## SUMMARY OF EVENT:

## NARRATIVE:

1. On 09/27/2006, at approximately 3:15pm, ATF Special Agents (SA) James D. Kennedy and Mark Feltz interviewed \_\_\_\_\_ a student at Platte Canyon High School and was present in Mrs. Smith's classroom when this incident occurred. Prior to the interview, SA Kennedy let \_\_\_\_\_ use his cell phone to make any calls to family or friends. After she was done using the cell phone, she was escorted to a classroom nearby located in the Administration Building east of the High School. Also present during the interview was an individual from the school staff known to \_\_\_\_\_
2. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she was in Mrs. Smith's classroom with other students working on a homework project, when she observed a man at the door talking to Mrs. Smith. \_\_\_\_\_ described the man as an older white male, average height and build, with light colored balding hair, wearing a very baggy blue hooded sweatshirt with white or light blue writing on the front, and jeans. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that Mrs. Smith was talking with the man in a low voice when she suddenly seemed nervous and asked what he was doing there. When \_\_\_\_\_ looked at the man, she saw that he was holding a black handgun, which she thought was in his left hand. The man ordered all of the students to get up and stand against the blackboard facing it. \_\_\_\_\_ was looking down during this time. \_\_\_\_\_ said that the man let \_\_\_\_\_ leave first, who is the tallest male in the classroom. \_\_\_\_\_ was told to leave next after the man put the gun to her back. As she was walking out of the classroom, she heard a gunshot. Once outside the classroom, \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ went inside Mr. Brownser's classroom. While inside Mr. Brownser's classroom, she heard an announcement over the intercom system for "code white". At that time, all of the students turned up their desks and got behind them while Mr. Brownser closed the door and stood nearby with a baseball bat. The students waited inside the classroom until the police arrived and escorted them from the building.
3. \_\_\_\_\_ did not remember seeing the man with any other items and did not see where the firearm came from. \_\_\_\_\_ did not know why she was told to leave, but speculated that it was because she and \_\_\_\_\_ were two of the bigger students. At the conclusion of the interview, \_\_\_\_\_ was asked to report any other details to law enforcement or the school staff if she remembers additional details at a later time.

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



### NARRATIVE:

1. On 09/27/2006 at approximately 3:25 p.m., SA's Russell and Desrosier interviewed \_\_\_\_\_ regarding the school shooting/hostage situation at Platte Canyon High School (PCHS). Also present for this interview was PCHS Counselor Chris Stewart (Work Telephone number of (303) 838-4642 Ext. 1655). Ms. Stewart was present due to the fact that this was an extremely traumatic experience for all those involved. This interview was conducted at the Administration Building located just east of PCHS.
2. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she is currently a senior at PCHS and that at approximately 11:30 a.m.; she was attending English class in room # 206. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that Ms. Smith is her English teacher. \_\_\_\_\_ exited room # 206 to make copies of papers across the hall in the Counseling Office. As \_\_\_\_\_ walked out of the classroom she observed a white male standing outside of room # 206 near the pod doors. \_\_\_\_\_ described this male as wearing a light blue hooded sweatshirt with the hood pulled over his head and covering the majority of his face. \_\_\_\_\_ also noticed what appeared to be a backpack strapped to this individual's back underneath the hooded sweatshirt. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that this individual was looking at students as they walked by him.
3. At first glance \_\_\_\_\_ believed this individual to be a student. As \_\_\_\_\_ walked past this individual she noticed that he had "scruff" on his face and that it was gray in color. \_\_\_\_\_ walked into the Counseling Office and made one copy on the copier when she heard Shelly Horstman's, the principal's secretary, voice over the intercom system say, "Code White." \_\_\_\_\_ stated that "Code White" means that something serious is occurring inside the school and that it is a term used to alert students and staff alike. \_\_\_\_\_ stated her initial reaction to hearing "Code White" was that it was another drill. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she soon realized that it was not a drill due to the "shaky" tone of Ms. Horstman's voice.
4. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she proceeded to the Counseling Office conference room where she remained until Officer

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



## NARRATIVE:

1. On 09/27/2006 at approximately 5:00 p.m., SA's Russell and Desrosier interviewed \_\_\_\_\_ regarding the school shooting/hostage situation at Platte Canyon High School (PCHS). Also present for this interview was \_\_\_\_\_. This interview was conducted at the Administration Building located just east of PCHS.
2. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that he is currently a senior at PCHS. Mr. Little stated that at approximately 11:30 a.m. he and Ms. Lyons were in the Resource Room across from the library when he heard a voice announce "Code White" over the intercom. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that he is not sure what the term "Code White" means. \_\_\_\_\_ stated after "Code White" was announced Ms. Applegate came into the Resource Room and that all three of them walked into the library and into the Librarian's office.
3. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that \_\_\_\_\_ Ms. Letterhaus (Librarian) and a girl he did not know were also in the Librarian's office. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that they turned off the lights in the office and placed posters against the windows so that no one could peer inside the office.
4. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that the group remained hidden in the office until he heard a "bomb go off." \_\_\_\_\_ stated that the explosion sounded like it originated from directly above them. \_\_\_\_\_ stated at this time the poster was removed from the windows and that a "green card" was then placed in the window. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that Sgt. Hancock knocked on the office door and that a SWAT Team escorted them out of the school. \_\_\_\_\_ said that after the "bomb" went off he looked up could see a small hole in the ceiling.
5. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that he never saw the suspect or anyone else that seemed suspicious or did not belong at the school.

Upon arrival at the scene, ATF Agents were tasked with interviewing Platte Canyon High School students located inside room 206. ATF Special Agents David Tabullo and Christopher Amon interviewed \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ at the Platte Canyon School Administrative Building located east of Platte Canyon High School.

On September 27, 2006, SA's Amon and Tabullo, at approximately 1515 hours, interviewed \_\_\_\_\_ and the following was stated by \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she saw a man walk into the classroom wearing a dark long sleeve sweatshirt wearing a backpack and holding a small black handgun. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she saw the man show Ms. Smith the black gun. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she saw the man put the backpack down. \_\_\_\_\_ also stated that the man told everybody in the classroom to face the blackboard. \_\_\_\_\_ then stated the man became angry because students were not doing as they were being told. \_\_\_\_\_ then stated the man shot the wall and that she heard a loud pop. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she remembers the man turned off the classroom lights. \_\_\_\_\_ also stated that the man seemed panicked and very nervous. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she had never seen the man before and remembers the man walked back and forth (pacing) with the black gun at his side. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she thought the man was picking out students. \_\_\_\_\_ also stated that the man let all the boys leave then followed with the girls. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she thought nothing but blonde-haired girls remained in the classroom.





- \_\_\_\_\_ stated that on or about July 2006 she remembers seeing MORRISON come into the pool acting funny as though he was drunk. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she remembers MORRISON looked dirty as though he had been camping. \_\_\_\_\_ stated that at first MORRISON did not say anything. \_\_\_\_\_ then stated that she remembers MORRISON walked toward the boy's bathroom and stand off to one side.
- \_\_\_\_\_ stated that she remembers MORRISON asked her if it is "Swim time" and "How much is it".
- \_\_\_\_\_ then stated that she told MORRISON the amount and that he left.
- \_\_\_\_\_ then stated that she remembers telling her supervisor, Julie Youngblood, about the incident.




**CONTACT INTERVIEW:** Interview of Gary Morrison and transfer of letter to SA's Russell and Desrosier.

## NARRATIVE:

1. On 09/28/2006 at approximately 1:27 p.m. SA Russell received a telephone call from Gary Morrison regarding a letter he had just received from his brother Duane MORRISON. Mr. Morrison stated that he would only give the letter to SA Russell and the other ATF SA's who were at his house the night before. SA's Russell and Desrosier immediately left the Denver I Field Office and responded to Mr. Morrison's home residence located at 5271 S. Yampa St. Centennial, CO.
2. Upon their arrival at the residence, SA's met with Mr. Morrison. Mr. Morrison stated that he had just received a letter in the mail addressed to him from his brother Duane Morrison. Mr. Morrison stated that SA Russell and the other ATF SA's treated him and his family with respect, concern and care and that he wanted to turn this letter over to ATF.
3. SA Russell took custody of this letter from Mr. Morrison. SA Russell noted that the letter was postmarked 09/27/2006 and that it was from Duane MORRISON 1300 S. Birch St. # 104 Denver, CO. to Gary Morrison 5271 S. Yampa St. Centennial, CO. Mr. Morrison signed ATF Form Receipt for Property and Other Items voluntarily transferring the letter to SA's Russell and Desrosier. Mr. Morrison confirmed with SA's the fact that this letter was in his brother's (Duane MORRISON) handwriting.
4. SA Russell hand delivered this letter to Colorado Bureau of Investigation Agent Mark Hodges.

Since you're reading this now, you know I'm gone and some terrible things will be said about me. Some true, some not. This is not a suicide note or a diary. This is my idea about the way things are and why they are.

I want to apologize to all of you. I know the way things will end will hurt many and I'm terribly sorry. Once I knew the way things were going to end up, I thought I better try to explain the way things were in my mind.

I would like to request three final things. ①... I prefer that this letter be read only by GARY, JOANN, REBECCA, and Judy.

②... I wish to be cremated. I don't want my ashes kept in some urn. No church service, no memorial service, and no burial.

If you wish, you may dispose of my ashes in the trash. I would like to have them dumped in the mountains though. Maybe up at Jefferson lake, that's such a pretty spot.

My third request will come later.

Please look for the number ③...

Its so hard for me to write this, to put my feelings down on paper. I think I know why that is and I'll get into that in a bit.

I know that awful things will be said about me, and I hope this doesn't cause any pain or hurt to any of you. I'm so sorry about this because I love all of you so much. I will try to see or talk to each of you before things come to an end.

I'm sure all of you have noticed over the years that I had problems. On my 21st birthday, I remember thinking about suicide seriously for the very first time. Through my teenage years, I remember thinking if I could just get my life straightened out by the time I was 21, I might have a normal life. That was not to be.

Some time in my mid to late twenties, I began to lose touch with reality. I would forget things that I had done or wonder if some of my other memories had actually happened.

Things got bad in the early 1990s while I was living in Sacramento. There were times my mind would go completely blank. I wouldn't know where I was or what I was doing. Sometimes this would only last one minute, sometimes ten minutes. This was when thoughts and urges began entering my mind. These were easier to control at first but now seem to run my life, going in and out of my mind at will. I have no idea what life is about, I have no idea why I'm alive. I have no idea what's real and what's not real.

I've lately began to wonder why "he" (your father) chose me to be the "one". Do any of you know? Did he ever tell anyone or did I do something wrong as a baby? Don't get me wrong, I thankful that none of you had to go through what I did! Since were on this subject..... This is difficult !!!

) Some people will say that I may have had a terrible childhood. Well, they couldn't be more wrong! Actually, I had no childhood at all. It was stolen from me. Taken before it began. Replaced by constant fear and occasional terror. Why would any parent mentally and physically abuse a child. You may not know it, but I believe the mental was the worst. Not knowing where "he" was or when he would be coming after me. That was the worst. Constant fear of not knowing. School was nice. I was



safe at school. For part of the day I could almost relax. For six or seven hours, I was out of "his" reach. I'm not sure I can put into words the way it was when "he" was around.

Fear was constant growing up. I got away from the dinner table as fast as I could. I would take a few bites, say I was full and leave. Fear overrode hunger because I could not stand to be in the same room as him.

Often we (kids) would all watch T.V. in the evening. If he came in and sat down, I would wait a few minutes, go to the bathroom, turn the water on or something, then go to my bedroom.

Wherever we lived, whichever house we had, I always had a certain spot to go to. It would be in one of the corners, some place where I couldn't be seen if he were



walking down the hall. I spent a lot of time sitting and standing in the corners of my bedrooms.

The worst, the nightmare more terrible than all others was when the two of us were home alone. When that would happen, when he came home or everyone else left, I would quickly go find my unseen corner and stay there until someone else got home.

I was always afraid to close the bedroom door, as he would know I was in there. I know all of you love him so I won't go into any details of what happened. If I remained quiet, no noise, no music, not a sound I was usually safe. But not always. Once in a while he would call me. As soon as I heard my name, fear would turn into panic and sheer terror!

Sometimes it was nothing, he would just want to know where I was, but the terror

was still there. Maybe a third to a half the time that he called me, he would come right for me as soon as he saw me. Terror was then replaced by something I don't think I can put into words. When I would see "him" coming after me I froze, unable to move. I would shake from head to toe my stomach in knots and my heart pounding, preparing for his temper to be unleashed on me. I would often wet myself.

This was my childhood, my life. Except for fishing with Gary a few times in North Carolina, I have no pleasant memories of growing up. NONE. "He" didn't take those from me, he didn't allow me to have any.

I wanted everyone to know the true facts about what happened at the Harky dealer and why. I'm not sure what will happen, but if I have my way it may just hit the fan.

On Dec. 24, 2002, I bought the new bike, a 2003 H.D. WideGlide. I also purchased a set of aftermarket performance exhaust system, a better carburetor and several other acces. to be installed before I took delivery. When I picked up the bike, no carb had been installed and a defective set of pipes were on the bike. I called and called and all I got was a major run-around. About Feb or March I started calling them and yelled, screamed, and cursed. That was my mistake. I should not have done that but it may have been only 3 or 4 calls. The accessories that they cheated me out of amounted to about \$1200. to \$1400. dollars, I don't remember exactly. I guess because of the phone calls, the H.D. dealer decided to press charges.

against me and I was arrested the other day. The papers are in my glove box. My bond was \$500.<sup>00</sup> and someone can get that money back from the jail or court. If things go as planned, I will try to make someone at the H.D. shop pay!

Today may have been one of the saddest days of my life. I realized that I may never talk to any of you again, and probably never see any of you again. I want all of you to know how much I enjoyed having dinners with you for the holidays, Christmas and Thanksgiving. And even the times I didn't accept it made me feel good that you thought enough about me to ask me to spend holiday dinner with you.

I have never owned much and don't own much now. I would like my belongings to go to James, if he wants them. My T.V., stereo equipment, couch, bed, ect. If Gary wants my telescope, he may have it. I also told James that he may have my few remaining guns. My fishing poles are in the Jeep. Maybe Eric would like those. He and I sure had fun fishing up at Jefferson lake.

There is one thing I would like Judy to have, if it survived packing. On top of my microwave there was a glass butter dish. It belonged to aunt Let. I don't know how long she had it, but I got it from her about 20 years ago. It's old and fragile. It's round with a glass base. I hope it didn't get broken.

Things are getting pretty close to the end now. I figure about a week is all I have left. I'll try to call everybody one last time. I may try to visit everyone, but I'm not sure if I could keep the tears back. I know that sounds strange coming from me. So it may be just a phone call.

I miss all of you so much already. It's a terribly hurtful, empty, tearful pain inside me knowing I will never see any of you again.



Please forgive me for the terrible things you have heard or are about to hear. Suicide is sometimes an embarrassment to family members, so for this I truly apologize for any hurt I may cause all of you. To me suicide is finally a release from an empty and painful life that has never had any meaning for me. I'm tired of living, and for the last 15 years or so I'm tired of living in pain. Constant pain.

So to my sisters, Judy, JoAnn, and  
Rebecca, to my brother Gary, please know that my  
last thoughts will be off you! My last few  
breaths, my last few heartbeats will be  
yours. Of my love for each of you.

My last moment will be painless!





- 6) On September 29, 2006, ATF SA Shane Abraham conducted a follow-up interview with Theresa Szalach, district manager of the Kimberly Ann apartments, located at 1300 Birch St. in Denver, CO. Szalach is a district manager for SC Investments, owner of the Kimberly Ann apartments, and provided a contact number of (303) 781-9465.
- 7) Szalach stated that MORRISON had previously lived at 1203 S. Birch St. #103 in the Kimberly Ann apartments prior to moving to 1300 S. Birch St. #104A. Szalach stated that MORRISON lived at the Kimberly Ann apartments for approximately nine years and further stated that MORRISON was an excellent tenant for approximately nine years until April 7, 2006 when she served an eviction notice to MORRISON for failure to

- On September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2006 Agents of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco Firearms and Explosives(ATF) from the Denver I field office responded to a school shooting at the Platte Canyon High School, 57393 U.S. Highway 285, Bailey, Colorado 80421.
- Upon arrival at the scene, ATF Agents were tasked with interviewing Platte Canyon High School students who were located inside classroom 206. **INTERVIEW:** On September 27, 2006, Special Agents interviewed John Michael Keyes regarding his daughter, Emily Keyes.

## NARRATIVE:

1. On September 27, 2006, in the afternoon, ATF Special Agents Rebecca Sauerhaft and Larry Krisl spoke with John Michael Keyes (DOB: 03/02/61) on the bleachers by the field across from the Platte Canyon High School. Mr. Keyes advised agents that he believed that his daughter, Emily, was inside the school. He said that he sent a text message to Emily's cell phone asking, "Are you okay?" At 1:50pm Emily replied via text message, "I love you guys." At 1:51pm Mr. Keyes texted Emily, "Where are you?" Mr. Keyes said he received no reply and no further transmissions to his cell phone from Emily. Mr. Keyes also explained that within the ten minutes prior to the text messages, Emily tried to call their residence. He said that the phone rang one time and that there were no messages on the voice mail. Mr. Keyes explained that his family had lived in the Bailey area for about seven years and that he could not think of anyone who would have a reason to hurt Emily.



1. He purchased the firearm on 12/03/2001 as stated on the copy of receipt provided by Dave's Guns, Aurora, CO.
2. He consigned approximately 4-5 firearms with Tom and Joe's Firearms in Wheat Ridge, CO in approximately 2004. He believed the Smith & Wesson Model 66 .357 revolver serial number CEY 2806 was one of those firearms.
3. He does not sell guns privately, but last sold a gun privately in the year 2000.
4. He also placed some firearms on consignment at The Firing Line, Aurora, Colorado, approximately one year ago. He spoke to a male named Richard who had an Australian accent.

SA Kopeck asked GURION if he knew a man named Duane MORRISON, and GURION responded, "That's the guy who killed the girl at the school."

SA'S Kopeck and Messner departed the GURION residence, and at approximately 12:00 PM SA'S received a telephone call from GURION. GURION stated he found a piece of paper he believed he kept as a receipt indicating Duane MORRISON purchased the firearm. SA Kopeck also received a telephone call from Tom and Joe's Firearms who stated they did not consign the Smith & Wesson Model 66 .357 revolver serial number CEY 2806.

SA'S Kopeck, Messner, and Motte returned to GURION'S residence at approximately 12:15 PM. GURION released the receipt to SA'S and made the following statements:

1. He met with MORRISON at his apartment and doesn't remember him at all.
  2. He sold three firearms in the past as private sales and always through The Rocky Mountain News classified.
  3. He did not sell MORRISON any other firearms.
  4. He has owned many firearms in the course of his life and still has firearms in his residence for protection.
- He entered military service in the Army in 1966 and was discharged in 1966 due to his mother's terminal illness.

SA'S Kopeck and Messner were unable to locate the purchaser's of the remaining firearms. At approximately 7:00 PM SA Kopeck received a phone call from GURION regarding the sale of the firearm. GURION stated he believed he sold the firearm to MORRISON in between May 2002 and October 2002.

## SUMMARY OF EVENT:

**INTERVIEW:** On September 27, 2006, ATF Special Agents (SA) [redacted] and Shane Messner interviewed [redacted] at the Platte Canyon Middle School in regards to the hostage/shooting incident at Platte Canyon High School.

## NARRATIVE:

1. On September 27, 2006, ATF Special Agents (SA) Brad Beyersdorf and Shane Messner interviewed [redacted] at the Platte Canyon Middle School in regards to the hostage/shooting incident at Platte Canyon High School. [redacted] was a student inside the classroom when Duane MORRISON entered it and took the students hostage. [redacted] lives at [redacted] and his telephone number is [redacted].
2. Mike Whittman (DOB: 04/06/1947) accompanied [redacted] during the interview. Mr. Whittman is a school psychologist for the Platt Canyon School District. Mr. Whittman's mailing address is P.O. Box 1681, Idaho Springs, 80452, and can be reached at (303) 567-4119 (home) or (720) 260-7657 (cell).
3. [redacted] stated the following during the interview:
4. At around 11:30 to 11:45 am., a scruffy-looking man (later identified as Duane MORRISON), entered the classroom of Ms. Smith, who taught the English class. The classroom was Room 206. Ms. Smith was handing out worksheets when MORRISON entered the room. Ms. Smith confronted MORRISON right away and then he pulled out a handgun from his jacket.
5. MORRISON was described as the following: older than 35 years-of-age, between 5'11" and 6'0", scruffy, not shaven, wearing a blue hoody, shorter hair which was either brown or black, and wearing a backpack.
6. MORRISON laid the backpack down on a table. After a brief argument between MORRISON and Ms. Smith, he forced her to the blackboard after he turned off the lights in the classroom. MORRISON told the students in the classroom to move to the blackboard, which all the students did.

7. Most of the students initially thought MORRISON was a parent when he entered the classroom.
8. The gun that MORRISON possessed looked like a .45 caliber handgun and was black, but [redacted] was unsure exactly what type it was. The handgun looked like a "James Bond" type of gun. MORRISON waved the handgun around and was not necessarily pointing it directly at the students.
9. MORRISON did not say anything about the backpack. The backpack was described as a small, camel-bak type of backpack and was either camouflage or a faded beige color. [redacted] could not provide any further details on the backpack, and thought it was possibly zipped up.
10. There were only 12 students inside of the classroom and between five and six students just outside of the classroom.
11. MORRISON poked a male student named [redacted] first and said "get out of here." Ms. Smith told [redacted], "You know what to do." [redacted] was on the right-side of the row of students and was closest to the door. MORRISON kept yelling "face the wall" to the students. MORRISON went randomly down the line of students telling them to leave the classroom. MORRISON selected mainly male students to exit the classroom.
12. MORRISON then poked [redacted] and another student named [redacted] to get out of the room. As the two young men were leaving the classroom, they ran into [redacted], a female student, outside of the classroom.
13. [redacted] heard a gunshot once they were outside of the classroom. The sound of it hurt his ears. He did not observe anything penetrate through the wall and could not recall smelling anything.
14. [redacted] another student, exited the room after [redacted].
15. The students ran into [redacted] outside of the classroom, and then they ran to the counseling office where no one was there. They then downstairs to the main office on the first floor. They told the receptionist, Carol Wilburn, about MORRISON and she said "are you serious?" Ms. Wilburn then ran to Shelly, the secretary to the principal, with the information. Shelly got on the intercom and yelled "Code White", the code for a lockdown.
16. [redacted] and the other students then went into the conference office. They sat down in the room. Ms. Stewart, another school counselor, came into the office and asked them how they were doing.
17. A Park County Police Officer came into the room and escorted them to the gyms near the Middle School. The students from Ms. Smith's classroom went to the "B" Gym and were the only students in there. The other students were placed in the "A" Gym.




Witness interview of \_\_\_\_\_ on September 27, 2006.

## NARRATIVE:

1. On Wednesday September 27, 2006 Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) Special Agent (SA) Darren Kennedy and SA Mark Feltz interviewed \_\_\_\_\_, a student at Platte Valley High School in Bailey, CO. \_\_\_\_\_ was one of the students initially taken hostage by Duane MORRISON on the morning of September 27, 2006. The interview was done at approximately 3:40PM in the administration building which houses the gymnasium, east of the building the hostages were being held.
2. The agents asked \_\_\_\_\_ if he needed anything, made sure he had an opportunity to call his parents, and offered him food and water. \_\_\_\_\_ stated he had already called home, accepted a bottle of water, and said he was ready to speak with the agents about the events of that morning.

\_\_\_\_\_ provided the following information:

- a. While preparing to write an essay in Miss Smith's College Prep I English class in room 214, a man, later identified as Duane MORRISON, came to the door of the classroom dressed in a "robin's egg blue," "hoody" sweatshirt, and jeans. The hood was up when MORRISON first came into the classroom, and later he took it down. There were no distinguishing marks, such as writing or symbols on the sweatshirt.
- b. MORRISON was wearing a "moderate size" backpack, which \_\_\_\_\_ thought was a little smaller than some students might use. The backpack was "light colored," but \_\_\_\_\_ could not remember exactly what color, or if it had any distinguishing features. \_\_\_\_\_ thought MORRISON wore the backpack the entire time, but was not sure.
- c. MORRISON had short hair, approximately 1/2" to an 1" long, which \_\_\_\_\_ described as "black and white, like a skunk," and later said he meant it was "salt and pepper." MORRISON's skin was tan, and "wrinkled and worn." MORRISON had no facial hair, and \_\_\_\_\_ said MORRISON was a little shorter than \_\_\_\_\_ who is \_\_\_\_\_ tall, so he estimated MORRISON to be just a little under 6' tall, and about 175

pounds. MORRISON was in his mid to late forties.

- d. The door of the classroom was at the opposite end of the room from the blackboard, and there was a window that was next to the blackboard, on the wall opposite the door.
- e. MORRISON was whispering in Miss Smith's ear, and Smith's face went "stone cold."
- f. MORRISON calmly said, "Everyone up against the blackboard." Initially no one moved and MORRISON took a gun out from under the sweatshirt with his right hand, and again ordered everyone to get up and face the blackboard. [redacted] was not sure exactly where the gun was prior to MORRISON bringing it out, but said it was somewhere near the waist, possibly from the pocket or "under his jeans."
- g. MORRISON began asking students their names, and Miss Smith was trying to talk to MORRISON, and asking him not to hurt anyone. MORRISON became angry, and Miss Smith tried to calm him down. Then MORRISON fired a shot into the wall near Miss Smith. To [redacted] it the shot sounded like a ".22 cal" gun, and [redacted] knew it was "definitely not fake."
- h. [redacted] said the shot was very loud, deafened him, and he smelled smoke, but did not see the shot because he was facing the blackboard and away from MORRISON at the time of the shot.
- i. MORRISON began walking behind the students asking their names. MORRISON would "think for a second," and then let some of them go. [redacted] felt MORRISON was being deliberate about which students he would let go and which he would keep. [redacted] did not know how MORRISON decided who to keep in the classroom, but again noted the male students left first.
- j. MORRISON walked up behind [redacted] placed the gun in [redacted] back, and asked for [redacted] last name. [redacted] told him, and then MORRISON "sniffed" [redacted] MORRISON then moved on to a girl, and asked her name. After thinking for a few seconds MORRISON returned to [redacted] and told [redacted] to leave. Other than pressing the gun into [redacted] back, MORRISON did not touch [redacted]
- k. [redacted] then left the room, and went to Mr. Brownser's room, and stayed there until the police came to take them out of the building.
- l. When [redacted] left Miss Smith's classroom he thought there were 8 or 9 other students still in the classroom. The "guys left first," and Miss Smith was still in the room when [redacted] left.
- m. [redacted] spoke with another student, [redacted] who told [redacted] she had seen MORRISON outside the classroom earlier that morning.

4. [redacted] was visibly upset, and expressed to the agents he felt guilty about not trying to stop MORRISON. The agents attempted to comfort [redacted] and explained he had done nothing wrong. The agents thanked [redacted] for taking time to talk with them, and let him know if he wanted to speak with them again the administrators at the school would help him contact the agents.

[redacted] statement differs from an earlier witness interview of [redacted] MORRISON ordered to leave the room.




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**SUMMARY OF EVENT:**

Witness interviews of Duane MORRISON's relatives; Gary Morrison, Lisa Morrison, and Eric Morrison.

**NARRATIVE:**

1. On Wednesday September 27, 2006 Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) Special Agent (SA) Jeff Russell, SA Levi Desrosier, SA Mark Feltz of the Denver Group I Office, along with Resident Agent in Charge (RAC) Ken Coffee of the Cheyenne Field Office, contacted Gary Morrison, the brother of Duane MORRISON, at his residence, 5271 Yampa St, Aurora, CO. Gary Morrison's wife Lisa, and [redacted] (LNU) were also present.
2. At approximately 9:45 PM the agents made contact with [redacted] identified themselves, and asked to speak with Gary Morrison. [redacted] woke up his [redacted] and everyone sat in the living room of the Morrison residence to talk. SA Russell informed the Morrison family Duane MORRISON had died earlier that day, and explained MORRISON had died after taking hostages at a high school in Bailey, CO. The family members immediately expressed shock and grief, and their first questions were concerns about the victims of the incident. SA Russell explained one of the hostages was killed.
3. The family described MORRISON as a "loner," who loved the outdoors, and spent most of his time hunting, fishing, camping and "four wheeling." Because MORRISON was an avid hunter he had several guns, although [redacted] Morrison stated when [redacted] last saw MORRISON in June, MORRISON had "gotten rid of most of his guns." [redacted] stated when they went fishing together in June of 2006 Duane MORRISON only had three guns, one of which was a Glock pistol, and [redacted] could not remember anything about the other two guns.
4. MORRISON had briefly stayed at Gary and Lisa Morrison's home in June of 2006, while Gary and Lisa were on vacation in Tahiti. They trusted MORRISON and felt it would be good to have an adult in the home with Eric who was only 20 years old. Eric stated during this time MORRISON helped with chores around the house, and it was during this time that Eric and MORRISON last went fishing near Bailey, CO at Jefferson Lake.
5. After staying at Gary Morrison's home, in June 2006, the last known residence for MORRISON was a "hotel on west Colfax," but the family thought he had last been at the hotel in June or July of 2006, and believed he

was most likely living in his jeep, which they described as a "Gold Jeep Rubicon." Prior to his brief stay at Gary Morrison's home MORRISON had lived at an apartment on South Birch Street in Denver, CO, but MORRISON had moved out of the apartment in January 2006. The family knew MORRISON had left because he had phoned a nephew, James Edward King III (aka Jimmy) to say he had packed everything he needed into his Jeep, and Jimmy could take anything Jimmy wanted out of the apartment.

6. Gary and Lisa Morrison stated the only recent traumatic event in Duane MORRISON's life was a "*falling out*" with a brother in law with whom MORRISON had a business partnership. Duane MORRISON, and Dale Ervin, who is married to MORRISON's sister Judy Ervin (Nee: Morrison), and Dale Ervin's son Dale Ervin Junior (aka DJ), were all equal partners in a haunted house business. The three ran "Primitive Fear" each year at the Mile High Events Center, in Commerce City, CO.
7. The partners had been doing business for approximately 9 years, and usually prepared the haunted house beginning in early September and would open to the public the first weekend in October. The haunted house would stay open through Halloween, and then they would spend a week or two taking it down. Gary didn't know the financial details, but stated Duane MORRISON made enough money in from the business to live the rest of the year, and guessed that the last year Duane MORRISON made approximately \$45,000 to \$50,000 dollars.
8. During the 2005 Halloween season, Duane MORRISON had a "*falling out*" with Dale Ervin, and DJ Ervin. An argument had started over being ready to open the house on time, and Duane MORRISON had shut off all the lights to building. Another of Dale Ervin's sons, Stephen Ervin, was working that night and out of anger punched a steel beam, breaking his hand. Dale Ervin blamed MORRISON for the injury, and the relationship between the business partners began to deteriorate quickly.
9. Following the Halloween season, Dale Ervin, DJ Ervin, and Duane MORRISON also started a business to sell 5000 Christmas trees at three locations around Aurora. The business was not successful, and the partners did not even make enough money to cover their costs. This caused further problems between the business partners.
10. Duane MORRISON wanted to leave the business partnership, and complained that Dale Ervin would not pay MORRISON for his share of the business. Gary described the business agreement as a family agreement, and did not think anything had been established in writing. By January of 2006 Duane MORRISON was extremely upset over the business dealings, and it became a major problem in his life.
11. Gary Morrison repeatedly stated the events surrounding the business hurt Duane MORRISON very badly. He also noted the haunted house would have it's opening weekend on Friday September 29, 2006, and this may have been causing MORRISON stress.
12. Gary Morrison said Duane MORRISON felt cheated by Dale Ervin, and Gary did not know all the details, but Gary also thought Dale had not been fair to MORRISON. Also, their sister Judy, Dale's wife, had told Gary that Dale had not been fair to MORRISON about the business.
13. The Morrison family was asked to describe Duane MORRISON's personal history and relationships, and provided the following information:
  - a. The childhood for Duane, Judy, and Gary Morrison had been "hellacious."
  - b. Their father was in the military, and their parents split up when they were all still children.

- c. When Gary was 17, Duane 15, and Judy 13, their mother died. Gary was old enough to live on his own, and lived in his car until he got a job. Duane and Judy were sent to Sacramento, CA to live with their aunt, Lela Boots.
- d. Lela Boots died a few years later from cancer, but Duane and Judy were close to her children, Marley Boots and a son whose name Gary Morrison could not remember, but he thought might be "Richard."
- e. Duane MORRISON joined the Navy around 1973, but spent less than 6 months in the military. MORRISON briefly went "AWOL" after basic training, but returned to duty on his own. He was discharged from the Navy approximately one month after the AWOL incident.
- f. MORRISON never had steady employment. He mostly worked with or for family members. Most of the work was seasonal, such as the haunted house business in the fall, or a deck building in the spring or summer. MORRISON enjoyed this because that gave him time for his outdoor activities.
- g. MORRISON's longest "regular job" was working for Dale Ervin, when Ervin owned some AAMOCO stores. Lisa Morrison stated this was only about 6 months, and she had never known MORRISON to stay with any one job for more than a few months.
- h. Prior to entering into the partnership to run the haunted house MORRISON had been in a serious auto accident while driving with a high school friend, Dennis Murra. Gary Morrison believes MORRISON was receiving some sort of disability pay because of the accident.
- i. MORRISON was not close to anyone, family or friends. He kept to himself, and Gary said they were, "lucky to hear from him once very 30 to 45 days." MORRISON's nephews; Eric Morrison, DJ Ervin, Stephen Ervin, and James King III, were his closest friends.
- j. In the 1980s Duane MORRISON had been married for less than a year, and Gary Morrison did not know who MORRISON had married, or why they divorced.
- k. MORRISON had dated a girl named Denise (LNU), a few years prior. Denise occasionally worked at the haunted house, and Gary Morrison thinks Dale Irvin may be able to provide additional information about Denise. Gary and Lisa Morrison thought MORRISON may have met Denise at the apartment complex he lived at on Birch Street in Denver.
- l. When MORRISON would be out of contact for long periods of time Gary Morrison usually assumed MORRISON was in Sacramento. Gary Morrison was not sure who MORRISON would see in Sacramento, or where he would stay, but knew MORRISON had been close to Lela Boots' children.
- m. MORRISON had gone camping in Utah, and in the "Sand Dunes" recently. He had only talked with Gary Morrison two times since he had stayed at Gary Morrison's house in June. MORRISON would initiate contact with Gary by telephone. Gary and Lisa Morrison did not have a phone number where they could call MORRISON.
- n. Lisa Morrison had tried to teach Duane MORRISON how to use email, and Gary Morrison had given MORRISON a computer as a gift about two to three years ago. Despite Gary and Lisa Morrison's efforts Duane MORRISON did not use email.

o. MORRISON had no training or experience with explosives.

14. None of the Morrison family could think of any connection Duane MORRISON had to Bailey, CO, or the Platte Valley High School, other than MORRISON's fishing trips to Jefferson Lake.

15. The Morrison's did not know anyone named "John Keyes" and did not know anyone named "Emily."

17. MORRISON had not phoned, or sent any letters to, Gary Morrison's home recently. SA Russell asked the Morrison's if any letters or packages arrived in the mail for Gary to contact one of the agents right away. Gary Morrison assured SA Russell if any letters arrived he would not open the letter and contact ATF right away. SA Feltz gave both Lisa and Gary Morrison a business card, and SA Russell wrote his contact information on the back of the cards.

18. Throughout the interview the Morrison's expressed their concern for the victims in this incident, especially the deceased victim. The Morrison's were cooperative and expressed their willingness to assist in any way to discover why MORRISON had committed these crimes.

19. The agents offered their assistance in notifying other family members about MORRISON's death, but it was discovered other law enforcement personnel had already located and began notifying other family members. The agents thanked the Morrison's for their assistance, and expressed their sympathies before leaving the home.

20. The interview ended at approximately 11:15 PM, September 27, 2006.



Interview of Rupa Ann Marie KING (DOB: 07/25/68)

## NARRATIVE:

1. On 6/29/06 at approximately 1:30 PM, ATF SA'S Alex Kopeck and Brad Beyersdorf contacted Rupa KING at her place of employment, Arch Aluminum and Glass, located at 11950 E. 33<sup>rd</sup> St., Denver, CO.
2. Rupa KING went into another office and returned with the name Dick Peterson written on a piece of paper. Ms. KING advised agents that she was told to give Dick Peterson's name as the attorney for anyone inquiring to speak with her.
3. SA Kopeck advised Ms. KING she was free to leave and was not obligated to speak with agents, but were only seeking knowledge of how the firearm she purchased was found in a campground near Bailey, CO.
4. SA Beyersdorf advised Ms. KING Agents were aware she had purchased the Colt Model MT6551 .223-caliber semiautomatic rifle serial number CST 00981 on 11/22/1999 at Dave's Guns in Aurora, CO. SA Beyersdorf produced the copy of ATF F 4473 indicating Ms. KING was the purchaser.
5. Ms. KING said she wanted to speak, but "things" were extremely stressful after the recent occurrence of events. Furthermore, Dale Ervin advised the family to have anyone inquiring about events to contact their attorney.
6. SA'S provided Ms. KING with contact numbers for her Attorney Dick Peterson.
7. At approximately 2:30 PM, SA Kopeck contacted Attorney Dick Peterson at (303) 793-3400 and learned Dale Ervin and Rupa King were not yet represented by Dick Peterson, but were seeking his counsel. Mr. Peterson stated he would attempt to contact the parties and return the information as soon as possible.

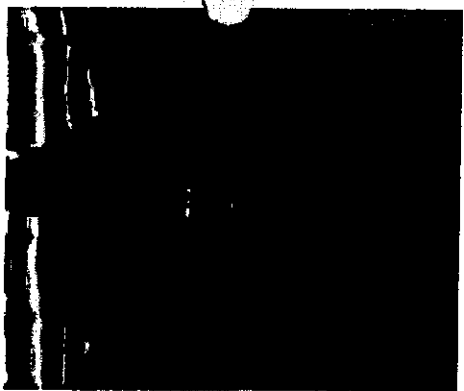

## SUMMARY OF EVENT:

Interviews at the Mallory Manor Motel.

## NARRATIVE:

1. On 09/28/2006, ATF Special Agents (SA) James D. Kennedy, Mark Feltz, Chris Amon, and David Tabullo responded to the Mallory Manor Motel, located at 9600 W. Colfax Ave, Lakewood, Colorado 80215, phone number (303) 237-8866. Agents had received information indicating that Duane MORRISON had been staying at the motel prior to the incident at Platte Canyon High School.
2. Upon arrival at the motel, Agents met with the manager who related that MORRISON had been staying in room #10, but that the room had been cleaned by the housekeepers and all of the personal items had been placed in a storage closet nearby. While waiting for CBI to respond to the motel, Agents interviewed some of the tenants nearby. Agents had a copy of MORRISON'S driver's license photo to show the tenants.
3. At approximately 4:06 pm, SA Kennedy interviewed Julie Guthrie (DOB: 01/25/1956) and Howard Schaefer (DOB: 06/24/1952) who are common law husband and wife staying in room #5. Guthrie stated that they had been living in room #5 for the past 3 weeks, but had lived in room #14 for 3-4 months prior. Guthrie was shown a photo of MORRISON and positively identified him, and stated that she also recognized him from watching the news. Guthrie said that she had first met MORRISON about 3-4 months ago, and that he used to stay in room #15, before moving to room #10 about a month prior. Guthrie and Schaefer described MORRISON as a loner and said that he was quiet and always kept to himself. Guthrie never saw MORRISON with anyone else. Guthrie and Schaefer would talk to MORRISON from time to time, but it was only small talk. Guthrie said that MORRISON liked hunting and camping. Guthrie also recognized MORRISON'S jeep from watching the news and said that MORRISON always kept it very clean, except for about 3 or 4 days ago when it was filthy like he had been offroading.
4. At approximately 4:18 pm, SA Kennedy and SA Amon interviewed Davy Jones (DOB: 01/13/1958) who was staying in room #12. Jones did not recognize the photo of MORRISON, but remembered seeing the gold jeep.
5. At approximately 4:21 pm, SA Kennedy and SA Amon interviewed James Riggins (DOB: 08/05/1957) who was staying in room #11. Riggins said that he has lived there for about 2 years. Riggins positively identified the photo

of MORRISON and said that he saw him leave the day before at about 9:00 - 9:30 am. Riggins said that MORRISON kept to himself and never talked to anyone. Riggins had seen MORRISON and another unknown male 3 times before who arrived with MORRISON in his Jeep and spent the night. The last time he saw MORRISON with the other male was the first or second week of August. Riggins has never seen MORRISON with firearms or drugs. Riggins said that when MORRISON came back to the motel from the previous weekend, the Jeep was covered in sandy type mud.

6. Agents briefly spoke with an unknown white female who was staying in room #9. She stated that she had just rented the room that day, and had recently gotten out of jail. She provided no information about MORRISON.
7. At approximately 4:40 pm, SA Kennedy and SA Amon interviewed Laura Brown (DOB: 12/17/1958) and Joyce Victory (DOB: 03/29/1950) who were staying in room #8. They had been staying there for 4 days and did not recognize the photo of MORRISON and had no information about him.
8. At approximately 4:45 pm, SA Amon interviewed Betty Beesley (DOB: 09/28/1982) who was staying in room #7. Beesley positively identified MORRISON from the drivers license photo, and stated that the only interaction that she had with MORRISON a few days prior when MORRISON was sitting outside room #10 and stared at Beesley and her daughter in a manner that made her uncomfortable as they walked by. Beesley also stated that on one occasion, MORRISON asked her directions to 1717 Colfax Ave.
9. SA Amon interviewed Darby Griffin (DOB: 09/18/1959) who was staying room #26, and is friends with Beesley (room #7) and her husband Mike Conroy (DOB: 01/31/1978), who was not available for interview. Griffin positively identified the photograph of MORRISON. Griffin stated that approximately a week prior, he saw MORRISON leave his room carrying a hunting rifle in his right hand and two pistols in his waistband. Griffin described one of the pistols as a revolver and the other as a black semi-automatic handgun. Griffin stated that when he asked MORRISON what he was doing, MORRISON stated that he was going target shooting.
10. At approximately 6:06 pm, SA Kennedy interviewed Brian North (DOB: 09/03/1950) who was staying in room #15. North had been staying at the motel for 9 days and did not recognize the photo of MORRISON or have any information about him.



## SUMMARY OF EVENT:

Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Interviews.

## NARRATIVE:

1. On 9/28/2006 ATF SAs Alex Kopeck and Marcus Motte responded to the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company located at 2885 W. County Line Rd., Littleton, CO 80219, telephone # (303) 703-2885.
2. SAs Kopeck and Motte interviewed general manager Jay Seibel, receptionist Linda More, and salesperson Clint Berry regarding the prior harassment complaint with Duane MORRISON in January 2004.
3. General Manager Jay Seibel (telephone # (303) 703-2885) stated Duane MORRISON first contacted the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company on October 16, 2002 for the purchase of a 2003 Harley Davidson Model FXDWG, VIN# 1HD1GEV103K315743. Mr. Seibel recovered the file for MORRISON and made the appropriate copies. (See attached)
4. Mr. Seibel stated he clearly remembered the problems associated with MORRISON, and related that MORRISON became angry when he first purchased his motorcycle in 2002 after a misunderstanding with a security/siren system that MORRISON believed was standard equipment.
5. MORRISON continued to bring in his motorcycle for service until March 2003. The final contact was in January 2004 following the harassment complaint filed by the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company in Littleton, CO.
6. Mr. Seibel said MORRISON was upset after he received a Harley Davidson catalog in the mail each month after complaining he wanted the mail to stop. MORRISON threatened to come down with an assault rifle to the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company in Littleton, CO.

7. SAs Kopeck and Motte interviewed Linda More (DOB: 8/10/54; telephone # (303) 332-6144) regarding the harassment incident in January 2004. Ms. More stated she has dealt with complaints in the past and knew immediately MORRISON was serious about his threats. Ms. More released a copy of her statement made in the January 2004 complaint, and said MORRISON was upset with a factory catalog he received in the mail from corporate office in Milwaukee, WI. MORRISON threatened to shoot her at the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company in Littleton, CO.
8. SAs Kopeck and Motte interviewed Clint Berry (DOB: 12/25/46; telephone # (303) 703-2885) regarding the sale of the motorcycle to MORRISON on October 16, 2006. Mr. Berry stated MORRISON was an average customer who appeared to be quiet and cordial until he became upset in the following weeks after learning a security system was not installed on the motorcycle. During the following weeks MORRISON was angry and obnoxious.
9. During the interviews, the three employees interviewed did not believe there was any correlation between the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company and the shootings in Bailey, CO. Mr. Seibel advised agents that during an all staff meeting the following day he would canvass the staff and see if any correlation existed.

On 112304 at 1000 hours, I was dispatched on a phone call for an harassment complaint at 2885 W. County Line Road, Rocky Mountain Harley-Davidson (RMHD).

Investigation:

Upon placing the telephone call, I contacted Linda Susan More, DOB 081054, who informed me that a customer of RMHD called the store and left a very disturbing message on the store's voicemail system at 1325 hours on 112204. Linda told me that the message was left by Duane Roger Morrison, DOB 072353, who was a dissatisfied customer and became agitated when he received a Harley-Davidson product catalog in the mail. Linda said that Duane threatened to come to the store with an assault rifle to see if that would fix the situation.

Linda said that she can positively identify Duane by his voice as he had made other harassing telephone calls to the store in the past. Linda said that Duane identified himself by first and last name at the beginning of his voicemail message. Linda said that Duane had some bad feelings about his previous customer service experience with the W. County Line store and did not want to receive any mailings from them. Linda also informed me that Duane was calling the corporate headquarters in Milwaukee, WI.

I asked Linda if she could transfer Duane's voicemail onto a tape that I could collect as evidence. Linda said that she could. I also asked Linda to obtain a list of all of the RMHD employees who had been harassed by Duane. Linda said that she would also do this. I told Linda to telephone me back at the department when she obtained all of this information and that I would meet with her at RMHD to further discuss the charges that she wanted to pursue against Duane.

At approximately 1330 hours, Linda called back to the department so that we could meet to discuss the harassment charges. Ofc. Jones was dispatched to RMHD to collect the information that Linda had gathered. Ofc. Jones obtained written statements from Linda More, Thomas Floyd Tennant, DOB 081560, and Edward James Seibel, DOB 030769, regarding the continued harassment that they have received from Duane. Ofc. Jones also collected a taped recording of the voicemail left by Duane on 112204. I arrived on scene at approximately 1400 hours. Linda allowed me to listen to the original voicemail message from Duane. I heard Duane clearly identify himself at the beginning of the message. I also heard several profanities and a mention of appearing at the store with an assault rifle to take care of the problem.

Due to previous harassing telephone calls from Duane and the mention of an assault rifle in his 112204 voicemail message, I appeared at the Littleton Municipal Courthouse at 1430 hours to obtain a warrant for Duane Morrison. I also issued a citation for Harassment (to be served to Duane Morrison) (M345249).

Miscellaneous information:

On 9/27/06, ATF explosive detection canine "Ostermann" and Special Agent Canine Handler D. Lambert initiated a search of several back packs located around the exterior of Platte Canyon High School. No significant alerts or recoveries were made.

At approximately 05:45 PM, Ostermann alerted on an ammunition can located inside the high school gymnasium. X-Ray analysis and investigation by Jefferson County Bomb Squad personnel determined that the can was not an improvised explosive device. It is speculated that the canine alert may have been caused by trace amounts of smokeless powder from the ammunition once stored in the can. At approximately 06:45 PM, Ostermann searched the exterior of a Jeep Rubicon, gold in color, identified by CO plate #529IKL. Registration records indicated that this vehicle belonged to suspect, Duane MORRISON. No significant alerts or recoveries were made.

On 9/28/06, ATF explosive detection canine "Ostermann" and Special Agent Canine Handler D. Lambert initiated a search of approximately 150 vehicles parked outside the high school. No significant alerts or recoveries were made.
