CONTACT INTERVIEW: Interview of Gary Morrison and transfer of letter to SA's Russell and Desrosier.

NARRATIVE:

- 1. On 09/28/2006 at approximately 1:27 p.m. SA Russell received a telephone call from Gary Morrison regarding a letter he had just received from his brother Duane MORRISON. Mr. Morrison stated that he would only give the letter to SA Russell and the other ATF SA's who were at his house the night before. SA's Russell and Desrosier immediately left the Denver I Field Office and responded to Mr. Morrison's home residence located at 5271 S. Yampa St. Centennial, CO.

- 3. SA Russell took custody of this letter from Mr. Morrison. SA Russell noted that the letter was postmarked 09/27/2006 and that it was from Duane MORRISON 1300 S. Birch St. # 104 Denver, CO. to Gary Morrison 5271 S. Yampa St. Centennial, CO. Mr. Morrison signed ATF Form Receipt for Property and Other Items voluntarily transferring the letter to SA's Russell and Desrosier. Mr. Morrison confirmed with SA's the fact that this letter was in his brother's (Duane MORRISON) handwriting.
- 4. SA Russell hand delivered this letter to Colorado Bureau of Investigation Agent Mark Hodges.

Things got bad in the early 9905 while I was ITVING in Sociamento. There were times my mind would go completely blank I wouldn't Know where I was or what I was doing. Sometimes this would only last one muste, sometimes ton minites. This was when thoughts and easier to control at first but now seem to run my life, going in and out of my mind of will. I have no idea what life is about . I have no idea why I'm alive I have no idea whats real and whats not real.

re lately began to wonder why your father) chose me to bet "one". Do any of you know? Did he ever tell anyone or did I do something wrong as a baby? Don't get me wrong, I thankfu that none of you had to go through what I did! Sime were on this subject... This is difficult !!! Some people will say that I may have had a temble childhood well they couldn't be more wrong! actually I no childhood at all. It was stolen from me. - 1) On September 28, 2006, ATF SA'S Shane Abraham and Rennie Mora interviewed Sharon Regan (DOB: 09/25/66), manager of the Kimberly Ann apartments located at 1300 Birch St. in Denver, CO regarding her knowledge of Duane Roger MORRISON (DOB: 07/23/53). Regan provided a contact address of 1300 Birch St. #101A, Denver, CO, and a contact phone number of (303) 300-9956. The following is a summary of the interview.
- 2) Regan stated that MORRISON moved into apartment #104 in the Kimberly Ann apartments in February 2001 and moved out of the Kimberly Ann apartments in April 2006. Regan stated that she only recently became the property manager for the Kimberly Ann apartments and didn't have any personal knowledge of MORRISON.
- 3) Regan stated that MORRISON'S rental application listed an employment contact at Colorado Custom Decks, located at 18056 E. Bellewood Dr. in Aurora, CO, and an employment contact number of (303) 693-8710.
- Regan stated that MORRISON'S rental application listed an emergency contact of Gary Morrison and an emergency contact number of (720) 680-8710.
- 5) Regan provided a copy of the rental lease agreement for 1300 Birch St. #104A signed by MORRISON on August 17, 2001, to SA Abraham.
- 6) On September 29, 2006, ATF SA Shane Abraham conducted a follow-up interview with Theresa Szalach, district manager of the Kimberly Ann apartments, located at 1300 Birch St. in Denver, CO. Szalach is a district manager for SC Investments, owner of the Kimberly Ann apartments, and provided a contact number of (303) 781-9465.
- 7) Szalach stated that MORRISON had previously lived at 1203 S. Birch St. #103 in the Kimberly Ann apartments prior to moving to 1300 S. Birch St. #104A. Szalach stated that MORRISON lived at the Kimberly Ann apartments for approximately nine years and further stated that MORRISON was an excellent tenant for approximately nine years until April 7, 2006 when she served an eviction notice to MORRISON for failure to

8) Szalach stated that she thought MORRISON was, "a little strange," and further stated that MORRISON had a large number of firearms in the second bedroom of his apartment and always warned the maintenance staff not to go into that bedroom when they were performing routine maintenance on his apartment. Szalach further stated that MORRISON told her that several of the firearms had been stolen from his apartment during a burglary that occurred sometime during the summer of 2005.

<u>INTERVIEW</u>: On September 27, 2006, Special Agents interviewed John Michael Keyes regarding his daughter, Emily Keyes.

NARRATIVE:

1. On September 27, 2006, in the afternoon, ATF Special Agents Rebecca Sauerhaft and Larry Krisl spoke with John Michael Keyes (DOB: 03/02/61) on the bleachers by the field across from the Platte Canyon High School. Mr. Keyes advised agents that he believed that his daughter, Emily, was inside the school. He said that he sent a text message to Emily's cell phone asking, "Are you okay?" At 1:50pm Emily replied via text message, "I love you guys." At 1:51pm Mr. Keyes texted Emily, "Where are you?" Mr. Keyes said he received no reply and no further transmissions to his cell phone from Emily. Mr. Keyes also explained that within the ten minutes prior to the text messages, Emily tried to call their residence. He said that the phone rang one time and that there were no messages on the voice mail. Mr. Keyes explained that his family had lived in the Bailey area for about seven years and that he could not think of anyone who would have a reason to hurt Emily.

He consigned approximately 4-5 firearms with Tom and Joe's Firearms in Wheat Ridge, CO in approximately 2004. He believed the Smith & Wesson Model 66 .357 revolver serial number CEY 2806 was one of those firearms.

3. He does not sell guns privately, but last sold a gun privately in the year 2000.

4. He also placed some firearms on consignment at The Firing Line, Aurora, Colorado, approximately one year ago. He spoke to a male named Richard who had an Australian accent.

SA Kopeck asked GURION if he knew a man named Duane MORRISON, and GURION responded, "That's the guy who killed the girl at the school."

SA'S Kopeck and Messner departed the GURION residence, and at approximately 12:00 PM SA'S received a telephone call from GURION. GURION stated he found a piece of paper he believed he kept as a receipt indicating Duane MORRISON purchased the firearm. SA Kopeck also received a telephone call from Tom and Joe's Firearms who stated they did not consign the Smith & Wesson Model 66 .357 revolver serial number CEY 2806.

SA'S Kopeck, Messner, and Motte returned to GURION'S residence at approximately 12:15 PM. GURION released the receipt to SA'S and made the following statements:

- 1. He met with MORRISON at his apartment and doesn't remember him at all.
- 2. He sold three firearms in the past as private sales and always through The Rocky Mountain News classified.
- 3. He did not sell MORRISON any other firearms.
- 4. He has owned many firearms in the course of his life and still has firearms in his residence for protection.
- He entered military service in the Army in 1966 and was discharged in 1966 due to his mother's terminal illness.

SA'S Kopeck and Messner were unable to locate the purchaser's of the remaining firearms. At approximately 7:00 PM SA Kopeck received a phone call from GURION regarding the sale of the firearm. GURION stated he believed he sold the firearm to MORRISON in between May 2002 and October 2002.



On September 27, 2006, ATF Special Agents (SA) Brad Beyersdorf and Shane Messner interviewed Latter the Platte Canyon Middle School in regards to the hostage/shooting incident at Platte Canyon High School. was a student inside the classroom when Duane MORRISON entered it and took the students hostage. Alives at the platter of the p
- Mike Whittman (DOB: 04/06/1947) accompanied during the interview. Mr. Whittman is a school psychologist for the Platt Canyon School District. Mr. Whittman's mailing address is P.O. Box 1681, Idaho Springs, 80452, and can be reached at (303) 567-4119 (home) or (720) 260-7657 (cell).
- 4. At around 11:30 to 11:45 am., a scruffy-looking man (later identified as Duane MORRISON), entered the classroom of Ms. Smith, who taught the English class. The classroom was Room 206. Ms. Smith was handing out worksheets when MORRISON entered the room. Ms. Smith confronted MORRISON right away and then he pulled out a handgun from his jacket.
- 5. MORRISON was described as the following: older than 35 years-of-age, between 5'11" and 6'0", scruffy, not shaven, wearing a blue hoody, shorter hair which was either brown or black, and wearing a backpack.
- 6. MORRISON laid the backpack down on a table. After a brief argument between MORRISON and Ms. Smith, he forced her to the blackboard after he turned off the lights in the classroom. MORRISON told the students in the classroom to move to the blackboard, which all the students did:

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Most of the students initially thought MORRISON was a parent when he entered the classroom. The gun that MORRISON possessed looked like a .45 caliber handgun and was black, but was unsure exactly what type it was. The handgun looked like a "James Bond" type of gun. MORRISON waved the handgun around and was not necessarily pointing it directly at the students. MORRISON did not say anything about the backpack. The backpack was described as a small, camel-bak type of backpack and was either camouflage or a faded beige color. - 1. On Wednesday September 27, 2006 Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) Special Agent (SA) Darren Kennedy and SA Mark Feltz interviewed. , a student at Platte Valley High School in Bailey, CO. Iwas one of the students initially taken hostage by Duane MORRISON on the morning of September 27, 2006. The interview was done at approximately 3:40PM in the administration building which houses the gymnasium, east of the building the hostages were being held.
- 2. The agents asked: if he needed anything, made sure he had an opportunity to call his parents, and offered him food and water. stated he had already called home, accepted a bottle of water, and said he was ready to speak with the agents about the events of that morning.

provided the following information:

- a. While preparing to write an essay in Miss Smith's College Prep I English class in room 214, a man, later identified as Duane MORRISON, came to the door of the classroom dressed in a "robin's egg blue," "hoody" sweatshirt, and jeans. The hood was up when MORRISON first came into the classroom, and later he took it down. There were no distinguishing marks, such as writing or symbols on the sweatshirt.
- b. MORRISON was wearing a "moderate size" backpack, which thought was a little smaller than some students might use. The backpack was "light colored," but could not remember exactly what color, or if it had any distinguishing features. hought MORRISON were the backpack the entire time, but was not sure.
- c. MORRISON had short hair, approximately ½" to an 1" long, which described as "black and white, like a skunk," and later said he meant it was "salt and pepper." MORRISON's skin was tan, and "wrinkled and worn." MORRISON had no facial hair, and said MORRISON was a little shorter than "tall, so he estimated MORRISON to be just a little under 6' tall, and about 175

Witness interviews of Duane MORRISON's relatives; Gary Morrison, Lisa Morrison, and Eric Morrison.

NARRATIVE:

- 1. On Wednesday September 27, 2006 Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) Special Agent (SA) Jeff Russell, SA Levi Desrosier, SA Mark Feltz of the Denver Group I Office, along with Resident Agent in Charge (RAC) Ken Coffee of the Cheyenne Field Office, contacted Gary Morrison, the brother of Duane MORRISON, at his residence, 5271 Yampa St, Aurora, CO. Gary Morrison's wife Lisa, and (LNU) were also present.
- 2. At approximately 9:45 PM the agents made contact with identified themselves, and asked to speak with Gary Morrison. woke up his and everyone sat in the living room of the Morrison residence to talk. SA Russell informed the Morrison family Duane MORRISON had died earlier that day, and explained MORRISON had died after taking hostages at a high school in Bailey, CO. The family members immediately expressed shock and grief, and their first questions were concerns about the victims of the incident. SA Russell explained one of the hostages was killed.
- 3. The family described MORRISON as a "loner," who loved the outdoors, and spent most of his time hunting, fishing, camping and "four wheeling." Because MORRISON was an avid hunter he had several guns, although Morrison stated when a last saw MORRISON in June, MORRISON had "gotten rid of most of his guns." I stated when they went fishing together in June of 2006 Duane MORRISON only had three guns, one of which was a Glock pistol, and could not remember anything about the other two guns.
- 4. MORRISON had briefly stayed at Gary and Lisa Morrison's home in June of 2006, while Gary and Lisa were on vacation in Tahiti. They trusted MORRISON and felt it would be good to have an adult in the home with Eric who was only 20 years old. Eric stated during this time MORRISON helped with chores around the house, and it was during this time that Eric and MORRISON last went fishing near Bailey, CO at Jefferson Lake.
- 5. After staying at Gary Morrison's home, in June 2006, the last known residence for MORRISON was a "hotel on west Colfax," but the family thought he had last been at the hotel in June or July of 2006, and believed he



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was most likely living in his jeep, which they described as a "Gold Jeep Rubicon." Prior to his brief stay at Gary Morrison's home MORRISON had lived at an apartment on South Birch Street in Denver, CO, but MORRISON had moved out of the apartment in January 2006. The family knew MORRISON had left because he had phoned a nephew, James Edward King III (aka Jimmy) to say he had packed everything he needed into his Jeep, and Jimmy could take anything Jimmy wanted out of the apartment.

- 6. Gary and Lisa Morrison stated the only recent traumatic event in Duane MORRISON's life was a "falling out" with a brother in law with whom MORRISON had a business partnership. Duane MORRISON, and Dale Ervin, who is married to MORRISON'sister Judy Ervin (Nee: Morrison), and Dale Ervin's son Dale Ervin Junior (aka DJ), were all equal partners in a haunted house business. The three ran "Primitive Fear" each year at the Mile High Events Center, in Commerce City, CO.
- 7. The partners had been doing business for approximately 9 years, and usually prepared the haunted house beginning in early September and would open to the public the first weekend in October. The haunted house would stay open through Halloween, and then they would spend a week or two taking it down. Gary didn't know the financial details, but stated Duane MORRISON made enough money in from the business to live the rest of the year, and guessed that the last year Duane MORRISON made approximately \$45,000 to \$50,000 dollars.
- 8. During the 2005 Halloween season, Duane MORRISON had a "falling out" with Dale Ervin, and DJ Ervin. An argument had started over being ready to open the house on time, and Duane MORRISON had shut off all the lights to building. Another of Dale Ervin's sons, Stephen Ervin, was working that night and out of anger punched a steel beam, breaking his hand. Dale Ervin blamed MORRISON for the injury, and the relationship between the business partners began to deteriorate quickly.
- Following the Halloween season, Dale Ervin, DJ Ervin, and Duane MORRISON also started a business to sell 5000 Christmas trees at three locations around Aurora. The business was not successful, and the partners did not even make enough money to cover their costs. This caused further problems between the business partners.
 - 10. Duane MORRISON wanted to leave the business partnership, and complained that Dale Ervin would not pay MORRISON for his share of the business. Gary described the business agreement as a family agreement, and did not think anything had been established in writing. By January of 2006 Duane MORRISON was extremely upset over the business dealings, and it became a major problem in his life.
- 11. Gary Morrison repeatedly stated the events surrounding the business hurt Duane MORRISON very badly. He also noted the haunted house would have it's opening weekend on Friday September 29, 2006, and this may have been causing MORRISON stress.
- 12. Gary Morrison said Duane MORRISON felt cheated by Dale Ervin, and Gary did not know all the details, but Gary also thought Dale had not been fair to MORRISON. Also, their sister Judy, Dale's wife, had told Gary that Dale had not been fair to MORRISON about the business.
- 13. The Morrison family was asked to describe Duane MORRISON's personal history and relationships, and provided the following information:
 - a. The childhood for Duane, Judy, and Gary Morrison had been "hellacious."
 - b. Their father was in the military, and their parents split up when they were all still children.

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- d. Lela Boots died a few years later from cancer, but Duane and Judy were close to her children, Marley Boots and a son whose name Gary Morrison could not remember, but he thought might be "Richard."
- e. Duane MORRISON joined the Navy around 1973, but spent less than 6 months in the military. MORRISON briefly went "AWOL" after basic training, but returned to duty on his own. He was discharged from the Navy approximately one month after the AWOL incident.
- f. MORRISON never had steady employment. He mostly worked with or for family members. Most of the work was seasonal, such as the haunted house business in the fall, or a deck building in the spring or summer. MORRISON enjoyed this because that gave him time for his outdoor activities.
- g. MORRISON's longest "regular job" was working for Dale Ervin, when Ervin owned some AAMOCO stores. Lisa Morrison stated this was only about 6 months, and she had never known MORRISON to stay with any one job for more than a few months.
- h. Prior to entering into the partnership to run the haunted house MORRISON had been in a serious auto accident while driving with a high school friend, Dennis Murra. Gary Morrison believes MORRISON was receiving some sort of disability pay because of the accident.
- i. MORRISON was not close to anyone, family or friends. He kept to himself, and Gary said they were, "lucky to hear from him once very 30 to 45 days." MORRISON's nephews; Eric Morrison, DJ Ervin, Stephen Ervin, and James King III, were his closest friends.
- j. In the 1980s Duane MORRISON had been married for less than a year, and Gary Morrison did not know who MORRISON had married, or why they divorced.
- k. MORRISON had dated a girl named Denise (LNU), a few years prior. Denise occasionally worked at the haunted house, and Gary Morrison thinks Dale Irvin may be able to provide additional information about Denise. Gary and Lisa Morrison thought MORRISON may have met Denise at the apartment complex he lived at on Birch Street in Denver.
- 1. When MORRISON would be out of contact for long periods of time Gary Morrison usually assumed MORRISON was in Sacramento. Gary Morrison was not sure who MORRISON would see in Sacramento, or where he would stay, but knew MORRISON had been close to Lela Boots' children.
- m. MORRISON had gone camping in Utah, and in the "Sand Dunes" recently. He had only talked with Gary Morrison two times since he had stayed at Gary Morrison's house in June. MORRISON would initiate contact with Gary by telephone. Gary and Lisa Morrison did not have a phone number where they could call MORRISON.
- n. Lisa Morrison had tried to teach Duane MORRISON how to use email, and Gary Morrison had given MORRISON a computer as a gift about two to three years ago. Despite Gary and Lisa Morrison's efforts Duane MORRISON did not use email.


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o. MORRISON had no training or experience with explosives.

- 14. None of the Morrison family could think of any connection Duane MORRISON had to Bailey, CO, or the Platte Valley High School, other than MORRISON's fishing trips to Jefferson Lake.
- 15. The Morrison's did not know anyone named "John Keyes" and did not know anyone named "Emily."

- 17. MORRISON had not phoned, or sent any letters to, Gary Morrison's home recently. SA Russell asked the Morrison's if any letters or packages arrived in the mail for Gary to contact one of the agents right away. Gary Morrison assured SA Russell if any letters arrived he would not open the letter and contact ATF right away. SA Feltz gave both Lisa and Gary Morrison a business card, and SA Russell wrote his contact information on the back of the cards.
- 18. Throughout the interview the Morrison's expressed their concern for the victims in this incident, especially the deceased victim. The Morrison's were cooperative and expressed their willingness to assist in any way to discover why MORRISON had committed these crimes.
- 19. The agents offered their assistance in notifying other family members about MORRISON's death, but it was discovered other law enforcement personnel had already located and began notifying other family members.

 The agents thanked the Morrison's for their assistance, and expressed their sympathies before leaving the home.
- 20. The interview ended at approximately 11:15 PM, September 27, 2006.

Interviews at the Mallory Manor Motel.

NARRATIVE:

- 1. On 09/28/2006, ATF Special Agents (SA) James D. Kennedy, Mark Feltz, Chris Amon, and David Tabullo responded to the Mallory Manor Motel, located at 9600 W. Colfax Ave, Lakewood, Colorado 80215, phone number (303) 237-8866. Agents had received information indicating that Duane MORRISON had been staying at the motel prior to the incident at Platte Canyon High School.
- 2. Upon arrival at the motel, Agents met with the manager who related that MORRISON had been staying in room #10, but that the room had been cleaned by the housekeepers and all of the personal items had been placed in a storage closet nearby. While waiting for CBI to respond to the motel, Agents interviewed some of the tenants nearby. Agents had a copy of MORRISON'S driver's license photo to show the tenants.
- 3. At approximately 4:06 pm, SA Kennedy interviewed Julie Guthrie (DOB: 01/25/1956) and Howard Schaefer DOB: 06/24/1952) who are common law husband and wife staying in room #5. Guthrie stated that they had been ving in room #5 for the past 3 weeks, but had lived in room #14 for 3-4 months prior. Guthrie was shown a photo of MORRISON and positively identified him, and stated that she also recognized him from watching the news. Guthrie said that she had first met MORRISON about 3-4 months ago, and that he used to stay in room #15, before moving to room #10 about a month prior. Guthrie and Schaefer described MORRISON as a loner and said that he was quiet and always kept to himself. Guthrie never saw MORRISON with anyone else. Guthrie and Schaefer would talk to MORRISON from time to time, but it was only small talk. Guthrie said that MORRISON liked hunting and camping. Guthrie also recognized MORRISON'S jeep from watching the news and said that MORRISON always kept it very clean, except for about 3 or 4 days ago when it was filthy like he had been offroading.
- 4. At approximately 4:18 pm, SA Kennedy and SA Amon interviewed Davy Jones (DOB: 01/13/1958) who was staying in room #12. Jones did not recognize the photo of MORRISON, but remembered seeing the gold jeep.

SA Amon interviewed Darby Griffin (DOB: 09/18/1959) who was staying room #26, and is friends with Beesley (room #7) and her husband Mike Conroy (DOB: 01/31/1978), who was not available for interview. Griffin positively identified the photograph of MORRISON. Griffin stated that approximately a week prior, he saw MORRISON leave his room carrying a hunting rifle in his right hand and two pistols in his waistband. Griffin lescribed one of the pistols as a revolver and the other as a black semi-automatic handgun. Griffin stated that when asked MORRISON what he was doing, MORRISON stated that he was going target shooting.
- 10. At approximately 6:06 pm, SA Kennedy interviewed Brian North (DOB: 09/03/1950) who was staying in room #15. North had been staying at the motel for 9 days and did not recognize the photo of MORRISON or have any information about him.

- 5. MORRISON continued to bring in his motorcycle for service until March 2003. The final contact was in January 2004 following the harassment complaint filed by the Rocky Mountain Harley Davidson Motor Company in Littleton, CO.

Mr. Seibel advised agents that during an all staff meeting the following day he would canvass the staff and see if any correlation existed.

Linda said that Duane had some bad feelings about his previous customer service experience with the W. County Line store and did not want to receive any mailings from them. Linda also informed me that Duane was calling the corporate headquarters in Milwaukee, WI.

I asked Linda if she could transfer Duane's voicemail onto a tape that I could collect as evidence. Linda said that she could. I also asked Linda to obtain a list of all of the RMHD employees who had been harassed by Duane. Linda said that she would also do this. I told Linda to telephone me back at the department when she obtained all of this information and that I would meet with her at RMHD to further discuss the charges that she wanted to pursue against Duane.

At approximately 1330 hours, Linda called back to the department so that we could meet to discuss the harassment charges. Ofc. Jones was dispatched to RMHD to collect the information that Linda had gathered. Ofc. Jones obtained written statements from Linda More, Thomas Floyd Tennant, DOB C81560, and Edward James Seibel, DOB 050769, regarding the continued harassment that they have received from Duane. Ofc. Jones also collected a taped recording of the voicemail left by Duane on 112204. I arrived on scene at approximately 1400 hours. Linda allowed me to listen to the original voicemail message from Duane. I heard Duane clearly identify himself at the beginning of the message. I also heard several profamities and a mention of appearing at the store with an assault rifle to take care of the problem.

Due to previous harassing telephone calls from Duane and the mention of an assault rifle in his 112204 voicemail message, I appeared at the Littleton Municipal Courthouse at 1430 hours to obtain a warrant for Duane Morrison. I also issued a citation for harassment (to be served to Duane Morrison) (M345249).

27/06, ATF explosive detection canine "Ostermann" and Special Agent Canine Handler D. Lambert initiated a search of several back packs located around the exterior of Platte Canyon High School. No significant alerts or recoveries were made.

At approximately 05:45 PM, Ostermann alerted on an ammunition can located inside the high school gymnasium. X-Ray analysis and investigation by Jefferson County Bomb Squad personnel determined that the can was not an improvised explosive device. It is speculated that the canine alert may have been caused by trace amounts of smokeless powder from the ammunition once stored in the can. At approximately 06:45 PM, Ostermann searched the exterior of a Jeep Rubicon, gold in color, identified by CO plate #529IKL. Registration records indicated that this vehicle belonged to suspect, Duane MORRISON. No significant alerts or recoveries were made.

On 9/28/06, ATF explosive detection canine "Ostermann" and Special Agent Canine Handler D. Lambert initiated a search of approximately 150 vehicles parked outside the high school. No significant alerts or recoveries were made.
