Craig Place, date of birth June 16, 1947, 8451 South Upham Way, Littleton, Colorado 80120, telephone number (303) 979-2893, was interviewed at his residence. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Place furnished the following information:

Place is a Physical Education Instructor at Columbine High School. Place has a weight-lifting class that he instructs during second period. During third and fourth period he teaches a Team Sports class in the gymnasium. At 11:10 a.m. he is scheduled for "A" lunch. On Mondays he has hall duty in the cafeteria during first period, which runs from 7:30 a.m. to 8:15 a.m.

On April 20, 1999, Place went to his car in the teacher's lot to get a bagel at approximately 11:15 a.m. He then was going to walk outside of the building all the way around to the cafeteria. He normally never goes to the cafeteria but had to go pay his social fees in the faculty lounge. As he was walking from his car toward the cafeteria, he heard what he first thought were the sounds of firecrackers. This was at approximately 11:20 to 11:25 a.m. and he was walking just outside of the gymnasium. As he continued to walk in the direction of the sounds he began to realize that the sounds were gunshots. He stopped and waited by the custodial entrance to the school. He continued to hear gunshots and moved back toward the entrance slightly. From his vantage point he was unable to see any gunmen. He could hear a student crying near the entryway to the west entrance of the school and the back exit of the library. He later found out the student was Mark Taylor.

Within a couple of minutes maximum, a police car arrived and parked on the side of the hill. Approximately ten minutes later students came out and ran behind the police car. Place believes these students came out the back door exit of the library. Place wanted to try to help the students and must have made some type of movement or gesture towards them. A police officer told them to "Get the fuck out of here." With him at that time at the custodial entrance door was Joe Marshall and Katherine Baumgardner.

## OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 5, 1999 I interviewed William (Billy) Arapkiles. Billy is a student at Columbine High School and was in the vicinity of the cafeteria at the time of the shootings. I learned about Billy while speaking to his mother about an interview with Billy's sister Amanda Arapkiles.

Billy reported that he was actually on the soccer field located to the south-west of the cafeteria during the shootings. Billy stated that he had been in the cafeteria between 11:00 and 11:10AM to see if his other sister, Amy, was going out to lunch. When he found out she had already left for lunch. He then went looking for a soccer ball to play soccer with. When he located the ball he went to the field where he played with some other students. Billy related that about five (5) minutes after he began playing soccer he heard what sounded like fire works going off in the area of the cafeteria. Billy said he and the others on the field began to cheer and shout thinking it was a prank. He said that he looked toward the school and observed three people near the west entrance to the north main hall. Billy stated that two the subjects were wearing trench coats, and the third was wearing a white shirt. According to Billy the two subjects wearing the trench coats had guns. He did not see the subject with the white shirt with a fire arm. Billy related that the subject wearing the white shirt was pacing back and forth and was about five feet away from the two in trench coats. Billy did not think the subject wearing the white shirt was a victim but was with the other two. Billy reported that he was too far away to recognize the subjects.

Billy continued to say that while he was watching the subjects the

were shooting at the ground and into the air. He continued to say that he observed the subjects in the trench coats shoot one person near the top of the outside stairs leading from the cafeteria area to the west entrance to the north hall. He saw them shoot a second person at the bottom of the hill near the cafeteria, and a third as the victim was trying to run away across the student parking lot. At about this time the shooters noticed the people on the soccer field and began firing at them. Billy reported that during the shooting he believes that a long gun one of the shooters had jammed as there was a pause in the firing, and he observed the shooter making a rear ward pulling action at the gun, like he was "cocking a cross bow".

Billy reported that he got down on his hands and knees and crawled across the soccer field to the fence on the west edge of the field, and jumped the fence into the back yard of a house. Billy reported that he and several students took shelter in the residence at 6337 South Teller Court. Billy reported that from this residence the dialed 911 and reported the shootings.

Billy said that while he was in the cafeteria he did not see anything like a duffel bag on the floor and no one carried such a bag into the cafeteria while he was there. Billy further advised that none of the subjects he saw doing the shooting were carrying a duffel bag.

Billy reported that he is a freshman. He had no additional information and the interview concluded at 0900.

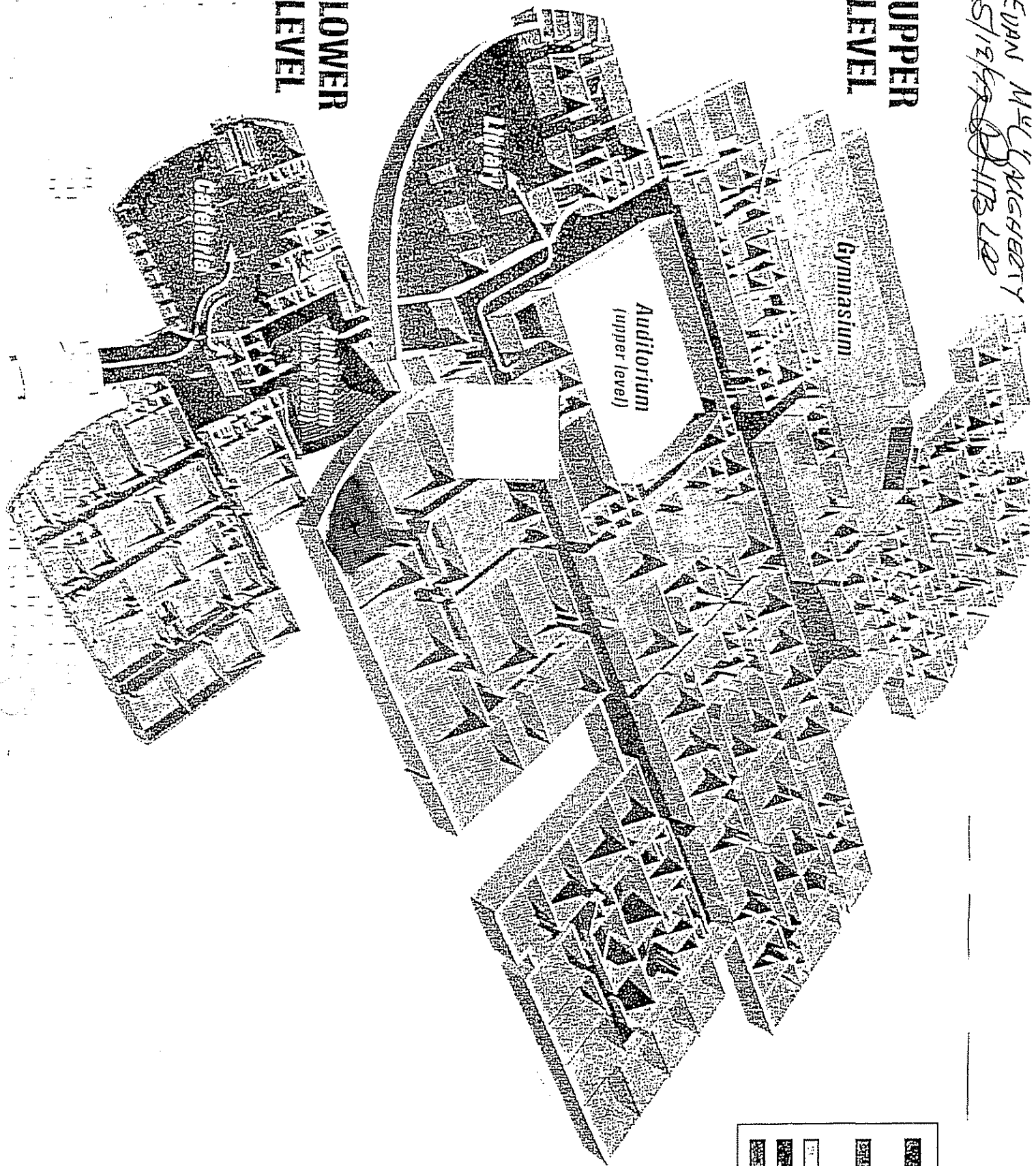

Ashley McKenna, date of birth May 28, 1983, 7767 South Depew Street, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)904-2755, was interviewed at her residence in the presence of her mother Lisa McKenna. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview, McKenna furnished the following information:

McKenna is a Sophomore at Columbine High School. McKenna's first class of the day is History with Mr. Digiosio during first period. First period runs from 7:30 a.m. to 8:25 a.m. During second period, McKenna has Photography with Mrs. Hirokuro. This period runs from 8:25 a.m. to 9:20 a.m.. Second period is five minutes longer than the other class periods for school announcements. The Rebel News Network is broadcasted throughout the school on televisions. McKenna did not pay attention to the announcements on April 20, 1999. She could not recall hearing anything unusual about that day's announcements. Third period starts at 9:25 a.m. and McKenna has Literature with Mr. Friesen. This period ends at 10:15 a.m.. McKenna has Math with Mr. Bundy during fourth period, which runs from 10:20 a.m. to 11:10 a.m.. McKenna's fifth period class is Biology with Ms. Williams in Science Room 11. This class begins at 11:15 a.m. and ends at 12:05 a.m..

On April 20, 1999, McKenna was in her fifth period Biology class waiting for her science partner. The bell to start class rang. Student Dorian Salazar and his brother were doing a "break dance" demonstration on the floor. The students had pulled two tables apart to make room for the demonstration. When the demonstration was done, the class began to review their homework for a quiz on the digestive system. Ms. Williams was reviewing the homework with the class using the overhead projector. The lights in the class were turned off and the door from the classroom to the hallway was open.

Within a few minutes, McKenna could hear people running outside the classroom in the main hallway. It sounded like a "stampede" of people. McKenna could see a white male teacher in the hallway. The teacher was yelling at the students to slow down and questioning what they were doing. McKenna did not know

-CHS student, in cafeteria at table XX when shooting began, was initially at table with several who went outside just prior to the shooting; Lance Kirklin (wounded), Sean Graves (wounded), Dan Rohrbough (fatally wounded), Nick Buhrer, and James Medaugh, has no suspect or duffle bag info

INVESTIGATION:

On May 4, 1999 at 0930 hours I contacted Anthony Caruso at his home for an interview. His father was present. Also in the home was his twin brother, Patrick, who I interviewed after Anthony. Anthony then told me the following:

\* He is a freshman at Columbine High.

\* When asked, he said he does not know, nor has ever seen Eric Harris before. He does not know him by face or name. He said the same went for Dylan Klebold.



\* He has never heard of Robert Perry, Joe Stair, or Chris Morris. (After I interviewed his brother, they described a "Chris" who was dating a friend's sister named Nicole Markham. Anthony said that "Chris" was a trench coat wearer and always had on a beret. He said that "Chris" also wore sunglasses and a black jacket with an "anarchy" patch on it. See supplement report with brother Pat for further.)

\* When asked, he did not know any other trench coat student. He said he has seen one or two of those students in the school from time to time but had no further information about them. He has heard of the name, "Trench Coat Mafia."

\* He did not see any trench coat student or associate in the school the day of the shooting. He saw no objects that looked out of place that day at school. When asked specifically, he said he did not see any duffle bags.

\* His 4th hour class was wood shop which is located in the northeast part of the school. The class gets out at 11:10 a.m. but his teacher let the class out a few minutes early as it is so far away from the cafeteria. When he got out of class, he went directly to the cafeteria and to the lunch line on the far west end of the kitchen.

\* After getting lunch, he went to a table by the west exit door for the cafeteria. Upon looking at the cafeteria diagram, he selected table XX as the one he was at. He thought he was at the table next to his brother Pat.

\* He sat at the table with Lance Kirklin, Sean Graves, Nick Buhner, James Medaugh, Tony Somaro, and Dan Rohrbough. After they finish eating, Lance went outside for a cigarette as he usually does. He said that Lance went outside the west cafeteria door with Nick, Sean, James and Dan, who went along for the walk. He stayed at the table with Tony.

\* As he was looking out the west window, he saw Sean fall just outside the cafeteria door. When he got up from the table to see what was going on, he heard several "pops." He said that Mr. Sanders then came running in the cafeteria from the west door area telling everyone to get down. He said a janitor was with Mr. Sanders.

\* At this time, James Medaugh came back in and told him that Sean just got shot. He was under the table at that time. (He learned later that Lance Kirklin was also wounded and that Dan Rohrbough was fatally wounded outside.)

\* He and James then took off down the foreign language hall and then out of the school via the south door in that area. They ran to a house on the street south of the school (Polk).


\* He said that he heard several pops and a big explosion from somewhere by the cafeteria as he was getting out. He also saw smoke out in the west parking lot. He thought Sean was shot and then he saw the smoke in the parking lot.


\* He never heard of any threats against the school or about any students making bombs.

\* On the day of the shooting he was wearing a dark red polo shirt with khaki pants and black shoes.

\* He never saw any suspect.

This concluded my interview with Anthony Caruso.

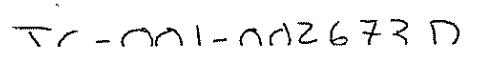

## OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 3, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Erica McClaugherty. Erica McClaugherty was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shootings. I contacted Renee McClaugherty, Erica's mother, and made an appointment for an interview for May 10th at 10:00AM.

On May 10th at 0950 I arrived at 7224 West Portland Avenue, and contacted Erica McClaugherty.

Erica confirmed that she is a student at Columbine High School, in the 9th grade, and that she was in the cafeteria at the time of the shootings. Erica related that she arrived in the cafeteria at about 11:00AM, and was sitting at the table identified as "KK". She said that she was sitting with:

Nick Antonio

Candice Cushman  
Lindsey Doweling  
Julie McGinley

Erica advised that she was one of the first people in the cafeteria, and when she got there she did not see anything like a large duffel type bag on the floor. She continued to say that while she was in the cafeteria she did not see anyone carry such a bag into the cafeteria.

Erica continued to say that her first indication that there was trouble was when Mr. Sanders came running by telling everyone to get under the table, and the people along the windows began to dive under the tables. Erica said that she got under the table and stayed there until the

people near the windows got up and began running up the stairs. She said that at this time she got up and ran into the choir room. She advised that she went through the upper level of the auditorium and into the north main level hall. From there she went through a hall along the east side of the gym and exited the school building on the north side. She continued to say she ran across the open area on the north side of the school to the tennis courts where she and other students put tables against the fence and climbed over. From there she ran to South Pierce Street and Bowels Avenue, and from there she went to Candice Cushman's house.

Erica reported that while she was in the north hall she heard shots coming from behind her (west). Erica advised that she did not see who was shooting. She further advised that she did not see anyone with guns while she was leaving the school or before the shooting started. Erica advised that she noticed while she was in the north hall way that the glass in the windows in the office area was broken.

Erica reported that she does not personally know anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia, and she has had no dealings with any of its members. She continued to say that none of her friends are associated with the group. She advised that she does not know either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Erica advised that she did not know the names that Harris or Klebold were using on the internet.

Erica reported that she had heard nothing about shootings before they occurred.

Erica advised that she had left her back pack in the cafeteria, and described it as a Black "County Seat". She said the pack contained a camera and binders. Erica did not know the make of the camera.

Erica could provide no further information and the interview conclude at 1020.

## OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On May 10, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student Lauren Tocci who was possibly in the cafeteria during the shootings. I spoke to Lauren's mother, Barbara Tocci, and made an appointment for an interview on May 11th at noon.

At 1150 on May 11th I went to 7993 West Plymouth Place and contacted Lauren and Barbara Tocci. Lauren advised that she is a ninth grader at Columbine and that she was in the cafeteria when the shooting began.

Lauren related that she got to the cafeteria at about 11:10AM, and was sitting at the table identified as "H". She said that she was sitting with:

Jenny Ribble  
Chris Massias  
Mike Gagna  
Jessica Geurts  
Joceyln Provo

Lauren said that she had been seated at the table for about ten minutes when she heard what sounded like someone pounding on the windows. Then a janitor came through the cafeteria with a radio telling everyone to get under the tables, and then a pipe bomb exploded in the parking lot to the west of the cafeteria. She reported that she hid under the table for about ten seconds when a kid who had been shot outside came in the west door of the cafeteria. At this time a crowd of students started to run up the stairs to the south hall and Lauren followed them. She stated that as she was running up the stairs one or possibly two of the shooters were

coming in the west cafeteria doors. Lauren said that once at the top of the stairs the crowd headed down the south main level hall to the east and out of the doors near the math rooms. She advised that while they were running down the south hall the shooters were coming up the stairs from the cafeteria shooting. She reports she heard eight to ten shots from behind her. Lauren said that she did not see the shooters well enough to recognize them.

Lauren said that she was toward the front of the crowd so she could not see what was behind her. She also advised that she did not turn around to look. Once outside of the school, Lauren said that she ran down the hill to the east of the exit door and across S. Pierce Street into Leawood Park where she stayed for a while. According to Lauren after the crowd had been in the park for about three minutes there were more shots from the direction of the school and the teachers that were with the crowd told the students to back up some more. Lauren reported she was then directed to Leawood Elementary School where she contacted her parents.

Lauren said that she did not notice anything like a large duffel bag in the cafeteria when she arrived, but she said that she was one of the last students in the cafeteria as she had stopped at her locker before going to the cafeteria. Lauren further advised that she did not see anyone carry a duffel type bag into the cafeteria while she was there.

Lauren reported that she had been in science class prior to going to the cafeteria. The class room is located on the main level toward the south side of the school. Her locker is in the south main level hall near the math class rooms. Lauren advised that she did not see anyone with a gun while she was walking from her locker to the cafeteria.

Lauren advised that she had heard no rumors about something happening on April 20th before that day. She also said that she was not aware of any rumors about bomb building. Lauren said that she had heard that the school had received a bomb threat on Tuesday (4-20) morning but she could provide no further information on what had happened.

Lauren said that she was not acquainted with either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold and she has had no contact with either person. She advised that neither she nor any of her friends were associated or members of the Trench Coat Mafia. She did advise that a neighbor, Nate Dykeman, dressed all in black. She further advised that Nate had once asked her out but she turned him down. Lauren also advised that Nate had helped her get on America On Line so she could do research for a school paper and he knew a lot about computers. She advised that she was not familiar with any names that Harris, Klebold, or Dykeman had been using on the internet. She advised that she heard that Harris had his own web page but she had never checked it out.

Lauren said that Dykeman kept to himself and did not socialize much. She also stated that if Dykeman was playing kick ball with other neighborhood kids and he lost he would get mad and go inside his house. Barbara Tocci said that any contact she had with Dykeman, he was polite and courteous. Barbara said that she once asked Dykeman why he did not play basketball as he was very tall, and he said that the coach would not pick him. She also advised that he told her that he did not want to

complete his senior year at Columbine but wanted to finish school in Florida living with his father. Lauren reported that she had spoken to a friend, Gabe Montoya, and that Montoya had told her he was once in Dykeman's bedroom and noted that the walls were covered with devil posters. Lauren advised that Dykeman often hung out with a white male subject, possibly a senior, who always wore either a black beret or baseball hat turned backwards. This subject was tall and had blond hair. Lauren did not know if he wore glasses.

Lauren described the bag she left behind as a blue shoulder bag made by "Protocol". She advised that the bag contained two binders, her journal, calculator and note books.

Lauren could provide no additional information and the interview ended at 1230.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

AT 1630 HOURS ON APRIL 27, 1999 I WENT TO 5123 S. CODY CT. TO CONDUCT AN INTERVIEW WITH NATALIE BAKER WHO IS A STUDENT AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL, AND WAS IN THE CAFETERIA AT THE TIME OF THE SHOOTING ON APRIL 20TH. WHILE WE WERE INTERVIEWING NATALIE A SECOND TEENAGE FEMALE WAS PRESENT. TOWARD THE END OF THE INTERVIEW WITH NATALIE, NATALIE'S MOTHER DEBBIE BAKER, ASKED THE SECOND SUBJECT "ASHLEY YOU SAW THEM TWO". AT THIS TIME THE SECOND FEMALE SUBJECT IDENTIFIED HERSELF AS ASHLEY EGGLELAND, A NINTH GRADER AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL.

ASHLEY STATED THAT SHE WAS IN THE GYM WITH A GYM CLASS WHEN THEY HEARD SHOTS COMING FROM THE AREA OF THE LIBRARY. ASHLEY CONTINUED TO SAY THAT SHE WALKED INTO THE NORTH CORRIDOR FROM THE GYM CORRIDOR. AT THIS TIME SHE MET A GIRL SHE KNOWS ONLY AS "LACEY" WHO WAS RUNNING TOWARD HER (TO THE EAST). "LACEY" WAS SHOUTING THEY'VE GOT GUNS AND ARE SHOOTING PEOPLE. AT THIS TIME ASHLEY STATED THAT SHE OBSERVED TWO MALE SUBJECTS COMING AROUND THE CORNER OF THE LIBRARY HALL INTO THE NORTH HALL. ASHLEY ADVISED THAT BOTH SUBJECTS WERE ARMED. ACCORDING TO ASHLEY AS SOON AS BOTH SUBJECTS SAW HER AND "LACEY" THEY STARTED SHOOTING AT THEM. ASHLEY ADVISED THAT WHEN SHE FIRST ENCOUNTERED THE MALES SHE GOT THE IMPRESSION THAT THEY HAD JUST SHOOT ANOTHER GIRL BY THE WAY THEY WERE TALKING. ONE SAID TO THE OTHER "GOOD JOB GUYS" AND THEY STARTED LAUGHING. ASHLEY IDENTIFIED THE SHOOTERS AS ERIC HARRIS AND [REDACTED]. ACCORDING TO ASHLEY [REDACTED] WAS DRESSED IN

A WHITE SHIRT WITH A BLACK TRENCH COAT OVER IT. SHE CONTINUED TO SAY THAT [REDACTED] WAS ARMED WITH A HAND GUN WHILE HARRIS WAS ARMED WITH A SHOT GUN. ASHLEY SAID THAT SHE WAS NOT SURE ABOUT [REDACTED] IDENTITY UNTIL HER SISTER HEATHER SHOWED HER A COLUMBINE YEAR BOOK AND SHE SAW HIS PICTURE IN THE BOOK. ASHLEY IS SURE THE TWO SHOOTERS SHE OBSERVED WERE ERIC HARRIS AND [REDACTED]

ASHLEY ADVISED THAT SHE HAD NOT BEEN IN THE CAFETERIA PRIOR TO THE SHOOTING AND KNEW NOTHING ABOUT THE DUFFLE BAGS IN THE CAFETERIA. ASHLEY DOES NOT PERSONALLY KNOW ANY ONE INVOLVED WITH THE TRENCH COAT MAFIA NOR DOES SHE ASSOCIATE WITH THEM. SHE DID ADVISE THAT SHE HAS HAD CONTACT WITH THEM IN SCHOOL WHEN SHE BUMPED INTO ONE ACCIDENTALLY. SHE APOLOGIZED AND WENT ON HER WAY. SHE ADVISED THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE GROUP HAD A HABIT OF INTIMIDATING OTHER STUDENTS.

ASHLEY SAID THAT SHE HAD TOLD HER PARENTS ABOUT THE SHOOTING BUT SHE HAD NOT BEEN CONTACTED BY ANYONE IN LAW ENFORCEMENT BEFORE APRIL 27TH. SHE DID ADVISED THAT SHE HAD DONE SEVERAL INTERVIEWS WITH CHANNEL SEVEN.

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ON 042099 AT ABOUT 1351 HOURS SERGEANT LOAR AND I ADVISED DISPATCH THAT WE WERE ENROUTE TO THE COMMAND POST ON S PIERCE ST, SOUTH OF W BOWLES AVENUE. WE ARRIVED AT THE LPD SWAT VAN ABOUT 20 TO 25 MINUTES LATER. ABOUT 10 MINUTES LATER WE WALKED UP TO THE AREA ON THE EAST SIDE. I REMAINED AT THAT LOCATION FOR APPROXIMATELY 15 TO 25 MINUTES. MYSELF AND SEVERAL OTHERS FROM THE LAKEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT SWAT TEAM WERE THEN SENT TO THE NORTH WEST CORNER OF THE HIGH SCHOOL, WHERE WE MET UP WITH THE DENVER POLICE DEPARTMENT SWAT TEAM.

I WAS FIRST ASSIGNED TO PROVIDE COVER ON AN OPEN DOOR ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE SCHOOL. THIS COVER WAS REQUIRED FOR STUDENTS WHO WERE BEING EVACUATED OUT OF THE CAFETERIA AREA.

I WAS THEN ASSIGNED TO GO UP ONTO THE ROOF AND PROVIDE COVER WITH MY MP-5 SUB MACHINE GUN. AFTER ONLY A FEW MINUTES ON THE ROOF I WAS TOLD TO RETREAT.

I THEN STAGED NEAR A COMMAND POST JUST EAST OF THE SCHOOL. I WAS THEN SENT WITH THREE OTHER LAKEWOOD SWAT MEMBERS TO MEET UP WITH OTHER LAKEWOOD SWAT MEMBERS ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE SCHOOL.

ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE SCHOOL, I MET UP WITH THESE OTHER TEAM MEMBERS WHO WERE STATIONED BEHIND AN ARMORED CAR.

I WAS THEN ASSIGNED TO PROVIDE COVER WITH MY MP-5 SUB MACHINE GUN ON THE BACK OF THE ARMORED CAR AS WE RESCUED A MALE STUDENT FROM THE SECOND FLOOR SOUTH SIDE.

THE PARENTS OF THE FOURTH STUDENT DID AGREE TO SPEAK TO SERGEANT MCCASKY AND DETECTIVE SLATER.

ON 04/21/99 AT 1600 HOURS I ARRIVED AT ST ANTHONYS CENTRAL HOSPITAL TO INTERVIEW INJURED STUDENTS THERE. I RESPONDED TO 4 WEST TO CONTACT STUDENT MAKAI HALL. I WAS GREETED BY DAN AND SUSAN HALL, MAKAI'S PARENTS.

DAN HALL TOLD ME THAT IMMEDIATELY AFTER GETTING TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM, MAKAI WAS INTERVIEWED BY DETECTIVE JAMES NELSON FROM THE ARVADA POLICE DEPARTMENT. DAN HALL TOLD ME THAT DETECTIVE NELSON HAD ALSO SPOKE TO MAKAI FOR A SHORT PERIOD THIS MORNING, AND SAID HE WOULD RETURN AT 1800 TO COMPLETE HIS INTERVIEW.

DAN HALL SAID IT WAS TRAUMATIC FOR MAKAI TO TELL DETECTIVE NELSON WHAT HAPPENED, AND DAN DID NOT WANT MAKAI TO HAVE TO TELL IT ALL OVER AGAIN TO ANOTHER DETECTIVE. DAN ASKED THAT DETECTIVE NELSON BE ABLE TO GATHER ALL THE INFORMATION NECESSARY.

I TOWED THE VEHICLE AS IT WAS A HAZARD AND IMPEEDING THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC TO VEHICLES TURNING EAST ON BOWLES.

AN INVENTORY OF THE VEHICLE WAS DONE PRIOR TO RELEASING THE VEHICLE TO BOB'S TOWING. 
