as school, books, music. PIERSON talked about speech and debate and [REDACTED] said she could tell that it was important to PIERSON. [REDACTED] said that PIERSON told her he did not like the speech and debate coach, but there was nothing out of the ordinary about that statement. PIERSON indicated he did not like the way the coach was running the program.

[REDACTED] and PIERSON went on their first date on November 15, 2013. Prior to going out, [REDACTED] parents met PIERSON at their home. Both parents stated PIERSON was respectful and spoke appropriately with them. [REDACTED] stated they went bowling at the Brunswick Zone by Park Meadows Mall then got Anthony's Pizza. Nothing remarkable occurred during the date.

[REDACTED] stated she and PIERSON went to Waffle Brothers restaurant on their second date, "a few days before Thanksgiving." [REDACTED] stated that they had breakfast and talked. [REDACTED] commented on how "smart" PIERSON was based upon their conversations.

[REDACTED] said she and PIERSON went on a third date at Peet's Coffee shop at Arapahoe and University. Through text messages it was determined that this date occurred on December 8, 2013. [REDACTED] stated PIERSON taught her to play chess. It was also on this date that PIERSON showed [REDACTED] a shotgun in the trunk of his car.

[REDACTED] stated she and PIERSON shared a common interest in firearms. [REDACTED] explained that her father taught her to shoot at a young age and she enjoyed shooting sports, which she relayed to PIERSON. [REDACTED] said she and PIERSON talked about going target shooting. [REDACTED] also stated when he met PIERSON the two discussed shooting and he told PIERSON that maybe they could go target shooting sometime.

██████████ said PIERSON showed her the gun while it was in the trunk of his car. ██████████ stated that the gun was not in a case or box, it was open in the trunk and there was no ammunition visible. ██████████ described the shotgun as being "short" and "all black", in contrast to the hunting shotguns she has seen which are longer and have wood stocks. PIERSON indicated that he had just recently gotten the gun prior to showing it to ██████████

██████████ said that this date was the last time she saw PIERSON, but they continued to communicate via text messages.

██████████ said on December 9th, PIERSON sent her a "flirty" message asking if she was tired. When she asked why, PIERSON responded, "Because you have been running through my mind all day." ██████████ said the last text she received from PIERSON was on December 10, 2013.

██████████ stated she and PIERSON discussed future college plans and future dates right up to December 10th.

██████████ said PIERSON never spoke negatively about his parents, but that they did not discuss family much in their conversations.

██████████ stated overall she found PIERSON to be very kind, intelligent, polite, and added, "I really liked him."

After it was made public that PIERSON was the shooter at Arapahoe High School, ██████████ stated she was contacted on Facebook by a ██████████ who identified himself as, "one of Karl's best friends." ██████████ said ██████████ wanted to know how she was doing since PIERSON spoke fondly of her. In addition to ██████████ she learned through Facebook about two other friends of PIERSON named ██████████ and another named ██████████

██████████ emailed screen shots of the text messages exchanged between she and PIERSON. The messages are attached to this report.

After speaking with [REDACTED] I provided him with my business card and asked him to let me know if he remembered additional information about the incident.

The following is the text from the email: *(A copy of the email is attached to this report.)*

Hello there,

My name is [REDACTED]. I go to AHS, and was in [REDACTED] on the day of the shooting. You gave me your card the day we were let back into the building and said contact you if I could think of anything else about Karl. Karl and I had conversed about the US Service academies and was the only main interaction we had. He was always really argumentative and always was rude when it came to talking about my applications (i.e. telling me how there was no chance I could get in). Well I realized after the fact that Congressman Coffman had released his list of nominated students before the shooting, but i was mistakenly told I had not been nominated. The reality was that Congressman Coffman [REDACTED], and he did not nominate Karl. I know it probably is nothing but could potentially be a reason for [REDACTED].

ACTION TAKEN:

As a result of a request by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office (ACSO), I was assigned to Arapahoe High School in Littleton, Colorado to assist with a shooting investigation that took place within the school on December 13, 2013.

On December 19, 2013, I was assigned to interview students at Arapahoe High School as potential witnesses to the crime. There was an area within the cafeteria that contained student items left within the library of the school during the incident. I was asked to identify and interview students who picked up their belonging from this area.

The following students were identified and interviewed on December 19, 2013:

On December 20, 2013, at around 11:55 AM, Agent MARK HODGES and I interviewed STUART LIENEMANN, a teacher at Arapahoe High School. LIENEMANN was in classroom S14 when the shooting started and he saw CLAIRE DAVIS after she had been shot. He did not see KARL PIERSON.

ACTION TAKEN:

On December 20, 2013, at around 11:55 AM, Agent MARK HODGES and I interviewed STUART LIENEMANN, a teacher at Arapahoe High School. LIENEMANN had asked to speak with an investigator since he had not been interviewed yet. We conducted the interview in an office at Arapahoe High School.

LIENEMANN said he was in his classroom, S14, when he heard the gun shots. He explained that his classroom is just down the hallway from where the first shots were fired and where CLAIRE DAVIS was shot. He said he looked out into the hallway and saw a kid, who he identified as [REDACTED], yelling, "Someone's been shot" and saw [REDACTED] turn right and he was running away from where CLAIRE had been shot. LIENEMANN said he never saw the shooter. He saw CLAIRE laying in the hallway but he didn't know who it was at that time. He said CLAIRE had been one of his students in his classroom in the period prior to the shooting. He also saw smoke or dust in the air. One of the PE teachers, BRAD JANSEN, was also in the hall and the two made eye contact. LIENEMANN then heard the third gunshot and that was when he jumped back into his classroom, locked the door and turned off the lights. LIENEMANN felt debris land on his head after the third shot which he thought was ceiling tile pieces.

Once he was locked down, he thought about CLAIRE laying in the hallway and he then went back into the hallway and started heading down the hallway toward CLAIRE. As he was moving down the hall, he saw the two campus security employees CAMERON RUST and KRISTINA running down one of the hallways. As he continued down the hall, he saw the school resource officer, Deputy ENGLERT, look around the corner. Deputy ENGLERT shouted, "Where is he!" and he told him he didn't know. He saw Deputy ENGLERT near CLAIRE so LIENEMANN went back to his classroom. He thought that maybe Deputy ENGLERT told him to get back into his classroom as well.

LIENEMANN went back into the classroom and sat with his students quietly. They heard the police officers responding and they were asking where the library was. He heard ROD MULLER with campus security telling the responding officers where to go as they arrived.

He did not see anyone move CLAIRE.

LIENEMANN did not know KARL PIERSON and did not have him in a class.

The RA was contacted by Agent in Charge (AIC) CHRIS ANDRIST on Friday, December 13 at approximately 1:00 p.m. The RA and numerous other members of the CBI investigative unit were requested to respond to the Chase Bank parking lot located east of the Arapahoe High School. The RA and other Agents were requested to standby while the investigative command staff developed a plan to process the crime scene inside the school.

Investigators were moved from the parking lot and set up an investigative staging area inside the cafeteria of the Arapahoe High School. The RA was initially assigned as one of three individuals to scribe the entry of all investigators into the school. Once this task was complete the east access door was turned over to a Arapahoe County Sheriff's Officer. The RA consolidated the list of investigators with the other two lists generated and they were turned over to AIC ANDRIST.

Crime scene documentation and collection teams were constructed and the RA was assigned to a team to document the southeast area of the schools library. The RA assisted Agent TAMMY LEE with measurements of the southeast area while she constructed a sketch. The RA observed numerous items of evidence throughout the area. The deceased gunman was located between the book shelves in the northeast quadrant of the library. Once the assigned area of the library was documented the southeast team was assigned to document the hallway immediately outside of the library. The RA was then released for the evening.

The RA was contacted on the morning of Saturday, December 14, 2013. the RA was advised that investigative teams inside the school would like the area surveyed with the CBI Accelerant Detection K-9. The RA contacted AIC KIRBY LEWIS who was already at the school and advised him of the request. The RA and K-9 SADIE responded to the Arapahoe High School to survey the area. The RA

was placed on standby due to photography operations being conducted in the library. Once the area documentation was complete the RA removed SADIE from her kennel and took her inside the school for a survey. The RA directed SADIE to survey the access hallway into the east side of the building. No alerts were observed. SADIE was then directed to survey the access hallway just outside the south side of the library. SADIE alerted on a small burned spot approximately 14-feet south of the main linear burn pattern on the north wall (Alert #1). SADIE alerted on a dark spot, on the unburned carpeted floor, approximately 8-feet east of Alert #1 (Alert #2). SADIE alerted on the floor at the west end of the linear burn pattern in the north area of the library (Alert #3). SADIE alerted on the linear char pattern on the floor approximately 3-feet east of Alert #3 (Alert #4). SADIE alerted on the linear char pattern on the floor approximately 5-feet east of Alert #4 (Alert #5). SADIE alerted on the east end of the linear char pattern (Alert #6).

SADIE was directed to survey the areas around the east bookshelves that were free standing in the floor. The deceased suspect had been located between the two free standing bookshelves, towards the north end. The area where the suspect had been had a large blood pool that was purposely avoid by the RA and K-9 SADIE. The RA directed SADIE to survey the area from the south and from the north ends. SADIE alerted on the floor approximately 3-feet south of the blood pool (Alert #7). SADIE alerted on the floor in the aisle just east of where the suspect had been located (Alert #8). This alert was located approximately 5-feet south of the north end of the free standing bookshelf. SADIE alerted on the floor of this same aisle, approximately 3-feet from the north end of the bookshelf (Alert #9). The last alert in the library was located on the floor at the north end of the east free standing bookshelf (Alert #10).

Each alert was marked with a yellow colored K-9 token, documented, and photographed. SYNOPSIS:

On Thursday, December 19, 2013 and Friday, December 20, 2013, I (Agent KELLON HASSENSTAB of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation) conducted student witness interviews at Arapahoe High School (2201 E Dry Creek Road, Centennial, CO), in reference to the murder/suicide that occurred on Friday, December 13, 2013, within the school. The interviews were primarily conducted with students that were in the library/media center at the time of the shooting.

ACTION TAKEN:**INTERVIEWS CONDUCTED ON THURSDAY, DECEMBER 19, 2013**

On Thursday, December 19, 2013, I (Agent KELLON HASSENSTAB of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation) was briefed at approximately 7:30 a.m., regarding my role in assisting the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office ("ACSO") with their investigation at Arapahoe High School. I was assigned to a team of investigators that were charged with interviewing students that were in, or had property in, the Library/Media Center when the shooting occurred. Members of the senior and junior class were scheduled to pick up their property from the library on Thursday.

He said he was looking out the windows of the Library/Media Center and saw a figure approach the northwest entrance door of the school. He thought the subject was walking "weird" and due to that, thought the subject might be a special needs student.

Shortly thereafter, [REDACTED] heard a loud noise, which he later determined was the first gunshot fired by KARL PIERSON. [REDACTED] said he heard another gunshot 3 to 5 seconds later, and 5 to 10 seconds after that he heard a "low voice" within the library saying "Where's Murphy?" He did not see the person speaking, as he was already moving away from the library.

[REDACTED] ran out of the library and down the hallway, to the adjoining hallway that exited the school. He stated he saw gunshot victim CLAIRE DAVIS as he was running away. ██████████ said that on the date of the incident, she was listening to her iPod while at a computer work station in the southwest area of the Library/Media Center. She said she had her iPod in both ears and heard a loud noise over the music on the iPod. She removed the earphones and heard an additional loud noise. She then heard someone nearby her say, "Someone has issues," as it sounded to her like a locker being slammed loudly. Shortly thereafter, she saw a tall white male, approximately 18 years of age, just beyond the entry area of the library with a shotgun in his hands.

██████████ said that upon seeing the male, she got under a nearby table. She heard the male yell "Where the fuck is Murphy", while she was under the table. After hearing that, she waited a short time, and ran to the door of the adjacent computer lab, and then into the hallway, and eventually down a different hallway to the outside of the school. ██████████ stated that he has not participated on the Speech and Debate team during the 2013-2014 school year yet, as he was a member of the ██████████ team. He was planning on joining the Speech and Debate team at the conclusion of ██████████ season.

██████████ was on the Speech and Debate team with KARL PIERSON for two seasons, as ██████████ is a ██████████ and PIERSON was a senior. ██████████ said he was an acquaintance with PIERSON and described him as "relaxed", with a "weird sense of humor."

██████████ identified two males on the Speech and Debate team that he thought were the closest friends with PIERSON, "██████████" and "██████████". He did not know further identifying information on those males, though.

When asked about problems on the debate team, ██████████ said he knew about minor issues, such as participants leaving the competitions before the coaches wanted them to, or wearing inappropriate clothing to competition. ██████████ did not know about any confrontations or problems between Mr. MURPHY and PIERSON.

████ saw people panicking and she said she crawled on the ground to get under the computer desks that are in the southwest area of the Library/Media Center. █████ said she was under the computer desk for approximately 30 seconds, when she ran out of the computer lab. From the computer lab, she ran down the hallway, and left through the northwest door to the school.

████ stated she was interviewed via telephone by KRISTINE or KATHLEEN with ACSO on Saturday, December 14, 2013.

(██████████ name was given to ACSO's detectives as a person to follow-up with regarding the shooting.)

██████████ was sitting near the middle of the room in ██████████ when he heard three (3) initial gunshots. ██████████ described the gunshots as two (2) "quick" and one (1) a few seconds later. ██████████ said his class prepared for lockdown when he heard two (2) more gunshots, which were spaced out. ██████████ said he also heard who he believed was the School Resource Officer (SRO) say, "He's got a gun" and "code blue." ██████████ said he also heard the SWAT officers in the hallway while they were in lockdown. ██████████ said he knew KARL PIERSON because they both had ██████████ together the year before. ██████████ said he and KARL also talked about both wanting to get into the military and going to the U.S. Service Academy. ██████████ said KARL constantly talked down to him and would tell him he didn't have a chance to get into the military, but he (KARL) was a "shoe in." ██████████ said KARL was also very competitive and would make fun of the ██████████ he (██████████) would wear. ██████████ said KARL would tell him, "Why waste your time (with religion)?"

██████████ indicated she didn't know KARL PIERSON personally. ██████████ said her brother, ██████████, and KARL were friends and helped each other last year with homework (██████████ graduated last year). ██████████ said when ██████████ saw KARL's picture on the news, he said "I know him." ██████████ said ██████████ also told her that KARL had told him (██████████) "Someday I'm gonna go get a gun." ██████████ had no additional information relating to ██████████ and KARL's conversation.

██████████ said the day of the shooting, she heard three (3) gunshots. ██████████ said her classroom immediately went into lockdown and they closed the door and was told to hide. ██████████ said she could

hear people running and yelling in the hallway and a big commotion. [REDACTED] said her class stayed in lockdown and later exited out of door # [REDACTED]

With regard to KARL, [REDACTED] said had heard [REDACTED] talk about him being a "politically active kid." [REDACTED] said she also heard KARL was very funny.

[REDACTED] said he told the teacher that the noise sounded threatening and she locked with door and announced they would be in lockdown. [REDACTED] said he sat in the room for almost an hour and 15 minutes before they were evacuated. [REDACTED] said during the lockdown, he could hear police voices in the hallway.

SYNOPSIS:

The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Department (ACSD) requested the assistance of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in identifying and briefly interviewing witnesses (students) to a shooting incident which occurred on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the Arapahoe High School, 2201 East Dry Creek Road, Centennial, Colorado. The following is a synopsis of interviews conducted by CBI Agent GREG ZENTNER during Thursday, December 19, 2013.

Prior to the interview with [REDACTED] she was informed she did not have to speak with CBI Agent ZENTNER if she did not wish. [REDACTED] said she understood and agreed to answer some questions about the incident on Friday, December 13, 2013.

██████████ stated she was in a Spanish class with the suspect, KARL PIERSON, and she considered PIERSON an acquaintance. ██████████ stated on Wednesday, December 11, 2013, there was an episode in Spanish class in which PIERSON became enraged. ██████████ said PIERSON left the classroom to use the restroom and when PIERSON came back to class the door was locked. ██████████ said she thought another boy in the class had moved the magnet from the door causing the door to lock. ██████████ said it appeared the other boy moved the magnet as a prank on PIERSON. ██████████ said PIERSON started banging on the classroom door as hard as he could. ██████████ said she had never heard anyone bang on a door that hard.

██████████ said PIERSON was eventually let back into the classroom and the teacher, Mrs. LOMBARDI confronted PIERSON about his actions. ██████████ said she heard PIERSON yell, "Fuck off!" which appeared to be directed at everyone in the class. ██████████ then said PIERSON, "flipped off everyone in the class with both middle fingers."

At this point [REDACTED] said Mrs. LOMBARDI told PIERSON to gather his books and leave the class. [REDACTED] said PIERSON gathered his books and stormed out of the class.

██████████ said on Friday, December 13, 2013, at the time of the shooting incident she heard some banging noises in the hallway and then saw another student get up and move the magnet

from the door causing it to lock and that student then turned off the lights and all of the students gathered in the corner of the classroom and stayed quiet. She knew this was the protocol for a dangerous scenario within the school. [REDACTED] said she was in [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said after the incident on Friday, December 13, 2013, she heard through the grapevine that about one or two weeks prior to the incident PIERSON was bragging that he was happy he finally had enough money to purchase a gun.

[REDACTED] also heard through the grapevine that another classmate by the name of [REDACTED] (sp?) saw a picture of the gun PIERSON purchased. [REDACTED] was not sure if PIERSON showed [REDACTED] the picture of the gun or another classmate did. ([REDACTED] was contacted and interviewed later by ACSD deputies.)

12-19-13 Callahan Assist ACSO

On 12-13-13 at approximately 1315 hours, I responded to Arapahoe High School to assist the ACSO with an active shooter incident. The school is located at 2201 E. Dry Creek Rd., City of Centennial, County of Arapahoe, State of Colorado.

Chief Tovrea and Sgt. Reynolds requested I respond to the school and help in any way that I could. While en route to the school and monitoring radio traffic, there was a need for female officers to conduct pat down searches of females being evacuated. I was advised to respond to the northwest corner near the athletic fields. I arrived on scene and after several minutes was told pat downs had been completed and assistance was now needed getting the students from the athletic fields onto school buses that were staging at E. Dry Creek Rd. and S. Franklin St. I, along with other law enforcement personnel from numerous agencies, escorted the students from the athletic fields to the buses. After the evacuation was complete and all students were loaded onto buses, an ACSO deputy advised me help was needed at Isaac Newton Middle School for traffic control. I responded to the middle school at approximately 1530 hours, and assisted with traffic control while students from that school were being released to parents. I directed traffic until approximately 1710 hours when I was released by an ACSO Deputy.

NARRATIVE:

On 12/13/2013, at approximately 1240 hours while on patrol at Chatfield State Park, Douglas County, CO, I, Officer B. Vinci was notified by Officers L. Wilder and L. Lujan that they had overhead traffic on Littleton Fire Rescue Dispatch that a fire and shooting had occurred at Arapahoe High School, at the corner of University Blvd. and Dry Creek Rd in Arapahoe County. I then called Colorado State Patrol Dispatch and asked if there was an active shooter at Arapahoe High School and if assistance was needed. The dispatcher was not aware of such, and advised me she would find out and call me on the radio. At approximately 1247 hours, I was advised via radio that such was the case and all available units were asked to respond to the south side of the school immediately. Officers Lujan, Wilder, and I responded immediately with emergency lights and sirens each in our own patrol vehicles. We departed the park via Wadsworth Blvd, got on C-470 and proceeded East to University, where we exited on University and pulled into the shopping plaza south of the school at Dry Creek Rd. where we were advised by dispatch that incident command was setting up and wanted us to check in.

We arrived on scene at approximately 1259 hours. We parked in front of the Chipotle where we deployed long guns. Littleton Fire Rescue was on scene and directed us to a Douglas County Sheriff's Office Lieutenant who stated he was attempting to locate unified command, which may have moved to the Chase Bank. We were asked to hold the South perimeter along Dry Creek, West of University. We then saw a crowd of students running out of the south west corner of the building, across Dry Creek, and towards us. We were then asked by the Lieutenant to escort the student south of Dry Creek, behind the Starbucks. Lujan and Wilder stayed along Dry Creek while I led the students behind the shopping mall. As we reached the Southernmost end of the alley way, parents had already begun to arrive in the parking lot and were attempting to take their children home. I checked in with dispatch who advised me that Incident Command was asking that the students be taken to the King Soopers. Both students and parents were becoming aggressive and it was difficult to maintain order. I explained to the crowd that we could not release anyone until they were accounted for so we could determine who was safely out.

and who may still be in the school. This significantly calmed the crowd, though some parents became hysterical that there were still students in the school. I attempted numerous times to update dispatch of the path of the students, and to ask Lujan and Wilder for support at the south end of the alley, but received busy tones on my packset radio. Signal on my cell phone was spotty and I was unable to reach anyone with it. I then escorted the crowd to the King Soopers and placed students, teachers, and staff inside, and kept parents in the parking lot. I was then told by Dispatch that we were to take the students to the Shepherd of the Hills Church, south of the King Soopers. I was then told by a Littleton Fire Rescue Chief that King Soopers was a better location as it had food and water for the students, and that he did not want to move anyone. I advised him that IC was telling my dispatch to have me move them. He stated to wait until he talked to his representative at IC. I was relieved by other units and was asked by Dispatch to check in at IC at the Chase Bank. Wildlife Officer J. McKee arrived and asked where she was needed. As she had no direct supervisor on scene, she stated she would fall in under my chain of command. I asked her to assist with perimeter and transport to the church upon confirmation from IC that such was their order.

I then walked over to the Chase Bank and spoke with Law Enforcement Command. I was advised to fall in with a CSP representative and brief him as to our units, locations, and assignments. I advised him that I had 4 units including myself and the others were assisting with getting students to the church. As we were dispatched through CSP 1C and had only 4 units, I assumed command of CPW staff on scene and gave my information to the 1C coordinator, Trooper Dinkle to act as his primary point of contact with CPW staff. I was asked to assist with perimeter at the Burger King, McKee and Lujan were asked to assist with escorts on busses of students from the track to the church, Wilder was asked to stay at the church. Using a combination of cell phone and radio using Chatfield State Park Ops and Colorado State Patrol 1C ops channels, I distributed assignments. I was unable to reach Wilder at this time. I then held the perimeter at the Burger King where interviews were taking place. After being interviewed, students were released to their parents after signing out. After a while, the students with parents on scene were asked to stay for interview and release, students who saw something were asked to stay for interview, and all students who did not have parents on scene and did not see anything, were loaded onto a bus and transported to the Whitman Center at Euclid and Broadway.

At approximately 1454 hours, all students were cleared out of the Burger King area having been interviewed and released or transported. I returned to Dinkle for assignment. I then met up with Wildlife Investigator E. Harper, who also had no direct supervisor on scene and offered to fall in under established CPW command. We were asked to go the church to help with reuniting parents and students, McKee and Lujan to continue to assist with transports, and Wilder was already at the church.

I then stopped at my vehicle and secured my rifle. While walking to the church, we overheard traffic that units at King Soopers were not releasing student to be moved to the church and IC had asked that they be escorted to the church. We offered to stop in and relay IC's instructions to the King Soopers units, but were advised that contact was made and we should continue to the church.

We arrived at the church and were asked to secure the back door to the Sanctuary. We then had to locate restroom facilities for parents waiting in line outside for their children. We located the church elder and asked him if he had anything available. The nursery was a separate building and would work well, but was still in lock-down until 2 more parents came to pick up their children. Once the children were picked up, we opened the building for use by parents as a restroom and to keep warm. Upon completion of transport duty, Lujan and McKee arrived at the church to assist. We then assisted with perimeter and reuniting parents with children until we were cleared by dispatch at approximately 1700.

I called Dinkle, who confirmed that we were clear to depart upon signing out. I check in with the DCSO Lieutenant, who advised me that we needed to check out at IC at Chase Bank and get an email to forward all reports. An ACSO unit asked me to sign out on their list of all units who assisted at the church. Lujan, Wilder, Harper, McKee, and I all signed out, then cleared and went back to Chase where we signed out with ACSO at their mobile command post trailer and received an email address to forward all reports.

At approximately 1748 we cleared the scene to return to the park.

NARRATIVE:

On December 13, 2013, while on duty at Chatfield State Park, Douglas County Colorado, I, Officer L. Wilder, heard a tone from Littleton Fire Rescue and the dispatch called for many units to respond to Arapahoe High School for a possible structure fire as well as "shots fired", at approximately 1240 hours. Once he was made aware of the call, Officer B. Vinci called Colorado State Patrol (CSP) Dispatch and informed them of the call we had heard, and asked if they needed us to respond. At this time, Douglas County was calling for "any available unit" to respond. CSP aired to one of their officers that Parks Officers informed them of the Active Shooter situation, which made it seem as though they hadn't been made aware of the situation until we called them. The CSP dispatcher said they did need for us to respond.

Ofc. Vinci, Officer L. Lujan and I all proceeded to Arapahoe High School emergent, each in our own patrol unit with emergency lights and sirens activated. I had several vehicles fail to yield while I was traveling emergent on C470 east bound and I lost visual of Ofc. Vinci and Ofc. Lujan who were in front of me. I arrived on scene at approximately 1306 hours at the south end of the school and staged at the north entrance to the King Soopers shopping center. I safely deployed my patrol shotgun since it was still unknown as to whether or not there was a present and imminent threat. I met with Ofc. Vinci and a Douglas County Lieutenant who was the incident commander (IC) of that area. We were asked to assist with holding the perimeter by the IC.

Shortly after our arrival a large group of approximately 100 students came out of the south west side of the school building and ran to our location. Ofc. Vinci and I grouped them behind a FedEx truck which was parked behind the row of shops in the center where we were staged. Almost immediately a young man, [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED] ph: [REDACTED], approached me and stated he had seen the shooter. He described the shooter wearing a black ski mask carrying a black shotgun. [REDACTED] stated he heard a shot fired in what he believed to be a generic direction and heard the pellets hit somewhere to the right of him. He said he then pushed the kids he was with into a classroom and locked the door. [REDACTED] also believed he heard two more shots fired, and sometime after that he and the group of kids he was with came out of the building. I informed Ofc. Vinci of the information I had received from the witness and ensured that [REDACTED] was made known to the Lt. who was IC for the area.

The kids were then moved further up the alley behind the shopping center where we worked to keep them all together and secure them, allowing no one to go into or out of the group who shouldn't. I was approached by school officials at this time who were telling me and the IC about the person they believed to be the suspect. The school officials were a counselor and an assistant principal. They stated the suspect, named to me as Carl Pierson, had made a threat to the librarian a month prior and that a police report had been made and a threat assessment completed. During part of this time the IC was monitoring his radio and was unable to listen to what was being said by the school officials. I asked them if they had access to the attendance log for the day and if they thought they could get that information for us. I went with them to an Optics business in the shopping center where they attempted to gain access to the needed records but had difficulty in doing so because the internet servers were running

very slowly.

During this time I lost visual and radio contact with Officers Vinci and Lujan and was unable to reach them. I did give CSP my location. I continued to liaise with the school officials as well as answer citizen questions and direct students to the area where they were being held, and gave direction to parents.

Again, during this time I could not reach Ofc. Vinci to obtain information as to his location or what he needed me to be doing. I did not have a cell phone with which to call him so I stayed with what I was doing.

For most of this time there had been another Douglas County unit in the area who had a direct channel to the main Command Center and I did my best to stay in contact and close proximity with him. It occurred to me that it was likely the main IC at the Command Center would be working on a roster of students in attendance for the day to be given to the locations where the students would be taken. I did not want to waste time duplicating this task if it was already being done. I met with the Douglas County unit mentioned above and asked if he could determine whether or not this job was being done. He did not make a call on the radio but stated that the Command Center already had the information. I then informed the school officials they no longer needed to worry about this assignment and could go be with the students to offer support.

I was then able to gain contact with Ofc. Vinci who stated they needed help at the Shepherd of the Hills Church south of the King Soopers where parents were being directed and students were taken. I realized I would be working primarily with parents and students at a location away from the school and I felt it was appropriate to mount my shotgun back in its rack in my patrol vehicle before going to the church.

At the church, students were being held in the gym and a loose system of notebook paper and hand written student names were being utilized to attempt to account for students and check them out safely to their parents. To my knowledge, there had been no actual digital or hard copy roster of any students given to the teachers and officers working to reunite students with their parents at the church. While there I held the line of parents in order and gave direction and updates as they spottily came to me while I monitored CSP and Douglas County's channels.

I maintained contact and coordination with the Douglas County officer with whom I had previously been working and helped him keep things as organized as possible. There was a lot of changing and disorganized information being disseminated as to where students were, where they were going, and where parents should or should not go to be reunited with them. I was never able to gain successful or consistent communication with my supervisor or Ofc. Lujan during the event and thus stayed in communication with the Douglas County officer to provide assistance.

Once the line of parents outside was lessening I was utilized inside the church to secure two sets of external doors with Ofc. Lujan. Shortly after this time we were informed by CSP that we were clear to depart the scene. I met with Officers Vinci, McKee, Lujan and Harper and we signed out from the church and signed out with the main Command Center near the Chase Bank on the northeast corner of Dry Creek and University.

Ofc. Lujan and I were back in service at the park at approximately 1815 hours.

NARRATIVE:

On Friday, December 13, 2013 at approximately 1240 hours, I, Officer L. Lujan, while on duty at Chatfield State Park in Douglas County, Colorado, overheard a medical tone through the radio stating there was a fire and a shooting at Arapahoe High School. Officer Wilder and I listened as we informed Officer Vinci of the incident. He immediately contacted Colorado State Patrol dispatch and informed them about the event. At approximately 1247 hours, we were asked to be enroute to create a perimeter around part of the school.

Officer Vinci, Wilder, and I drove in separate patrol vehicles to the school with emergency lights and sirens. I followed behind Officer Vinci and Officer Wilder was behind me. We arrived approximately 1259 hours and drove into the shopping center located S. University Blvd and E. Dry Creek Road Centennial, Colorado. We parked our patrol cars between the businesses of Chipotle, Wells Fargo bank, and Starbucks. A perimeter of yellow police line was already created before we arrived. Once at the scene, I safely deployed my AR-15 long gun and ammunition bag because of the possible unknown threat still at the scene. A few bystanders were gathering around the perimeter at this time. I followed Officer Vinci to an area where several agencies were gathering to ask where we were needed. The Incident Commander (IC) in this area told us to secure the nearest road (E. Dry Creek Road).

After a few minutes, we saw students running toward our location. As the students came out of the school, we signaled to them to cross E. Dry Creek Road, in front of the Starbucks business. Officer Vinci and Officer Wilder helped to gather the students and bring them to the back of Starbucks (into the alley) and behind a FedEx truck for cover.

I was asked to keep the shopping center perimeter clear of bystanders while the students were coming out of the school. Many bystanders were parents waiting for their children, so this became complicated with trying to keep them at bay. With so many agencies participating in this incident, it soon became difficult to disseminate correct information, communicate locations and whereabouts of numerous officers, and gather all students in one place.

I was in the marked-off area of the shopping center keeping this perimeter clear for about an hour. I met up with Wildlife Officer Jerrie McKee and she asked what she could do for help. I gave her Officer Vinci's phone number and she told me she was not able to reach him. A few minutes later, I overheard Colorado State Patrol dispatch say that cell phone towers were overloaded and communication was difficult.

Officer McKee was asked to secure another side of the shopping center and Officer Vinci asked me to help escort the school buses to the Shepherd of the Hills Christian School located just to the south of my location at 7691 S. University Blvd., Centennial, Colorado. I drove to the west of the high school where the school buses were loading students and I got onto a bus and eventually, escorted 2 buses to the Christian School. While at Shepherd of the Hills Christian School, I helped unload the students and contained the scene where hundreds of parents were waiting for their children.

While at the Christian School, I met up with Officers Vinci and Wilder and they were helping to reunite students and parents. I began to help with these efforts until most of the students and parents were reunited and many of the agencies were clear to go back into service. Before we left the incident, Officers Vinci, Wilder and I met up with Officer McKee and Wildlife Investigator Eric Harper and went to the main Incident Command located at the Chase Bank, to the east of the school. We were asked to sign out of the incident and were provided an email address where all reports should be sent. We then cleared the incident and at approximately 1750 hours, arrived back at the park.

Narrative:

On December 13, 2013 at approximately 1300 hours I became aware of a shooting situation at Arapahoe High School. I notified Area Wildlife Manager Liza Hunholz that I was available if additional assistance was needed. At the time Hunholz was not aware of the situation. I also began monitoring CSP IC dispatch to see if help was needed. I learned that 3 units from Chaffield State Park were on scene and Senior Ranger Ben Vinci was acting as the CPW commander. I attempted to contact Vinci by both radio and the cell phone listed in the CPW directory and was unable to reach him. Officer McKee arrived on scene shortly thereafter and I attempted to contact her as well. I was unable to determine if additional help was needed. At approximately 14:30 I heard that additional officers were needed to escort the busses transporting students.

I was at I-25 and Arapahoe at the time and told CSP IC dispatch that I would be reroute and was asked to report to the command post at Burger King at Dry Creek and University. I drove to the shopping center parking lot east of the Burger King and put on my body armor and uniform coat since I was in plain clothes. I then reported to the Command post where I met Senior Ranger Vinci and we checked in with the IC troopers and were asked to go to the Shepherd of the Hills Church where many of the students had been taken help with the process of reuniting students with their parents.

Vinci and I walked to the Church and along the way Vinci secured his rifle in his patrol vehicle. At the Church we were asked to provided security and help with reunification at the south door to the sanctuary. I continued this duty until all of the students had been released or moved to the Church Gym. I then assisted with some reunifications from the Gym. At approximately 1700 hours I and other CPW officers were released and asked to sign out with command at both the Church Gym and the Command Post. I signed out with both and left the area at approximately 1720.

During the entire incident the communication system struggled to keep up with demand. CSP eventually moved their operations to CSP OPS talkgroup which was not available to any of the CPW officers on scene. I know other agencies also had a difficult

time communicating. Because we were working directly with many Douglas County agencies at the church I switched my radio to Douglas County Dispatch. I think it would have been helpful to use either MAC or network first channels which would have been available to most of the responders in order to facilitate direct communication. Because orders were being relayed multiple times there was some confusion especially early in my participation.

Narrative:

On 12/13/2013, at approximately 1255 hours, I, Wildlife Officer Jerrie McKee, heard on CSP IC channel of an active shooter event at Arapahoe High School located at University Blvd and Dry Creek Rd in Arapahoe County. I began heading that way from the Castle Rock area with emergency lights and sirens. Enroute, I spoke with CPW Investigator Eric Harper and supervisor Liza Humbolt and notified them that I was responding. Shortly thereafter, I heard, via CSP IC radio, that Officer Ben Vinci, was assigned as CPW Commander for the CPW officers already on scene (He, Lauren Lujan and Laura Wilder had already arrived on scene.)

Upon my arrival to the King Soopers (on University just south of the high school) I ran into Officer Lujan who gave me Vinci's cell number. I left a message and a text for Vinci that I was on scene and available to assist where needed.

I deployed my patrol rifle. I heard that one shooter was down but was unaware if additional shooters were present. Many students had been evacuated from the school but some students and staff remained inside the building. Many students also remained in evacuation zones on the north side of the school. A Douglas County Deputy notified me that they needed an officer on the NW corner the King Soopers to work crowds and help direct families to the Shepherd of the Hills Church where many students were being evacuated. I notified CSP IC of my post and headed that way. At that time I ran into Vinci and provided him my contact information.

I monitored CSP IC but much of the communications were on county and local channels which I was unable to monitor. Cell phone communication for a period was spotty. They announced on CSP IC that all evacuations were going to the church but many families were getting reports from their children that they were being taken elsewhere including Euclid Middle School.

I remained at the NW corner of the King Soopers for some time speaking with families and relaying information on where the students were being transported.

Vinci then notified me by phone that they needed officers to escort the buses during student transports. He advised me to respond to the intersection of University and Dry Creek and stated that a trooper would be looking for me. I remained at the intersection for some time with an Arapahoe County Deputy and a CSP Trooper who knew nothing about the transportation needs. I then heard CSP IC announce that they needed more police escort for buses on the west side of the school. I called into CSP IC and told them I would head that way. Shortly after, CPW Investigator Harper arrived on scene.

Upon arriving on the west side of the school (off Franklin St.) I got onto bus 746 with bus driver Lori.

We transported students to Euclid Middle School. Once we transported the first load of students, we were directed to a nearby Littleton elementary school where some students had been transported earlier. We picked up these students and transported them to Euclid Middle as well.

While on the bus, the transportation channel had aired that the school, and grounds, were clear of students and that the last of the students were loading up on buses. They asked all remaining buses to return to the transportation building or start their regular routes.

After the bus dropped me back off at Arapahoe High School, I put my patrol rifle back in the truck and headed to Incident Command (IC) at the Burger King (East of the high school on University). I remained there for about 30 minutes then spoke to Investigator Harper by phone who stated that they could use additional help at the Shepherd of the Hills Church to assist with reunifications. He advised me that all other CPW units were already there. I proceeded to the church and aired my location on CSP IC upon my arrival.

At approximately 1700 hours, officers were cleared from the church. Harper, Vinci, Wilder, Lujan and myself signed out of the church and headed back to IC. Harper rode with me back to the IC where we checked out with them as well. I cleared the scene at approximately 1720 hours at which time I phoned my supervisor, Liza Hunholz that I was clear.




SUMMARY:

On 12/13/13 I, Captain David Aldridge, was eastbound C-470 approaching Quebec St when I received information that there was an active shooter at Arapahoe High School located in Centennial, CO. I informed dispatch that I would be in route to the command post at the southwest corner of University Blvd and Dry Creek Rd. I arrived at approximately 1241 hrs. Upon arrival I met up with Maj. Packard. Maj. Packard was establishing himself for command and control. At that point I witnessed approximately 12 officers making entrance into the south side of the school. I gathered approximately 5 officers that had just arrived on scene. We proceeded towards the south entrance to the school where we met up with approximately 7 other officers from other agencies.

Upon entering the south entrance we found ourselves in a large common area that divided the school. The first team that had gone in went down the hallways that went to the west. I took our group and we began to clear the east side of the school. A Douglas County Deputy was positioned at the entrance to the administrative offices at the east side of the common area. He informed me that he had several staff members and students inside the administrative offices. I instructed him to stay where he was and keep all persons inside the offices and we would work out an evacuation plan once we had secured the east side of the school. Our group moved down a small staircase to the first hallway and began to clear the hallway and classrooms. We did not have a key for the rooms and did initial clears as quickly as possible. After locating a few large rooms and secondary hallways an officer approached us with a master key. I posted officers to maintain control of the areas that we had already cleared and returned to our starting point to do a more detailed search of each room. In the first room that we entered we found 32 students and a staff member. The students and staff member were instructed to stay in the room and keep quiet. I posted an officer outside the door of that room as we continued to clear other classrooms. I was then told by an Arapahoe County Deputy that we could begin moving students and faculty out of the building. I sent several officers to continue clearing the classrooms as I went back to the common area to arrange for the evacuation. I returned to the classroom where we conducted a patdown of everybody in the room and positioned them for their evacuation. I sent one officer with the group to lead them out of the school. I returned to the group conducting the detailed search. Their progress was slow and methodical and had not yet yielded any more staff or students. I took

this opportunity to return to the deputy at the administrative offices. We began to make arrangements to get the 12 staff and students that had been located in that area out of the school.

I was approached by a staff member who had informed me that a young man named [REDACTED], had locked himself in the administrative bathroom. I went to the bathroom and spoke to [REDACTED] through the door. [REDACTED] opened the door and grabbed my hand. [REDACTED] was extremely upset and did not want to let me go so I held his hand and ran him across the street to the original command post.

We were able to secure several master keys from the staff in the administrative offices. I gave one key to a SWAT member on the west side of the building and took another key to the deputy at the administrative offices and gave him instructions to open, clear and mark all the doors in the administrative offices. I then returned to the group on the west side of the building to supply them with another key. I was informed that they had located another 18 students and 1 staff member in the drama room. The decision was made to move them to a smaller classroom with one point of entry. We relocated them to the same classroom that we found the original students that were already evacuated.

One of the members of the clearing team came to me and informed me that they had found 124 faculty and students in one of the tech labs. I went to the room, spoke briefly with the staff and posted a deputy on the door. At this point the deputy assigned to the administrative offices informed me that he had located 13 faculty members in a small conference room in the administrative offices. We were given the go ahead to move those faculty members out of the school. Shortly thereafter I was informed that six more faculty and students were located in the cafeteria offices. I returned to the common area and approached a SWAT member and briefed him on the number of people that we had found and their locations. I was informed that there would be no more evacuations at that time until the bomb unit could clear evacuation routes with their bomb detection dogs.

With this information I began to go around to the various groups of staff and students to inform them of what was transpiring. I continued to do this for approximately every twenty minutes. Sometime later we were informed that we could take a large group of students out of the east side of the school and move them to a rally point at the south side of the school. The clearing teams reported back to me that they had finished their secondary clears and had posted strategically to be able to maintain control of all areas. I coordinated officers to escort the staff and students along the outside of the school and instructed the staff to keep their students together for accurate headcounts. Once on the south side of the school we met up with several hundred other staff and students from various other parts of the school. The students were then moved towards the King Soopers to the south.

I went back into the school where a SWAT team had begun a detail clear. The original officers were holding there over watch positions to help facilitate this. The situation being stabilized, I turned over control of the officers to the SWAT team. I then responded to the command post that was now located on the Northeast corner of University Blvd and Dry Creek Rd.

Upon arrival at the command post I met up with Maj. Savage and other members of the command staff. They informed me that they needed someone to go to Littleton, to the bus barn, to escort several busses to the west side of the school. After escorting the busses to the west side of the school I was approached by Sgt. Rich Smith and asked to take two witnesses to Euclid Middle School. In addition he asked if I could escort some of the busses to the Shepard of the Hills church. I escorted the busses to the church and then relayed the witnesses to the detectives at Euclid Middle School. I then returned to the command post and waited for further assignment. I was released from the scene at approximately 1715 hrs.

On 12/13/13, at approximately 12:58 hours, I was notified by Sergeant Grissom of the 1A troop that there was an active shooter at Arapahoe High School. Since I was leaving the Golden area to respond to the Arapahoe County Courthouse, I offered to switch to the 1C area to assist. I cleared the office and was told by the 1A dispatcher that there were two motorist assists, in the 1C area, that I could help with. The first assist was on C470 at University. As I responded to that location, I monitored the 1C channel. After hearing request for assistance clearing the students from the school, I notified the dispatcher of my estimated ETA to the school. Major Packard asked that all responding troopers not already at the scene remain available and not to go to the school. While en route to the assist, I observed three cars on the left shoulder of C470 in the area of University Boulevard. Upon contacting the drivers, I was told by all three that they were done exchanging information and wanted to do a counter report given the news of the school shooting. I next verified the safety of the motorist assist and cleared the remainder of C470.

After making a delivery at the Arapahoe County Court House, I heard 1C dispatch asking for a trooper to respond to the school to help with the student evacuations. The responding trooper was coming from the Castle Rock area. I informed dispatch of my location and the 1C trooper was told to continue that direction. Due to the heavy radio traffic, I verified with 6A dispatch that I was available to assist with calls in the 1C area and that I was in the area of Arapahoe High School if they needed assistance. At approximately 14:45 hours, I was notified by 6A dispatch that I was to respond to the command post at the Burger King. Upon my arrival at approximately 14:47 hours, I checked in and provided my call sign to the record keeper. I was asked to move and secure a patrol vehicle, which was left in a parking lot upon the trooper's arrival. At approximately 1500 hours, I was asked to assist with escorting students from the school to the church. I escorted buses from the west side of the school to the church and then relayed law enforcement back to their vehicles. At approximately 16:22 hours, I was released from the scene.

Summary:

On 121313 at about 1240, I discovered via a local news broadcast of an in progress shooting at Arapahoe High School in Centennial, Colorado. Several CSP units and command elements were already on scene. I contacted dispatch and asked if further resources were needed. I was advised that Major Packard stated there was not. I advised dispatch that I was available if the need arose.

At about 1435, I was advised there was a request from Major Savage for personnel to assist escorting busses of students to Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church. I responded at 1444 and arrived near the command post at about 1515. I checked in at the command post and reported to Major Savage.

I was assigned to assist with traffic control on University Boulevard (Colorado 177) along with Sergeant James Senecal from Troop 1C. We walked to the location and assisted units from Denver Public Schools as well as Trooper Brian Walters from Troop 8C. We maintained that location, directing traffic in and out of the church until relieved at about 1725.

I checked out with the command post and went home.

SUMMARY:

On December 13, 2013, at approximately 1245 hours, I was on duty and in the area of County Line Road and I-25 monitoring radio traffic on the Troop 1C channel. I overheard the communications officer dispatch I-C-13 (Trooper Dinkel) to a possible shooting at Arapahoe High School. Numerous other Troopers assigned to the area indicated they would be en route to the school as well. I tuned the radio in my patrol car to the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office primary dispatch channel and monitored traffic. Among other significant radio traffic, I heard a Deputy advise there was a student down and multiple rounds around a backpack. At that time I went en route to the scene, arriving at approximately 1300 hours.

Upon my arrival I parked my vehicle near the Chipotle restaurant on the southwest corner of University Boulevard and Dry Creek Road, or due south of the high school. Numerous other Troopers were arriving at roughly the same time. I noticed Lt Katafo from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office standing near the south curb of Dry Creek and approached him to learn the current status. Lt Katafo indicated they were still assembling teams to enter the school. At that time Captain David Aldridge and Corporal Darrell Salberg proceeded across Dry Creek to assist in the entry. I grabbed Trooper Dinkel and asked him to stay with me for the duration of the event. At about that time a large amount of students began exiting from the south side of the school moving to the south. I asked additional CSP members to assist with moving the students to safety. I then proceeded to the northeast corner of Dry Creek and University.

I arrived at the incident command post and identified myself as the representative for the Colorado State Patrol. While serving in that capacity I assigned Troopers to assist with student evacuations from the north side of the school as well as students that had initially moved to the King Soopers shopping center in the area. Eventually those students were moved to the Shepard of the Hills church. I also arranged for Troopers to escort school busses into and out of the area to facilitate the evacuation of students. A short time after arriving on scene, Lt Colonel Leffler assumed my position as the agency representative within the command post.

I remained on scene until approximately 1645 hours assisting with information flow and task assignments between the command post and our Troopers assigned to the incident. When I cleared my responsibilities were turned over to Major Mark Savage, who remained in the command post until approximately 1800 hours.

SYNOPSIS: On 12/13/13 I responded to and assisted in a critical incident at Arapahoe High School.

SUMMARY:

On December 13, 2013 at 1314 hours, I, Major Mark Savage, Trooper and Motor Carrier Services District Commander for the Colorado State Patrol ("CSP") was notified of a school shooting in progress at Arapahoe County High School. As the incoming Metro District Commander, this school is in my future area of responsibility. As I responded to the scene, I monitored the I-C radio channel and determined that I was to respond to the command post located at the corner of University Blvd. and Dry Creek Blvd.

Upon my arrival at 1406 hours, I located the CSP Deputy Incident Commander Major Matt Packard who was already on-scene with Lt. Colonel Brenda Leffler, who was the CSP Incident Commander. Major Packard asked me to set up a dedicated radio frequency for responding troopers and arrange a meeting place for those troopers. He also asked me to locate an additional 10 troopers to respond and assist. I immediately notified dispatch to locate and send the 10 troopers. At 1414 hours, I was notified by the Governor's Protection Detail that he was en-route and that they may need assistance facilitating his arrival and getting him through traffic. At approximately 1445 hours, the Governor arrived but they did not require my assistance.

At 1455 hours I again spoke with dispatch and they told me that they were able to locate and respond seven troopers up to this point. I advised them that seven was enough and to tell them to contact me on Ops Channel 1 when they are en-route. As all seven troopers notified me that they were en-route I advised all responding troopers to come to my location at the Command Post for assignment. The troopers responding to assist were Sergeant Wayne Sanderlin, Trooper Mark Bannister, Sergeant Larry Oletski, Trooper Rob Madden, Trooper John Huck, Trooper Jeremy Hostetter and Trooper Matthew Molesworth. Additionally, Trooper David Dinkle was assigned to me to track the assignments for the responding troopers.

As the troopers arrived, I assigned them as calls for service came in. At approximately 1500 hours I sent Sergeant Wayne Sanderlin to [REDACTED] to assist with parent-child reunions. At 1502 I sent Trooper Madden to the west side of the school to assist with evacuations. As the other troopers arrived I advised them to stand-by in a ready mode and await further assignment. I believe that Sergeant Oletski, Troopers Bannister, Huck, Hostetter and Molesworth were released without an assignment at approximately 1700 hours.

As each trooper was released, I de-briefed them by obtaining an account of what action they took, what they saw, had them confirm their names with Trooper Dinkle for documentation purposes and confirmed that they were comfortable continuing on with their shift.

Additionally, I also personally spoke with all of the troopers who were on-scene prior to their departure and provided them with the same de-brief. During those de-briefs I learned that Captain David Aldridge, Trooper Kevin Cochran and Trooper Darrel Aulston had all responded into the school to make an initial entry. I confirmed with each of them that they were in good mental spirits and comfortable departing the scene. All of the other troopers were in good mental health as well.

At approximately 1702 hours, Lt. Colonel Leffler advised me that she and Major Packard were departing and that I was assuming command for CSP resources on scene. At that time the majority of CSP resources consisted of investigative troopers who were assisting with the investigation within the school. I did not have contact with the investigators at any time. As a member of the Unified Incident Command, I debriefed each of our members prior to their departure and assisted Arapahoe County SO with a staffing request for crime scene perimeter security. At approximately 1930 hours, I released the last troopers from assignment and we no longer had any troopers assisting except the investigators.

At 2117 hours, after confirming the placement of three troopers to assist with the graveyard perimeter security, I cleared the scene and drove home.

On Saturday December 14, 2013 I contacted Trooper Cochran and Corporal Aulston to confirm that they were doing ok and they both indicated they were.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The vehicle I was driving was CSP 820, an unmarked Dodge Charger equipped with flashing red and blue lights.

I was in a full Class A long-sleeve uniform, as well as CSP issued jacket and hat.

SYNOPSIS: On 12/13/13, I responded to and assisted in a critical incident at Arapahoe High School.

SUMMARY:

On December 13, 2013, I, Trooper Josh Lewis, Trooper and Public Information Officer for the Colorado State Patrol (CSP) was en route to conduct two interviews with local Colorado Springs media in the Monument, CO, area. Shortly after leaving my office (located at 700 Kipling St, Lakewood, CO) I received a voicemail from the Denver Regional Communications Center (dispatch) regarding a shooting incident at Arapahoe High School (AHS). I monitored the I-C radio channel and overheard several units, on 10-33 traffic, indicate they were en route to the school. I contact Captain Jeff Goodwin, CSP Public Affairs, to make sure he was informed or inquire if he had any further information about the incident; he was being given information during my call resulting in me leaving a voicemail for him. I contacted Sergeant Mike Baker, CSP Public Affairs, to inquire if he knew of the incident and/or had any information. He was unaware of the incident and directed me to respond to the Incident Command Center being set up near the school in lieu of continuing to my scheduled interviews. I informed him I would be en route and contact the respective TV stations after arriving. I activated my emergency lights and sirens and proceeded south on Interstate 25. A call for all available units in the area to respond was aired; I responded I was en route.

I contacted dispatch via cell phone and informed them I would be en route to AHS, getting directions for the best route based on road closures, etc. Captain Goodwin called and advised he was aware of the incident, acknowledged my dismissing my previously planned interviews and the need to respond to AHS. He indicated he would make calls to the respective TV stations to let them know I would be unable to make the appointments. Shortly thereafter, I arrived on scene.

Upon arrival I parked my patrol car and attempted to find the Incident Command Center (ICC). I observed a CSP Sergeant nearby, guarding a roadway and was informed the ICC had been moved across the street, near Burger King. I took a photo with my state-issued phone of the responding law enforcement units. I found Major Matt Packard, CSP, with several other law enforcement officials having a briefing in the parking lot. I let Major Packard know I was on scene and available for whatever use was needed of me. He asked me to stand by. We were informed the suspected gunman inside the school was down, with only a few known injuries. Bomb squads were being brought in based on at least one Molotov-cocktail-style device being found. Assignments were given to various members, at which point I was asked to accompany a Lieutenant from the Arapahoe Sheriff's Office to the athletic field (football field and track) on the north side of AHS.

I drove with the LT to the field, observing blocked and barricaded roadways and what appeared to be civilians running to or near the entrances/exits of the school. While driving, I overheard Major Packard requesting my location; I attempted to contact him directly via my PAC set but was unable to transmit out. I attempted to contact CSP Trooper David Gurule via cell phone (Trooper Gurule was requesting me on behalf of Major Packard) in order to advise of my location. I was unable to contact him due to bad reception/busy circuits in the area.

Upon arrival to the north side of AHS, I saw hundreds of students (and corresponding faculty members) being led from the school to the track. All were asked to keep their hands up or on their heads until arriving on the track itself. I overheard several students remark, nonchalantly, they were pleased not to have to be taking tests for various subjects and the incident was a convenient way to ditch class they did not study for.

The LT asked I helped guard the fence line to ensure that no students left and, more likely, no parents hopped over to retrieve students. I walked along a fence line and was able to make contact with Trooper Gurule via cell phone; I was put in touch with Major Packard and informed him of my assignment to guard students on the field. He acknowledged.

While keeping the students in one area, several parents (and at least one media member) approached the fence. Based on the lack of information (at least information that had been confirmed) and the sensitive nature of the information, I informed parents there was not much to say at that time.

However, based on my experience and position in the Public Affairs Unit, I understand that even a little information is often enough to appease people and prevent further escalation of events (in this case, hopping a fence or becoming combative by parents). I informed parents that were around me the threat had been subdued and there was no immediate danger, and there had not been for a while, though students would still not be sent back into the school, at all. I indicated to watch social media, and I would tell them the location they could pick up their children as soon as I received the information and they were able to go. Though parents could physically see (some were also speaking via cell phone to students/children on the field), the information was sufficient to relieve fears and allowed the steadily growing crowd of parents to remain pacified. I continued monitoring radio traffic and took multiple photos of the gathered and protected students on the track.

Throughout my guarding assignment, I remained in contact and updated Captain Goodwin and Sergeant Baker via text messages. This included sending the aforementioned pictures for possible use in social media (Twitter, etc.) to give out public information. These messages were often slow in being transmitted due to the overwhelming amount of bandwidth being used in the area at that time. I also requested someone in Public Affairs "take call" (have incoming media calls transferred to them), as

I was unable to respond to anyone calling me and needed to keep lines of communication open. Sergeant Baker indicated he would take call for me.

While I was standing guard, a male parent asked if every building had been searched; I informed him I was not aware to what extent the building(s) had been secured but that it was being handled at the moment. He indicated his daughter, a student at the school, was in an "out building" that was not attached to the main AHS building, and located on the north side (near our location). He stated his daughter told him she (and her class) was still inside the building and nobody (meaning law enforcement) had been by to check on them. They were remaining in their class until told otherwise.

I informed the gentleman I would relay the information, and passed it onto a member of a local SWAT team that was also guarding the area. He asked which building; I informed him I did not know, but it was in our area on the north side. Together we cleared two small buildings/garages that were locked from the outside and secured. He indicated he would relay the information about another class or building not being checked yet.

I informed the gentleman I had relayed the information. He pointed to a tan building near the main campus of AHS and said he believed it was the building his daughter was in. I indicated I understood and would again relay the information, which I did (to the same SWAT member).

According to the radio (dispatch), several buses were being let through to transport the students on the track to a secure location for parent retrieval. I observed several lines or classes of students being lead off the field to the busses. Radio traffic indicated the students were being taken to Euclid Middle School (also referred to as an elementary school). Traffic indicated parents were allowed to meet students and sign them out if the student was not a witness to the main incident. I informed parents the students were being taken from the field via bus and would be released to them shortly. Parents started to disperse. I returned to the main group of students that were still on the track.

A message came from dispatch asking for additional Troopers to either escort with patrol cars or ride on the busses that were taking students. Another Trooper that had responded to the track shortly before indicated we could respond and assist.

As there were various law enforcement officials on the track and the students were being taken away, my need to remain on the track was lessened. I accompanied the other Trooper across the field between the track and the main AHS campus, where both our vehicles were parked. I indicated to the Trooper I did not know if the tan building near the main campus building was cleared yet and wanted to take a look. He continued on.

As I approached the tan building and rounded to the front of it (where the windows and doors were located), I observed two separate but coordinated tactical teams, each with approximately 5-6 law enforcement officers, approach the two respective doors

of the tan building. As they were about to perform an entry, I stood back and awaited their findings.

They knocked loudly on the doors, announced they were police and requested entrance. Upon the respective doors being opened, the teams tactically entered and immediately demanded all hands be raised. One officer pulled the teacher aside, asking if anyone was hurt or if there was anyone inside that he was afraid of or threatened by. The teacher indicated nobody was hurt and no threat was in the room.

Students were removed, with the order to keep their hands up or on their heads. They were instructed to go to the field with the remaining students. One member of the team indicated they needed to be patted down first. I approached the group and patted down one male party. As there were several officers conducting the very quick pat downs the group of ready students was growing. I indicated I would escort those ready students to the field. I started down the same path and field I had taken to get to the tan building with a group of approximately 15-20 students with me. I continually watched the students and surroundings.

I attempted to inform the students, many of whom were crying and/or visibly upset, that they were okay, they were safe, nothing would happen to them, and they were survivors. We approached the track and were stopped by officers on the field indicating the students needed to be patted down and have a quick question/answer session (IE, were they witnesses, hurt, etc). I kept the respective group with me while other officers conducted the pat downs/question.

Two other groups followed my first group within minutes. I met them partway and had them stand by for the first group to be completed. I asked if anyone was hurt or a witness to anything; they all responded in the negative. The groups were passed on to the officers on the field.

I observed the gentleman that initially contacted me about his daughter being in the tan building as the lone person still standing by the fence. I made my way across the field, and he approached me. I indicated his daughter was out, she was safe, and she would be transported to a location he could get her at soon. He thanked me, and we parted.

I returned to the ICC to find another assignment. I met with Chief Scott Hernandez, CSP, who was standing near and in a circle with CDPS Executive Director Jim Davis and Colorado Governor John Hickenlooper. Gov. Hickenlooper shook our hands and was taken to the ICC area for more information. While the other individuals were discussing matters, I requested an employee of Burger King (which was in the roped off area and not accessible to the public) to step back inside the building; she did without issue.

I met Major Mark Savage, CSP, and Major Packard. Lt. Col. Brenda Leffler, CSP, came out of the ICC, and I informed her I was available for either PIO duties or

anything else that was needed. She asked how I was doing, twice, and we went to a small group of CSP members to await further instruction.

Assignments were given, and I was told to attend the press conference on the street in case I was needed as a PIO. While I observed the conference, a bus driver asked me where he needed to go as he was requested from another district to assist. I escorted him to the ICC to find out where he was needed.

I was asked by Major Savage to get my coat and put it on (as the temperature was dropping, and I had been outside for several hours in short sleeves). Upon his request I walked with the Executive Director and the Governor's Chief of Staff (who also made a comment about me needing a coat) past the area of the (now concluded) press conference and to my vehicle. I put my CSP-issued coat on and returned to the ICC area to await further instructions or assignments.

Eventually more CSP members arrived to the area. We were given food and informed we would be debriefed shortly, and most likely dismissed. While waiting, I contacted Sergeant Baker and informed him we were waiting to possibly be dismissed and I would resume taking call. He indicated he had not received any calls but that was fine, asking if everything was okay. I informed him it was and things were slowing down.

Lt Col. Leffler called all CSP members around to inform us that we would be dismissed shortly. Most of us had a sandwich and/or chips while waiting. Major Savage called us around shortly thereafter, indicating we would need to fill out supplemental reports and have those sent to him and/or Gina Jeffries within a day. We were all thanked for our respective roles and told to give him a "thumbs up" before leaving.

I asked Major Packard if there was any public information I should be made aware of in case media called. He indicated (and I agreed) to have media requests transferred to the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office, but CSP involvement was assisting ACSO as requested. I attempted to find the PIO for ACSO, but nobody in the area had seen him for several hours.

I gave a "thumbs up" to Major Savage and cleared from the scene. I transferred call back to my phone (alerting Sergeant Baker I was clear and had call as well). I drove home and went off duty. No media calls were received about the incident (I went off call 0800 Saturday morning).

The vehicle I was driving was CSP 123, an unmarked Ford Crown Victoria equipped with flashing red and blue lights.

SUMMARY:

On 13 December 2013 at approximately 12:40 CSP Denver Comm Center was advised of an active school shooter at 2201 E Dry Creek Rd, Centennial, CO 80122. At approximately 12:53 hours, I, Sergeant L.R. Smith S60, overheard the radio, about the school shooting incident. I was approximately 6 miles away and began responding emergent to the scene.

I arrived on scene at approximately 13:00 hours. I was dressed in plain clothing. I put on a tactical ballistic vest with large labels identifying me as a "Trooper". I armed myself with my tactical rifle and EMT trauma kit. I staged on the south side of the high school near the main entrance area. At this point I did not know how many shooters were involved, the description of the shooter or the last known location of the shooter. Another CSP Sergeant (S36) met up with me at this location.

Shortly after, a large group of students began to evacuate the high school on foot. The exited from the main entrance and moved south across Dry Creek Road to a strip mall. S36 and I provided tactical security for the evacuating students. We did not know if a shooter would be in the group. Approximately 1,000 students moved through our zone past us and into an alley behind the strip mall. At the conclusion of the evacuation I was directed to report to the command post behind Burger King at Dry Creek and S. University Blvd.

Major Packard directed me to move to the north side of the high school and to gather three troopers to set up a bus evacuation for students. I met up with 1C23 (Sanchez). We moved our patrol cars to the NE corner of the campus. The NE corner of the high school parking lot was filled with civilian cars, and the drive way was partially blocked by emergency vehicles. At approximately 13:53 we moved through the parking lots at the north end of the school and observed a large group of approximately 1,000 students standing in an athletic field near the NE corner of the campus. Additional officers were guarding various entrances to the school and maintaining a security perimeter along the parking lot north of the High School building. One uniformed officer directed us to pursue two adults moving in a SE direction from the athletic field toward the campus. We ran a short distance and determined the two adults were a uniformed officer escorting a student with medical needs.

Later we moved to the center west edge of the campus along the 7400 block of S. Franklin St. An ACSO and a School Bus supervisor were waiting in the driveway. Empty school busses began to arrive and kids were released from the athletic field in groups of approximately 100. Uniformed officers provided security as they walked south to our position. I was advised to request one police officer per bus for security and a police escort vehicle to take the bus from the school evacuation zone to Shepherd of the Hills Church. I requested

additional officers on the radio. I assigned one officer per bus with a lead and tail car for the first group of three buses.

Just after the first convoy of three buses left. I was advised to begin screening the evacuating students to segregate witnesses in one bus and all other students in other buses. I asked the school bus employee to radio the drivers who had already left to ask for witnesses.

Later a uniformed CO Parks officer and a plain clothes Parole officer arrived. I asked them to ride on buses for security. Very soon we ran out of officers for security and could only find one CSP vehicle to escort each successive convoy of buses. We requested additional officers through dispatch. The CSP escort vehicles brought the officers back to the evacuation zone as they completed each convoy. We used the same officers repeatedly for security escorts on the buses, as quickly as they could return. If no officers were available we had to send the bus empty to keep the evacuation running smoothly.

A Department of Corrections uniformed officer advised me of a group of student witnesses that he was sequestering at a road block on S. Franklin Ave north of the evacuation zone. A separate bus was sent to his location to pick up the student witnesses and transport them to Euclid. We had identified two witnesses (one WF student and one WF teacher) in our evacuation zone. The two witnesses were placed in the patrol car being driven by Captain Aldridge, who later transported them to Euclid.

A uniformed ACSO Deputy brought a group of approximately 10 student witnesses that had completed field interviews. These student witnesses were placed on a separate bus (#777). I originally directed that bus to go to the alternate drop off location at Euclid School. Later, at approximately 15:29 hours, Dispatch advised me that Bus 777 could go to the Shepherd of the Hills Church. I alerted the bus supervisor who radioed the new instructions to the driver.

At Approximately 15:40 hours we had evacuated approximately 1,000 students from this location. We ended up with 10 empty buses. One bus was parked in the evac zone in case it was needed and the other 9 buses were sent to stage up at a nearby LDS church and await further instructions. The bus evacuation had been completed.

R45 Corporal Limburg gave me a ride back to the east side of the campus where I could pick up my patrol car. I drove the patrol car back to the west side of the campus to find my cell phone which had been previously lost. Upon quickly finding the phone I returned to the Command Post to await my next assignment.

On 12-13-13, at approximately 1240 hours, I heard CSP Dispatch air a possible active shooter at Arapahoe High School. This location is in Arapahoe County, Colorado. I arrived on scene at approximately 1257 hours. I entered the school on the south side of the school and into the cafeteria. I joined with a group of deputies and officers and began to clear the northwest hallway of the school. We entered a classroom and found two girls in the corner. We had the girls stand up and exit the classroom. The students were being evacuated out of the southwest door. We continued to clear the southwest hallway. Two more classrooms with students were cleared and the students were evacuated through the south main door.

I reentered the cafeteria and joined with Cpl. Salberg and an Englewood Officer named Joe. Cpl. Salberg, Joe, and I began to clear the east end of the high school. I went to the main office to get a set of keys to open the classroom doors. We (Cpl. Salberg, Joe, and I) entered the arts department of the high school. We entered a classroom and located approximately 27 students and one teacher. We evacuated the students in this classroom. We continued through the auditorium from the stage. No one was located in the auditorium. We continued to the northeast hallway. Joe and I entered two classrooms while Cpl. Salberg secured the hallway. No one was located in these rooms. We entered a classroom on the other side of the hallway and located approximately 61 students and two teachers. Cpl. Salberg and I patted down the students and teachers. The students and teachers were left in that room. We continued west and came to another classroom. We entered the classroom and located approximately 31 students and two teachers. Cpl. Salberg and I patted down the students and teachers in this room. Two students were located in the dark room across hall from this classroom. The students were moved to classroom E7. We went to the classroom south to the south and located approximately 27 students and a teacher. Cpl. Salberg and I patted down the students and teacher. We moved the students to classroom E7. Cpl. Salberg saw someone in a classroom south of our location. We moved to the classroom and located approximately 30 students and a teacher. Cpl. Salberg and I patted down the students and teacher and moved them to classroom E7. We continued to clear the east part of the school. After we cleared the east part of the school, we covered the east main entrance. At approximately 1700 hours, we were relieved from our post. Cpl. Salberg and I reported to the command area. After reporting in, we were released from the incident.

NARRATIVE:

On December 13th, 2013 at approximately 1243 hours I was informed by dispatch of an active shooter incident at Arapahoe High School. I arrived on scene at approximately 1306 hours. Upon my arrival I met with Lieutenant Cataffo of the Douglas County Sheriff's Office. Lieutenant Cataffo asked that I assisted with the evacuation of the students and help secure the area where they were gathering. Myself and Trooper Milner secured the perimeter and started to secure the students in the King Soopers grocery store located on the southwest corner of Dry Creek and University, across the street from the high school. Shortly afterward myself and Trooper Milner were informed that we need to gather the students at the Shepherd of the Hills Church located directly behind the King Soopers so the school can account for all the students.

After a short while Major Packard had asked for a supervisor to respond to the Burger King located on the northeast corner of Dry Creek and University too assist with security. While there Captain Shelton asked me to help escort school buses. I responded to the west side of the high school and met with Sergeant Smith of the Colorado State Patrol. Sergeant Smith stated that the school buses were going to transport the students that were evacuated on the track to Euclid Elementary School and that he needed a Trooper to ride on the bus. At this time I rode on a school bus from the high school to the elementary school and assisted the students off the bus. After returning to the high school I responded to the incident command center and was debriefed by Major Savage, Major Packard and Captain Shelton. I cleared a short time afterward without any further involvement.



After the incident command meeting I was asked to scribe for the Incident Tactical Commander. I scribed for the Tactical Commander inside the command center until I was relieved by an Arapahoe County Deputy.

I then met with Major Mark Savage and Captain Doug Shelton of the Colorado State Patrol. I assisted Major Savage with tracking State of Colorado personnel. I provided the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office with a list of Colorado State Patrol, Colorado Parks and Wildlife and Colorado Corrections personnel who responded to the incident.

At approximately 1719 hours I was relieved by Trooper Ashley Meyers and I cleared the incident with no further involvement.

SUMMARY:

On 12-13-13 at 12:46 hours Trooper Dinkel and myself were informed of an active shooter situation at the Arapahoe High School at the intersection of University and Dry Creek. I arrived at Arapahoe High School at 12:57 and contacted Major Packard and Captain Aldridge. I was advised by Captain Aldridge that we were going to meet up with a couple of different officers from different agencies and form a team and go into the school. We entered on the south side of the building and began room searches. We searched an office area and found 9 teachers and administrators and one student. The student was a special needs child and Captain Aldridge escorted the child and the adults outside to safety. I continued to search the area with the remaining members of the team that consisted of all Arapahoe County Deputies. I was requested to assist with searches on the other side of the building. I met up with Trooper Cochran and an investigator from the Englewood Police Department. We were informed that the east side of the school had not been searched or secured.

We began our search of the east side and this included the auditorium and other classrooms. We searched the auditorium and the rooms that were adjacent or attached to it and we did not locate any people in those areas. We moved as a three man team to the east wing of the school. After searching the first two rooms we had not located anybody. The third room we found 61 students and two teachers. We made sure there were no injuries to any of the students or teachers. All of the people in the room were patted down for safety and we secured the room and informed all of the people that we would be back to get them to safety. The room was secured and we moved on to the next room. We moved down the hall and when we entered the next room and located an additional 35 students and a teacher. After checking on the safety and patting down all the students and the teacher they were moved to the room that we found the first students in. The following room we located and additional 35 to 40 students and teachers. We followed the same procedure as we did on the previous rooms and moved all the parties to the same room so everybody was accounted for and ready to move to safety when we were allowed to.

We were advised by the incident command that there were going to be buses for the students and we had to take them to safety. Captain Aldridge made contact with incident command and we were told to have the students exit the room. I opened the door that was in the room where all the students and teachers were located and had Trooper Sanchez take the lead and escort the students and teachers by class to safety. Once all the people were safe and out of the room we secured and we moved to the main entrance on the east side of the building. I secured the east entrance of the school as requested by the incident command until I was relieved by an Arapahoe County Swat team member. After I was relieved I reported to the incident command and as

SUMMARY:

On December 13, 2013 at about 1249 hours I was dispatched to Arapahoe High School for a possible active shooter. At about 1253 hours I arrived on scene. I contacted a Douglas County Deputy to see where I needed to go. The Deputy directed my to the Incident Command Center located on the northeast corner of Dry Creek and University.

At about 1300 I was directed to shut down northbound traffic on University at Dry Creek. Corporal Limburg and Trooper Roe arrived on scene to assist with traffic direction. I parked my unmarked patrol car blocking northbound University.

At 1308 hours Major Packard requested two troopers meet him at the Chipotle just south of the high school. Corporal Limburg and I were directed to assist with managing the students that were being evacuated. Douglas County Lieutenant Kataffo instructed me to have students move into King Soopers and make sure the kids did not leave with parents until they were accounted for. It was decided to move all students to the Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church, I assisted with the movement.

At about 1402 hours I assisted with the release of students to their parents from Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church.

At about 1519 hours I was told by an Arapahoe County Deputy that there was a group of kids in the King Soopers and the store manager was not letting them come to the church. I responded to King Soopers and met with another Arapahoe County Deputy and Douglas County Deputy. I confirmed with Incident Command that they wanted all students to move to the church. At this time I was informed there were about five witnesses being kept separated in an office in the King Soopers. A Parker Police Officer identified a sixth witness. I escorted the witness to a secured room in Shepherd of the Hills Church. I informed an Arapahoe County Deputy of the witnesses and requested he contact a Detective to start interviews. I was told there was a second group of witnesses in the church. The Detective requested I bring all witnesses to the same location. I located the group of five witnesses and escorted them to secured room.

I started to escort witnesses to their parents after they had been interviewed. I was relieved by Trooper Gurule.

INVOLVEMENTS:

NARRATIVE:

On 12-13-2013 at approximately 1250 hours, I was leaving the Castle Rock office to head to Denver for some on site VIN inspections. I overheard dispatch ask 1C13 to respond to Arapahoe High School. 1C13 asked dispatch what was going on, and dispatch stated that there was a possible shooting. I proceeded to Arapahoe High School, which is located at the corner of University Blvd. and Dry Creek Rd.

There were several troopers on scene already and were asking for help at the southwest corner of the school. I arrived at the intersection of Dry Creek Rd. and Franklin St., where I met a deputy from Douglas County Sheriff's office. I was asked if I could help with a roadblock at that intersection. The time was approximately 1310 hours. I stayed at the road block for about an hour and a half.

At this time, school buses were arriving on the west side of the school on Franklin St. to pick up students that were outside of the school. I was asked to escort one of the buses, full of students, to the Shepherd of the Hills Church. I escorted the bus to the church and returned to the west side of the school on Franklin St. I was then asked to get on a bus full of students that was heading to Euclid Middle School. I stayed on the bus until it arrived at the Middle school and watched the students exit the bus and walk into the school. I then received a ride from Trooper Roe back to my patrol car.

I stayed at my patrol vehicle on Franklin St. on the west side of the school for about another 15 minutes. I was then told to respond at the Command Post at the corner of Dry Creek Rd. and University. While there, we were debriefed and told we could leave the scene and head home. I left the scene at approximately 1620, and went off duty at 1630 hours.

SUMMARY:

On 12/13/13 at approximately 1259 I had just come on duty at my residence in Highlands Ranch, CO. At that time CSP dispatch notified me there was an "Active Shooter" incident in progress at Arapahoe High School. I immediately responded to the school running with lights and siren on. While en route I heard numerous CSP units calling out at the school. I heard Major Packard state that responders were staging on the west side of the Chipotle across from the school. I arrived at the Chipotle at 1307 and reported to Major Packard.

Major Packard asked me to remain there while he went to the command post which was being set up at the Burger King to the northeast of our location. I, CSP Sgt. Smith, and "Parole 417" remained outside the south side of the school, primarily to keep anyone from attempting to reenter the building. In time, Major Packard asked for some extra assistance so Sgt. Smith responded to the command post.

At about 1415, there was a request for officers to ride the evacuation buses being used to shuttle students to Euclid Middle School and Shepherd of the Hills Church. By this point numerous swat units were positioned along the south side of the school so the parole officer and I moved over to the west side of the school. I rode one evacuation bus to Euclid Middle School and one to Shepherd of the Hills. By that point the evacuation from the high school was complete so I responded to the command post for further assignment.

While at the command post I was advised there were traffic control problems at Shepherd of the Hills, so I went back to the church. At the church I assisted Sergeant Sanderlin and Troopers Walters and Meyers with traffic control at the main entrance. There were numerous cars and distraught students and parents all in close proximity and the situation could have been very dangerous for the pedestrians. At one point a man carrying a large cross along the sidewalk was confronted by a person who thought it out of place, considering the situation. Luckily, after a short verbal confrontation the cross bearer agreed to move on. We continued to direct traffic until all of the students had been picked up. Once traffic into the church had virtually come to a stop we cleared a numbers of vehicles off of University into the parking lot and cleared the scene. That concluded my participation in the event.

SUMMARY:

On 12/13/2013 at approximately 1300 hours, I, Trooper David Gurule with the Colorado State Patrol, was just coming on duty from my residence when I overheard radio traffic that appeared to be a high risk situation. I heard other troopers staging at Arapahoe High School and CSP Dispatch spoke of a possible shooter. I attempted to call CSP Dispatch to go on duty as I assumed we were on 10-33 traffic. CSP Dispatch hung up on me as I was on the phone, so I attempted to log on to cad with no connectivity. I then contacted CSP Dispatch on the radio and gave them my login information and stated that I was already en route to the high school to assist with the incident.

At approximately 1330 hours, I arrived at the command center at the Burger King on the northeast corner of South University Blvd and East Dry Creek Road. I spoke with Major Packard who stated to look for Trooper Lewis who just left the command center. I attempted to call Trooper Lewis on his cell phone but was unable to contact him as the cell service was not available. I attempted him on the car radio with no response. Major Packard then requested that I stay with the Arapahoe School District Security Member and act as liaison, to relay information. I sat with the security member for approximately 20 minutes when he and his other staff stated their cell phones were about to run out of battery. I left to get my patrol car to plug in everyone's cell phones, when I was intercepted by Captain Douglas Shelton who stated they needed Troopers over to the west side of the high school to escort the school buses with students to the Euclid Middle School. I responded to the west side of the school and escorted students on several buses. I then escorted a bus in my patrol vehicle to a new location, Sheppard of the Hills Church. I then went back to the school and got on one of the buses and accompanied the students to the Sheppard of the Hills Church.

After completing the escort I responded to the command center and waited for a new assignment. Shortly thereafter we were relieved from the incident. Approximately 30 minutes later I was called back to the intersection of South University Boulevard and East Dry Creek Road to maintain a roadblock for northbound traffic. I maintained the roadblock for approximately one and a half hours before Arapahoe County Deputies relieved me and I cleared from the incident with no further involvement.

On Friday December 13, 2013, at approximately 1500 hours, Sgt. Beaudin advised me to respond to Euclid Middle School to assist with the Arapahoe High School shooting investigation.

Once I arrived at Euclid Middle School I was instructed to assist with interviews of witnesses of the event.

My first interview was with [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]). [REDACTED] stated the following during her interview:

- She was in Spanish class room C21, so she did not see anything just heard things.
- She heard what she thought was a locker slam or trash can bang. She then heard another quick follow up "bang".
- She then heard what she thought may have been three more shots for a total of five shots.
- At this time her Spanish teacher got up locked the door and turned the lights off.
- She then heard lots of yelling, but was unsure exactly what was being said.
- She thought she heard "shooter" but was unsure.
- It sounded like "people of authority" arrived quickly.
- The fire alarm then started going off but they were instructed to stay in the classroom over the intercom.

I then asked [REDACTED] if she had heard any rumors of anyone being upset or planning to do something like this. [REDACTED] stated that she heard on Wednesday a kid banged on a class room door and demanded to be let in. Once the kid entered the classroom the kid yelled at the teacher. [REDACTED] stated she did not know which kid or class room was involved in this incident.

My second interview was with [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]). [REDACTED] stated the following during her interview:

- She was in Mr. Lutz science class at the time. She was unsure what room number it was.
- She also did not see anything just heard stuff.

Narrative:

On December 13th, 2013 at approximately 1306 hours, while on duty as a uniformed Trooper for the Colorado State Patrol in Arapahoe County, Colorado, I was dispatched to assist at the Arapahoe High School, as a shooting in the school had recently occurred. I arrived in the area of the school at approximately 1336 hours. Upon my arrival I heard a woman near the southwest corner of the intersection of University Boulevard and Dry Creek Road, trying to get my attention. I contacted the woman and she told me that she just received a text message from her daughter, which stated her daughter was still inside the school with ten other people. The woman also stated that there was one school teacher among the ten, that they were inside [REDACTED], the room was on the first floor, and that it was silent in there. The woman stated her daughter's name was [REDACTED]

Upon receiving the information, I passed it along to a Lieutenant from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office, and then gave it to Major Packard of the Colorado State Patrol from there. After I gave the info to Major Packard, Sergeant Lloyd Smith of the Colorado State Patrol asked me to go with him to the north side of the school for security and to possibly assist with helping the kids out of the school. At approximately 1424 hours, I was dispatched to the east foyer of the school to escort the kids out of the school. Corporal Salberg and Captain Aldridge of the Colorado State Patrol had me escort them to the front of the school, along with some TAC officers.

From there I was dispatched to assist with escorting some kids from the Arapahoe High School to the Shepherd of the Hills Church. I assisted by riding inside of a school bus with several dozen kids inside. We arrived at the church at approximately 1457 hours. I stood outside the bus and watched as the kids exited the bus and entered the church. Shortly after the last kid entered the church, I rode with Colorado State Trooper David Gurule back to the west side of the Arapahoe High School to assist with another escort.

For the next escort I rode inside another bus with several dozen kids on board. I remained inside the bus from the Arapahoe High School to the Euclid Middle school, arriving at approximately 1522 hours. After the last kid made it inside the school safely, I rode with Colorado State Trooper Heath Roe back to the incident command post for a debriefing. I cleared the scene at approximately 1624 hours, after the debriefing. Nothing else follows.

Narrative:

On 12/13/13 at 13:24 hours, I overheard CSP dispatch talking about the command Center being set up so I contacted dispatch via cell phone to inquire what was happening. The dispatcher told me that there had been a shooting incident at Arapahoe High School, which is in Arapahoe County, Colorado. I told her that I would be en route for assistance.

While en route I heard that the command center was being set up at the Burger King on the northeast corner of Dry Creek Road and University Blvd. I arrived at 1345 hours. Upon arrival, I observed a large amount of different emergency services agencies parked all over the intersection of Dry Creek Road and University Blvd. I parked in the parking lot and reported to Major Matt Packard. A few minutes later, one of the SWAT members from Arapahoe County stated he needed someone to help with keeping the students that were at the Burger King in one area until they had been interviewed. I walked back and forth around the police tape line as parents began arriving looking for their children. I made sure that the parents that I spoke to were able to find their children and speak to them briefly so that they knew they were safe and then I had them separate, so that they could be accounted for and interviewed as to what they may have seen in the school. Approximately 1 hour later a bus arrived to transport the children that did not have parents on scene over to the Sheperd of the Hills Lutheran church just south of the intersection. I remained at the Burger King until all the children left had been interviewed and released to their parents or relatives.

At approximately 1515 hours, Major Savage sent me to the west side of the high school to help escort buses of students to the church. I escorted 2 buses to the church and then remained at the church as traffic direction was needed as other buses were brought over. I remained at that post with a couple other troopers until I just released from the incident at 1700 hours. I then reported to Major Savage at the command post to check out. After a quick debrief, we were signed out and I cleared the incident. I went 10-42 at 1905 hours.

Narrative:

On December 13th, 2013 at approximately 1330 hours, while at the Colorado State Patrol office in Castle Rock, I became aware of a shooting that had occurred at Arapahoe High School. I left the office a few minutes later and proceeded to the area of Arapahoe High School. While I was in route I heard over the patrol radio that the command post for the incident was located in the Burger King parking lot area at Dry Creek and University adjacent to Arapahoe High School. Upon my arrival, at approximately 1353 hours, I proceeded to locate Major Matt Packard who had been on scene prior to my arrival. There was no immediate need for my assistance so I proceeded to an area around the Burger King restaurant that was cordoned off with police line. Inside this area were numerous students and teachers that had been evacuated from the High School. I advised Major Packard I would be in this area helping to provide security until I received further instruction from him.

Major Mark Savage arrived shortly after that and he and I were tasked to find Troopers to assist in providing security and escorts for the buses that were transporting the evacuated students and teachers from the areas around the school. I remained in this role until all of the students and teachers had been transported away from the school.

Once the school had been secured, and all of the occupants of the school were transported from the area around the school, all of the Troopers were released from their responsibilities at the school. Sergeant Senecal and three other Troopers remained assisting in reuniting students with their parents at the Sheppard of the Hills Church. Having no further need for the other Troopers and myself, Major Savage gathered us together and did a short debriefing. I left the area at approximately 1630 hours and took no further action related to this incident.
