Your name was referred to the FBI's Victim Assistance Program as being a possible victim of a federal crime. We appreciate your assistance and cooperation while we are investigating this case. We would like to make you aware of the victim services that may be available to you and to answer any questions you may have regarding the criminal justice process throughout the investigation. Our program is part of the FBI's effort to ensure the victims are treated with respect and are provided information about their rights under federal law. These rights include notification of the status of the case. The enclosed brochures provide information about the FBI's Victim Assistance Program, resources and instructions for accessing the Victim Notification System (VNS). VNS is designed to provide you with information regarding the status of your case.

This case is currently under investigation. This can be a lengthy process and we request your continued patience while we conduct a thorough investigation.

As a crime victim, you have the following rights under 18 United States Code § 3771:

- (1) The right to be reasonably protected from the accused;
- (2) The right to reasonable, accurate, and timely notice of any public court proceeding, or any parole proceeding, involving the crime or of any release or escape of the accused;
- (3) The right not to be excluded from any such public court proceeding, unless the court, after receiving clear and convincing evidence, determines that testimony by the victim would be materially altered if the victim heard other testimony at that proceeding;
- (4) The right to be reasonably heard at any public proceeding in the district court involving release, plea, sentencing, or any parole proceeding;
- (5) The reasonable right to confer with the attorney for the Government in the case;
- (6) The right to full and timely restitution as provided in law;
- (7) The right to proceedings free from unreasonable delay;
- (8) The right to be treated with fairness and with respect for the victim's dignity and privacy.

We will make our best efforts to ensure you are accorded the rights described. Most of these rights pertain to events occurring after the arrest or indictment of an individual for the crime, and it will become the responsibility of the prosecuting United States Attorney's Office to ensure you are accorded those rights. You may also seek the advice of a private attorney with respect to these rights.





Details: In an effort to provide a complete forensic conclusion to this matter, Minneapolis requests that the Laboratory Division, DNA Unit, attempt to extract and identify DNA from the known samples of deceased subject Jeffrey James Weise (submitted in a separate communication) and those victims, deceased and surviving, from the Red Lake High School (RLHS), and to compare same with any DNA extracted from blood collection swabs and blood splatter from the interior of the Red Lake High School.

Such an effort will be necessary, in the judgement of Minneapolis, due to the intense public interest in this matter and to forestall future claims of negligence and conspiracy claims. Further, such examination will help place the exact locations of each injured or deceased victim and subject in relation to the collected blood samples.

Minneapolis has submitted in a separate communication known biological samples of deceased subject Jeffrey James Weise.

Minneapolis is well aware of the demands that this request will place on the Laboratory. It is not deemed necessary to prioritize this request as previous requests have been and the Laboratory Division could look upon this lead as one to be handled in a reasonable amount of time and in a manner as deemed appropriate by the Laboratory. Upon conclusion of this lead and the Laboratory's examinations, Minneapolis intends to prepare a comprehensive report of the 03/21/2005 incident using the results of the Laboratory's examinations.

To assist the Laboratory and eliminate unnecessary comparisons, the following information, based on known paths of travel throughout the school by subject and victim, is provided:

There is no reason to do any comparisons using the known biological samples of [redacted] Darryl Lussier or Michelle Sigana (all submitted in a separate communication) to any of the enclosed items.

Section B is the front entrance lobby to the high school. It is likely that the only blood which would be found in this area is from Derrick Brun.

Section E is the lobby area outside of the classroom where the majority of the students were shot. It is likely that any blood from this area is from Jeffrey Weise or from wounded students [redacted] less likely from deceased victims Neva Rogers, Thurlene Stillday, Alicia

Section G is the lobby area outside of the science classroom. It is unlikely that blood from anyone other than, in descending order, Jeffrey Weise, [redacted] would be found in this location.

Section H is the far classroom. It is likely that blood in this area would only be from [redacted]

Section I is the teachers office located at the back of the two science classrooms. It is unlikely that blood from anyone other than [redacted] would be found in that location.

Section J is the science classroom where [redacted] was wounded. It is likely that the only blood recovered from this room would be from Jeffrey Weise or [redacted]

Section N is the math classroom of Teacher [redacted] where the majority of the casualties incurred as well as the suicide of Weise. It would be unlikely to find blood from Derrick Brun, [redacted] in this location.

Section O is the teacher's office behind [redacted] math classroom (N). It is unlikely that any blood found in this location is from [redacted] or Derrick Brun and likely to be blood from [redacted] or [redacted] or, less likely, from the deceased persons from the [redacted] classroom (Weise, Neva Rogers, Thurlene Stillday, Alicia White, Chase Lussier, Chanelle Rosebear.)

Details: During course of forensic search of Darryl Lussier/Michelle Sigana residence on 03/21-22/2005, three opened cans of soda were found in the living room and the kitchen. Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (MBCA) forensic technicians took swabs from all cans in the event that DNA might be extracted. Known buccal swabs were obtained from the [redacted] and known biological samples of Weise, Darryl Lussier and Michelle Sigana were obtained from autopsy.

At least two "persons of interest" are not accountable for the critical time period when Weise is presumed to have walked to his grandfather's house. While it is likely that Weise acted alone, it cannot be ruled out that Weise may have had an accomplice during the initial shootings who, for some reason, failed to accompany Weise when he left for the Red Lake High School. Latent Fingerprint Unit is currently tasked with examination of further items of evidence obtained from the Lussier household, including the three soda cans.

It is requested that DNA II attempt to extract DNA from the swabbings obtained by MBCA from the soda cans and to compare same with DNA extracted from the known samples of [redacted] Darryl Lussier, Michelle Sigana and Jeffrey James Weise to include or exclude them as contributors. Should unknown DNA be identified, Minneapolis will seek search warrants to obtain known samples from any person of interest who was unaccountable during the critical time period.

Details: On 03/21/2005 at approximately noontime, Jeffrey James Weise, age 16, a homebound student of Red Lake High School, Red Lake Indian Reservation, Minnesota, is believed to have gone to the home of his grandfather, Darryl Lussier, a Red Lake Police Department (RLPD) Sergeant. There, Weise is believed to have found his grandfather sleeping in bed and shot and killed him with multiple shots from a .22 caliber Ruger pistol that Weise had obtained. Weise then shot and mortally wounded his grandfather's significant other, Michelle Sigana.


Weise then obtained his grandfather's issued service weapons, including a 12 gauge shotgun and a .40 caliber Glock pistol, as well as his grandfather's duty belt, radio, ballistic vest and uniformed police vehicle. Weise is then believed to have shot Sigana an additional time with the Glock pistol, insuring her demise.

At approximately 2:40 pm, Weise, now equipped with the shotgun, Glock pistol, ballistic vest and duty belt and radio, took his grandfather's patrol vehicle and drove to the Red Lake High School. Witnesses observed him drive up to the front door with the vehicle, exit the vehicle carrying the shotgun in his hands and enter the school.

Comparative examinations of the above bullets or bullet fragments against test fired bullets from Items 50 (one DPMS Panther Arms Model A-15 223 Remington caliber rifle bearing serial number [redacted] and 71 (one Ruger 22 Long Rifle caliber pistol bearing serial number 181073) showed the presence of different features. This means that the above items can be eliminated as having been fired from Items 50 and 71.

Comparative examinations of the above bullets against test fired bullets from Items 50 and 66 show the presence of different features. This means that the above bullets can be eliminated as having been fired from Items 50 and 66. Item 73 (one magazine, 1B42, Area E, Item 8B) was used to test fire Item 71.

Comparative examinations of Item 53B (one bullet fragment recovered from Jeffrey Weise's buttocks, from 1B1) and one of the fragments of 53 D (three bullet fragments recovered from Jeffrey Weise's left thigh, from 1B1) against test fired bullets from Item 50 were inconclusive. However, based on similar class characteristics, these bullet fragments can not be eliminated as having been fired from Item 50. Comparative examinations of the above bullets or bullet fragments against test fired bullets from Items 66 and 71 showed the presence of different features. This means that the above bullets or bullet fragments can be eliminated as having been fired from Items 66 and 71. The remaining two fragments of Item 53D were not suitable for comparative examinations.

Examination of Item 53A (recovered from Jeffrey Weise's head, from 1B1) showed it to be consistent with shotshell components (buffer and apparent pieces of shot cup or wad). Examination of Item 53C (recovered from Jeffrey Weise's sweatshirt) showed it to be consistent with one flattened 00 buck shot pellet.

Item 54B (one apparent JHP bullet jacket fragment recovered from Chanelle Rosebear, 1B2), Item 59C2 (one apparent lead bullet fragment with copper plating recovered from Michelle Sigana) and Item 69 (one apparent JHP bullet jacket fragment recovered from [redacted] 1B70) were not suitable for comparative examination.

Examination of Item 57 (projectiles recovered from Derrick Brun, 1B5) showed it to be consistent with two 12 gauge rifled slugs and one 12 gauge wad.

Examination of Item 62B (1B42, Area E, Item 14) and Item 64C (1B45, Area G, Item 3) showed each of them to be a .40 caliber Glock brand magazine marked as having a 15 round capacity and marked for law enforcement/government only.

Per FBI SA [redacted] no examination of Items 51, 52 and 74 (four Glock pistols bearing serial numbers [redacted] and ECM626US and ECM644US respectively) are requested at this time.



Observations/Conclusions: The front door of the residence opened into the living room. Inside the living room was a large semi-circular sectional sofa that faced the southwest corner of the room. Directly in front of the sofa was a rectangular coffee table and a TV on a stand was located in the southwest corner of the room. Several items of forensic interest were noted on and around the sofa. A DPMS Panther Arms .223 caliber rifle, bearing serial number F006421, with a magazine in place was located near the center of the sofa. The action of the rifle was seized in the closed position.




Items noted on and near the sofa




The .223 caliber rifle (Item 3)

The Crime Scene Team forced the action open and found the chamber to be empty but the magazine was loaded with .223 cartridges. The safety was in the FIRE position. The rifle was collected as Item 3.

A gun case was found and collected from the floor behind the sofa as Item 2. Inside the gun case was an apparent footwear impression in dirt/dust. The impression was documented by photography. Several other items (Items 1, 4 – 12, 14 – 22, 31 and 32) were collected from on and around the sofa for possible latent print examinations. Two stocking hats (Items 13 and 23) as well as a swab of the mouth of the Pepsi can (Item 17A) were collected for possible DNA analysis. Several surfaces inside the living room were processed for latent prints and the lifts were collected as Item 42.






View of Area C looking east


An apparent bullet strike was noted on the center divider of the door frame and an apparent bullet hole was noted in the glass panel south of the doors. 

Observations/Conclusions: Area G consisted of a hallway located south of three science rooms. A semi-circular shaped locker area was located at the southeast side of the hall. The south wall of the hallway and locker area consisted of floor to ceiling windows. There were two doors on the west side of the hallway that exited to the outside. Three small alcove areas along the north side of the hall allowed entry into the science classrooms.




View of Area G looking west

Two .40 caliber cartridge casings (Items G-1 and G-2) were collected from the floor on the extreme east side of Area G. A .40 caliber magazine covered with apparent bloodstains was collected from the eastern side of the locker area (Item G-3). Also noted in this area were several apparent dripping bloodstains. Presumptive tests performed on one stain indicated the presence of blood and swabs were collected (Item G-4).



Locker area on southeast side of Area G





A total of six apparent copper jacket fragments were collected from the floor of Area G (Items G-6 - G-10 and G-13). Item G-6 was collected from the center portion of the hall, Items G-7 and G-8 were collected from the center alcove into the science rooms, and Items G-9 and G-10 were collected from the southwestern corner of area G. Item G-13 was collected from the center of the east portion of the hall.

Apparent bloodstains were noted on the hallway side of the door, door frame, and window frame leading into the center classroom (Area J). The window in this area had been completely shattered and most of it had dropped to the floor. Three of these apparent bloodstains tested positive with a presumptive test for blood and were collected (Items G-5, G-14 and G-15). The blood associated with Item G-5 was consistent with having been produced by contact with a bloody object, while the apparent bloodstains associated with Items G-14 and G-15 were consistent with impact spatter. The shape and distribution of these apparent bloodstains indicate that they projected back to two separate points of origin, indicating at least two separate impacts. Both impact sites were close to the window pane. However, the impact site associated with Item 14 originated from a distance of 73 - 81 inches from the floor and the impact site associated with Item 15 originated from a distance of 53 - 56 inches from the floor.

Apparent bloodstains were also noted on the west doors exiting Area G consistent with having originated by contact with a bloody object. Two of these stains tested positive with a presumptive test for blood and were collected (Items G-11 and G-12).

Apparent bullet holes were noted on both sides of the center portion of the hallway. A group of seven apparent bullet holes were noted in the western door and window leading into Area J. These holes were labeled with the letters A through G and their location was documented. On the glass wall opposite holes A through G were seven apparent bullet holes in a single pane of glass. These holes were labeled with the letters H through N and their location was also documented. An apparent bullet strike was also noted on the west wall of the east alcove leading into Areas H and J. The apparent bullet strike was labeled with the letter O.



Observations/Conclusions: Area J was a science classroom with a raised desk area to the south, four lab benches to the north, and a center lab bench and tables in the middle. There were doors in each corner of the south side of the room and a door near the northwest corner leading to a small room that appeared to have been used for office space and storage (Area I). A total of twenty-two copper jacket fragments were collected from Area J, seven from the east side and southeast corner of the room (Items J-2 through J-8), eight from the north central area of the room (Items J-9 through J-14, J-17, and J-19), and seven from the northwest corner of the room (Items J-21, J-24 through J-26, and J-41 through J-43). Two apparent lead fragments were collected from the room (Items J-18 and J-35). A total of eleven .40 caliber cartridge casings were collected from the northwest corner of the room (Items J-20, J-22, J-23 and J-27 through J-34).

A Glock Model 22 .40 caliber handgun bearing serial number ECM635US was collected from the south side of the northeast central lab bench (Item J-15). The action had been locked open and the gun was covered with apparent blood.




An apparent bloodstain consistent with having been deposited by contact with a bloody object was noted on the inside of the southeast door to Area J. Swabs were collected from this stain (Item J-1). Swabs from apparent dripping bloodstains were collected from a stool in the center part of the room (Item J-16), from the floor between the middle lab benches (Item J-36), from the floor between the two western most lab benches (Item J-37), from the north end of the western-most lab bench (Item J-38), and from the floor near the door to Area I (Item J-39). One apparent bloodstain consistent with spatter was collected from the door frame to Area I (Item J-40). Presumptive testing was performed on all the above samples, indicating the presence of blood.

The glass adjacent to the southeast door was almost completely shattered, with the majority of the glass inside the room. Apparent bullet strikes were noted on the southeast door frame. Observations/Conclusions: Area H, the western most science classroom, was almost identical to Area J. A door leading to Area I was located in the northeast corner of the room. There were also two exits into the hall (Area G) in each corner of the south side of the room. The lab stools in this room were placed upside down on the lab benches. No physical evidence associated with gunshots was seen in Area H.

A total of seventeen apparent bloodstains were collected from Area H. Presumptive tests were performed on all stains that were collected, indicating the presence of blood. Apparent bloodstains consistent with having been deposited by contact with a bloody object were collected from the door leading to area I (Items H-1 – H-3) and the southwest door of the room (Item H-14). Details: The purpose of this Electronic Communication is to report a delay in the return of a search warrant requesting account information from Internet Service Provider (ISP) Paul Bunyan Net, Suite 210, 1831 Anne St. NW, Bemidji, Minnesota, 56601.

On May 18, 2005, a search warrant was served to Paul Bunyan Net via facsimile requesting ISP information associated with the account held by [redacted] Paul Bunyan Net responded with requested information in the format of a CD-ROM via Federal Express shipping on May 27, 2005. The CD-ROM was checked in to evidence on May 27, 2005.

Due to a mistake in personal filing, the original search warrant was misplaced and soon became temporarily forgotten.



Dear Mr. Heffelfinger:

Recently, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) [Redacted] of your office contacted Special Agent (SA) [Redacted] of the Bemidji Resident Agency to resolve a issue surrounding the shootings of March 21, 2005. This issue was raised during the presentation you and I gave to the Red Lake Tribal Council on January 31, 2006 and involved an allegation to the effect that the Beltrami County Law Enforcement Dispatch Center (BCLEDC) did not promptly advise the Red Lake Police Department (RLPD) that a shooting was in progress at the Red Lake High School (RLHS).

SA [Redacted] upon request by AUSA [Redacted] undertook a study of this issue. This office is in possession of dispatch recordings from both the RLPD and BCLEDC as well as written transcripts from same. Additionally, SA [Redacted] has been in contact with the supervisor of the BCLEDC to clarify some details.

One important factor which must be taken into consideration in any study of this question is that the RLPD time stamp for its recording system was off by at least an hour, recording the first 911 call involving the shootings at the RLHS at 3:58.01 pm (all calls times were originally recorded in 24 hour time format but are changed to 12 hour civilian format for this letter's purposes), at least an hour later than the actual time. In fact, the RLPD's electronic time stamp is even

different from the RLPD's own computerized log, which reflects the first 911 call as 2:55 pm.

As you may be aware, 911 calls made on hard lines within the reservation are routed to the RLPD, while cellular 911 calls are routed to the BCLEDC.

The following sequence is taken from Red Lake dispatch records, but the times have been converted to reflect the correct hour; minutes have not been altered:

The bolded portion reflects the first BCLEDC contact, a voice-over transfer that is reflected on the Red Lake Dispatch logs. It is notable that even when this call was transferred, there had been no dispatcher to dispatcher contact between the two agencies despite Beltrami County's efforts and that Beltrami County was receiving multiple calls, necessitating the calling in of additional personnel to handle call volume.

The first call to Beltrami County, a cellular 911 call from a RLHS [redacted] (possibly [redacted]) came in at 2:41.23 pm by Beltrami County's records. A review of both the recording and written transcripts from Beltrami County show that immediately upon receiving the first 911 cellular call from RLHS, the dispatcher on duty, [redacted] attempted to contact RLPD while keeping the caller on the line and relaying safety instructions as proper procedure called for, but the RLPD phone rang unanswered, probably the first unanswered call reflected in the RLPD transcript. The calm professionalism of Dispatcher [redacted] is immediately evident in the Beltrami recordings. The RLPD dispatch center, which had only one dispatcher on duty at the time the first call to RLPD came in, was already overwhelmed.

The BCLEDC continued to attempt contact phone and radio contact with RLPD without success for approximately six minutes. In that time period, BCLEDC received a total of eight 911 calls from people at or near the RLHS, and had three professional dispatchers on duty and were already summoning additional personnel. Again, the attempts to contact an inundated RLPD are clearly depicted in the Beltrami recordings but the RLPD's own dispatch records reflect that the RLPD dispatcher was using information from the routed, bolded Beltrami voice-over call to inform responding RLPD officers of the situation, so even without

the dispatcher-to-dispatcher contact it was clear that RLPD was monitoring the Beltrami voice-over.

Using the two respective agencies' timestamp for the bolded call, and even adjusting the Red Lake calls to reflect the proper hour, it can be deducted that there was an approximate 16 minute discrepancy between the time stamps of the two agencies' dispatch recording system. By this calculation, Beltrami County received the first 911 call from the school at the time Red Lake recorded as 2:57 pm, almost simultaneously with the first call received by RLPD.

It is evident from these calculations that the allegation levied against Beltrami County of not immediately informing Red Lake of the first 911 call is false.

The Beltrami County dispatch center continued to log calls and radio traffic as well as providing communications, logistics and coordinating multi-jurisdiction law enforcement and medical response throughout the afternoon and evening. The Beltrami County dispatch center, in addition to the normal communications workload throughout the county, logged over 400 calls and radio traffic communications directly related to the Red Lake tragedy in the following six hours. The [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] who also holds the position of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was instrumental in coordinating the immediate and long-term response to the situation to include activating the Beltrami County emergency response plan involving air ambulances and area hospitals.

The role of the Beltrami County Law Enforcement Dispatch Center, so admirably exemplified by the performance of Ms. [REDACTED] Ms. [REDACTED] and the other team members, in the stabilization of this terrible crisis cannot be overstated and was so outstanding that this office has nominated the dispatch center's entire team for an FBI Meritorious Achievement award.

Deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) isolated from specimens Q76/Q77 (specimens combined for analysis), Q78/Q79, Q80/Q81, Q82, Q83, Q85, Q86, Q88, Q89, K32, K33, K38, and K43 was subjected to DNA typing by the polymerase chain reaction (PCR) at the amelogenin sex typing locus, the nine (9) short tandem repeat (STR) loci of the AmpF ℓ STR \circledR Profiler PlusTM ID and, where appropriate, the six (6) STR loci of the AmpF ℓ STR \circledR COfilerTM PCR Amplification Kits.¹

Based on the STR typing results², K33 (WEISE) is included as a potential contributor to the DNA obtained from specimen Q76/Q77. The probability of selecting an unrelated individual at random from a general population who could be a potential contributor to the DNA detected in specimen Q76/Q77 is approximately 1 in 130 trillion from the African American population, 1 in 160 trillion from the Caucasian population, 1 in 15 trillion from the Southeastern Hispanic population, 1 in 14 trillion from the Southwestern Hispanic population, 1 in 46 trillion from the Apache population, 1 in 300 billion from the Minnesota Native American population, and 1 in 130 trillion from the Navajo population. K32 [REDACTED] K38 (DARRYL LUSSIER), and K43 (SIGANA) are excluded as contributors to the DNA obtained from specimen Q76/Q77.

No STR typing results unlike K43 (SIGANA) were obtained from specimens Q88 and Q89.

Based on the STR typing results, K32 [REDACTED] K38 (DARRYL LUSSIER), and K43 (SIGANA) are excluded as contributors to the DNA obtained from specimens Q82 and Q83. It is noted that the typing results obtained from specimen Q82 are consistent with the typing results obtained from specimen Q83.

No STR typing results unlike K38 (DARRYL LUSSIER) were obtained from specimens Q85 and Q86.

I am writing this letter as a follow up to our recent phone conversation regarding the Red Lake High School shooting on March 21st, 2005. I have been the therapist/facilitator of a Trauma Recovery Group for the past year through my position at Upper Mississippi Mental Health Center here in Bemidji. Participants in the group were all teachers at the Red Lake High School during the school shooting and all have been diagnosed with Posttraumatic Stress Disorder as a result of the shooting and subsequent traumatic events connected to this tragic incident.

In addition to providing support and validation to its members, several psychotherapy techniques are utilized in this Trauma Recovery Program. These techniques include anxiety management techniques, cognitive therapy, psychoeducation and exposure therapy. Exposure therapy is helping someone confront specific situations, people, objects, memories or emotions that have become associated with a stressor or traumatic event. Repeated exposure allows excessive fear to dissipate and one can eventually recount the traumatic memories without high levels of distress.

Many of the Trauma Recovery Group members are at a point where exposure therapy would be tolerated well and would be very useful in regards to recovery. I would like to invite you as the Lead Agent for this case to attend our group, present the facts of the case along with any visual representations of the setting for the school shootings that could be made available. It is clearly my desire and the desire of each group member to respect the privacy of the victims and their families. As survivors of this horrific tragedy, however, there is a felt need to have the opportunity to review and clarify the events of that day in a way that aids recovery. It would be very useful to connect the facts of the case with the recollections and memories to provide a framework for utilizing the technique of exposure therapy in the best mode possible.

I believe your insight would be very valuable and appreciated and would like to invite you to attend our group on June 5th or June 19th at Upper Mississippi Mental Health Center (722 - 15th Street, Bemidji, MN) from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m. Please let me know of your availability and I appreciate your consideration of this request.
