On September 27, 2006, I was at the Bailey substation waiting for a victim to arrive at the substation so I could interview her. I came downstairs from the DHS office and heard Sgt. Hardey yell there was a man with a gun at Platte Canyon High School. I thought I heard Communications say there was a student in the school with a gun. I ran out the back door and got my bulletproof vest out and my AR rifle out of the back of my patrol car. I drove emergent to the school. There were several deputies in the substation that morning. I was the last one to leave the parking lot because I had to get my vest and gun. As I was driving to the school I heard a deputy ask me if I could turn around and get the shield. I turned around and went back to the Bailey substation to get the ballistic shield. When I arrived at the substation Animal Control Officer Purcell told me Animal Control Officer Matthew Sexton, another Animal Control Officer, had taken the shield up to the school. I passed Officer Sexton as I went back to the substation but didn't know he had the shield. I got the shield from Officer Sexton. After I left Officer Sexton, I remembered I didn't have my pack set so I radioed from my patrol car that I needed his pack set. I went inside the school up the stairs and knocked on the door announcing 111 (my radio number) was at the door with the shield. I didn't get a response. Officer Sexton arrived with his pack set and I radioed to the deputies inside I was outside the hall door with the shield. Sgt. Hardey opened the door and I gave the shield to somebody; I don't remember who took the shield from me. I went into the hallway of the classroom and heard Lt. Hancock asking the suspect what he wanted. I was not in a position to hear a response from the suspect. I went outside in the hallway and guarded the next door down from room 206. I thought in my mind I knew the classroom the suspect was in and thought the door I was guarding could be an exit for him. I took a position iust down from the door in an entryway to room 208. This provided me cover in case the suspect came out that Joor. Sgt. Hardey had taken a position opposite of me. Shortly thereafter, Deputy Brigham arrived and moved to a position across from the door I was guarding. Sgt. Hardey left and returned with Sheriff Wegener and they started to evacuate students from the room next to 206. Sgt. Hardey provided cover for the Sheriff and kids as they were being evacuated. Sheriff Wegener returned and then started to evacuate the students across the hall from room 206. They were evacuated to the west end of the hallway and down the stairs. I provided cover for the students and Sheriff as he evacuated the students.

All the students were evacuated from the upstairs classrooms. I don't know what happened downstairs. At this time I remember Sgt. Bonnelycke and Detective Morgan arriving and Sgt. Bonnelycke went to the hallway where Lt. Hancock was trying to talk to the suspect. Detective Morgan took a position in the hallway. Several more deputies arrived, Deputy Reynolds, Undersheriff Gore, Deputy Deberry and Detective Goto. Most of the responding deputies stood in the hallway providing cover and waiting for assignments. An unknown deputy took my position and I went to the hallway where I heard Sgt. Bonnelycke talking with the suspect. I heard Sgt. Bonnelycke ask the suspect to give him something to work with and that he, Sgt. Bonnelycke, wanted this to end peacefully with nobody getting hurt. This is the extent of what I heard reference the negotiations. I never heard the suspect reply. Deputy Lougheed was drawing a map of where the suspect was in the room and said I should show it to Sheriff Wegener. After Deputy Lougheed explained the map to me, I went downstairs to the main level and saw Sheriff Wegener with a Lt. From Jefferson County. Sheriff Wegener was looking at a map of the rooms hanging on the wall and I explained the map Deputy Lougheed drew to Sheriff Wegener. The Lt. from Jefferson County was getting out his incident command soft pack and dry eraser board. At this time an unknown Denver officer entered the school and said he had a child in the school what could he do to help. I

After gathering the hostages, I was met by a man identifying himself as Steve with CBI. Steve needed me to ask the Sheriff if in fact CBI was handling the investigation. I went to command and spoke with Sheriff Wegener and told him CBI needed an official request from the Park County Sheriff's Office asking for CBI's help with the investigation. Sheriff Wegener said yes we were asking for assistance from CBI. I relayed that to Steve and he immediately gathered all investigators from all responding agencies to stage in a different area for assignments. Greg Sadar with CBI was also present as well as investigators from Jefferson County, ATF, Sgt. Webb, Steve with CBI and myself. I gave these investigators a brief synopsis about how the call came in and what happened and what little information I received from some of the hostages. It was decided that the hostages needed to be interviewed in depth about what happened and Jefferson County investigators were handling that. ATF agents were going to interview the other 24 students who were in the room when the xaminations and I stated the suspect came in. Sgt. Webb asked me whom I wanted sent down for I was trying to gather a roster of the kids who were in classroom 206 and had been kicked out by the suspect as well as trying to find out where those kids were being transported for ATF's interviews of those 24 students. After that was resolved, I had received information that a female had gone to the Bailey substation and said she thought it was her ex-husband who was in the school. I did not handle that information and had received it from Jail Sgt. Monica Jones. All I can remember was the Later I was told that the suspect last name was wasn't hd he had been found in Arizona.

had no concept of time as the day unfolded. At one point, ATF agent Becca Sauerhaft asked me if I wanted to run my bomb dog Cay because we had not located the suspect vehicle and there was the threat of explosives. The entire parking lot and vehicles needed to be searched. I told Becca I didn't feel comfortable working Cay because he hadn't trained in over a month due to his injury and surgery and I just didn't have time to run him because I was helping other agencies. Becca said that was fine and another ATF agent was there with his bomb dog and Becca said they would take care of clearing the cars in the parking lot. At some point during this afternoon, I heard Emily had text messaged her father saying I love you guys and was told the message was sent at 1:50 pm.

Everybody had their respective assignments and I was getting ready to go over to the district offices to start watching camera video to see if we could see the suspect enter the parking lot. As I was preparing to walk over to the offices I heard an explosion from inside the school and knew the SWAT team was making entry. The entire command center at the football field fell silent. Then I heard over the radio the request for an ambulance. Becca found me and told me she and ATF agent Larry Krisl were with Emily's father at the end of the bleachers on the football field. I told her I didn't know the status of anything right now. Then I heard another call for the ambulance, the ambulance couldn't get there fast enough, and the suspect was deceased. I knew then one of the hostages had been injured. I knew from the day's events there were two female hostages left. Somewhere I heard the hostage that was injured was breathing. I heard from somewhere the other hostage had gotten out and found it was

I called the Bailey substation looking for Victim Advocate Director Mary Pat Bowen to tell her I had John Michael Keyes at the football field. Mary Pat told me she had Emily Keyes' mother at the substation. I saw a female deputy with Jefferson County in her patrol car on the football field and saw she had John Michael Keyes in her car. I contacted this female deputy and told her Mrs. Keyes was at the Bailey substation and could she stop at the substation to pick up Mrs. Keyes. While talking with Sgt. Bonnelycke and Becca, information was aired over the radio that a parent was receiving text messages from his son stating they were still inside the school in the library. At this time, incident command had broken down and officers inside were still calling command. Lt. Muldoon and I started answering the calls for command from the officers inside. Lt. Hancock was still upstairs maintaining the crime scene and asked for two teams to come into the school and check the library. I saw some Jefferson County officers (they looked like the bomb squad) and said we still had kids inside and could they go in and assist with clearing the library. They suited back up and went into the school. Lt. Hancock assigned the crime scene over to another deputy and said he would go down to the library and check. Lt. Hancock advised there were four students and three teachers or four teachers and three students in the library. The students and teachers were escorted out of the school. I do not know where they went from there. At this time, the school was checked again starting from the Middle School and working there way towards the High School to make sure no kids were left and to check again for anything. While PCSO deputies and Jefferson County personnel were checking, PCSO team found a pair of men's adult clothes in a closet in room 10 of the Middle School. The clothes looked suspicious and were out of place according to the deputies. As they continued to search a green ammunition can was found somewhere in the high school. I can't remember where they said it was and I never found out where it was for sure. The deputies were asking for the bomb squad to come back into the school and check the can. It was out of place being somewhere in the middle of a floor. I found the Jefferson County man in charge of the bomb squad (I met him earlier but have no idea what his name was) and told him about the green ammunition can found by one of the search teams. Eventually the bomb squad found the can and had taken X-rays to determine what was inside.

Lt. Hancock came out of the school with the student and teachers and I could tell he was very distraught over what happened with a hostage being shot. Lt. Hancock was blaming himself saying he didn't do enough to

protect the kids in the school. I told him he did a great job and everything that could be done was done. There was nothing anybody could have done any different and reiterated we only lost one student and we could have lost six, the first hostages, or the 30 kids that were in the classroom or the entire school if the suspect really had a bomb. I tried to make Lt. Hancock understand he did the best he could.

Lt. Hancock was made to take over incident command per the Undersheriff and I saw he was in no condition to do so and told Lt. Hancock I would take over incident command. (The sheriff and undersheriff had responded to the Bailey substation.) There wasn't much of command left at the school and Lt. Hancock was asked to respond to the Bailey substation.

I met with CBI agent Tom Griffin, "Grif"; and he asked who was going to be lead detective on this case and I told him I was. I contacted Communications and pulled a case report number under my name, 2006-001845, and gave that number to Grif. He assembled his staff and decided who he was going to need. I told Grif about the ammunition can that was being checked out by the bomb squad and at this time the school was not safe to enter.

I found out a briefing with all the agencies was to take place at the gym at the district offices with all the agencies present. The brief was for all agencies to meet and figure out what had been done and what needed to be done. Prior to this briefing, Coroner Sharon Morris and some officer or somebody went into the school, where the shooting took place, to see if the suspect had any identification on him because we still didn't know who the suspect was. Coroner Morris retrieved a driver's license and I found out who the suspect was at the briefing.

As Grif and I were walking to the briefing I told him this wasn't like a regular call out from CBI where we assist them in processing the crime scene and take care of the rest of the investigation. This was so big with all the agencies assisting there was no way the Investigations Division of the Park County Sheriff's Office could handled the investigation. Grif asked if I met Steve Johnson with CBI and I told him I didn't think I had. When we got into the gym, Grif found Steve Johnson and introduced us. I had been working with Steve all afternoon but didn't remember his last name. I told Steve this investigation with the multiple agencies was too big to handle and I needed CBI to take over the entire investigation. That didn't seem to be a problem and might have been all ready worked out before I mentioned it to Steve.

We had the briefing and information was shared about who the suspect was and what was known about him at this time. Assignments were made with various agencies to take care of that night. One assignment in particular was a search warrant at the suspect's last known address. A team of investigators were going to take care of that but wanted a representative from Park County if one was available. I assigned Detective Goto to go with that team. District Attorney Investigator Betty Royse was going to attend both autopsies because I did not have a detective to spare to send to them. Betty was representing the Sheriff's Office as well as the District Attorney's Office. Joe Clayton with CBI was going to attend both autopsies as well to collect evidence and take photographs. I was going to assist Grif and his team with processing the crime scene. The task for CBI that

night was to collect the guns and get the information on the guns to ATF so they could start emergency traces. The other task was to remove the body. I sent Detective Morgan home to get some sleep and be ready for the next day because there was going to be another briefing at 6:30 am that morning. Detective Morgan was also on the SWAT team when entry was made and I felt he needed the break from the day's events. During this briefing, I learned the suspect had filed a stolen gun report in Park County in 1999. I told Greg Sadar we would look for that report. That night I asked Reserve Deputy Q. Connell to check Atims for the report and if it wasn't in the computer he would have to go over to the courthouse and check the archived reports. Per Reserve Deputy Connell, the report was retrieved on Thursday and turned into CBI Agent Sadar

That night and the next day I assisted CBI with processing the crime scene. Refer to Detective Morgan and Goto's reports for what they did following the day's events.

On Thursday evening as CBI was almost done processing the classroom, Detective Goto and I went to the Middle School, room 10, to collect the adult male clothes that were in the closet. The clothes did seem out of place as the classroom seemed to be an art room. We collected the clothes and photographed them via video. I showed the clothes to Grif and it was decided we, the Sheriff's Office, would maintain custody of the clothes because there was a chance they could be from the teacher of that classroom. Detective Goto and I were going to try and find the teacher on Friday to see if they were his clothes. Detective Goto maintained custody of the clothes until late Friday when we could not find the teacher to verify. The clothes were turned over to CBI on Friday.

On Friday CBI Agent Ron Ardnt, Agent Joe Clayton and I finished the last minute details of the crime scene. There were several things that came up such as a student seeing the suspect in green raincoat type jacket just prior to entering the classroom. We searched for a green jacket in the vicinity and could not find one. The sand bags outside the classroom and down the hall were confiscated because it was confirmed they were not part of the Jefferson County Bomb Squad and it was believed the suspect had planted those to make law enforcement think he had a bomb. Finally late Friday afternoon CBI released the crime scene portion of the school.

At approximately 3:25 pm, I received a page from Communications advising a female in Aurora was receiving disturbing emails reference the school. I was unable to call Communications until 6:30 pm that night to get the information. A female identified as Gloria Poole at 720-949-0957 called to say she received some disturbing emails reference the shooting at Platte Canyon High School. I called Gloria back and asked what she received. Gloria first of all didn't know how she got the emails and had all ready forwarded them to Sheriff Wegener and the FBI. As mentioned earlier, the emails had contents reference the school shooting but she didn't give me specifics. I told her I couldn't do anything at this time since I did not have access to the emails and would need to get them from Sheriff Wegener. Gloria was concerned and wanted us to know. I told her I would follow up with Sheriff Wegener and call her back if I needed any further information from her. I told Detective Goto about the emails Gloria received and Detective Goto started asking me questions about the addresses and where they came from. I told him I did not get that information and Detective Goto called Gloria back and spoke with her reference the emails. Detective Goto told me after he talked with Gloria that he asked her to send the emails

to his email address. Detective Goto followed up with the emails from Gloria. Refer to his report for further information.

That evening I received a page from Communications asking me to contact Rob Henry at 719-836-3639 who was the teacher at the Middle School. I called Rob that evening at 6:25 pm. Rob told me he is the teacher at Fitzsimons Middle School room 10. He also told me the clothes in the closet were his and he is the cross-country track coach. Rob said he changed from his work clothes into his coaching clothes. I asked Rob if he could describe his clothes. Rob stated he had a pair of khaki pants, a button down shirt but couldn't remember what the colors of the shirt were and a pair of brown leather shoes. The clothes Rob described matched what Detective Goto and I retrieved. I confirmed they were his clothes. I told Rob the clothes were currently in the custody of CBI and I would notify CBI and tell them I confirmed the clothes were his and we would try to get them back to him as soon as possible. Rob apologized for leaving his clothes and causing us concern. I told him I was glad to know they were his and not the suspects. I got Rob's basic information such as: date of birth 2-9-73, he lives at 163 Deadman End in Jefferson, Colorado and his home phone is 719-836-3639. I thanked Rob for his call back.

During the days after the shooting, CBI processed a crime scene down the road at mm 220 on Hwy 285 where it was believed the suspect had camped prior to taking the school hostage. A gun was found at that campsite believed to be the suspect's. The next day another gun was found at the same campsite. CBI investigators andled the scene.

On Saturday September 30th, I attended the memorial service for Emily Keyes. After the service I was on my way home when I received voicemail message from ATF Agent Larry Krisl stating he'd spoken to Sheriff Wegener at the memorial service and learned that a third gun was found at Ben Tyler trailhead. Larry asked if I knew anything about the gun. I turned around and headed back towards the school. I contacted Communications and asked what they knew about another gun being found. Communications advised a hiker found a gun on the Ben Tyler trail and CBI had been notified and were actually processing the crime scene. I was told I could contact Jefferson County unit 141 for further details. I contacted Jeffco 141 and met him. He told me basically what Communications told me. In the meantime I contacted Larry with ATF and we met at the high school. I told Larry what I knew at this point. We drove to Ben Tyler trailhead but did not see any CBI agents. Larry contacted CBI headquarters and asked Agent Steve Johnson to contact him when the agents on scene got back to Denver so Larry could get the information on the gun and start an emergency trace. After that was resolved I went home.

I did not work on Sunday.

On Monday October 2nd, I met with Detectives Morgan and Goto. At this point we didn't have an active role in the investigation of the school shooting so we started working on the Swat call out case we had Monday night at 475 Chickadee.

While working on the other case, at 7:30 pm, I received a page from Communications advising the Keyes family received a "sus letter" and the Sheriff was being notified. I called Communications to ask them about the page and whomever I talked to in Communications said to me they believed the Keyes family received a letter from the suspect in the Lancaster County School shooting in Pennsylvania. I finished the interview I was doing at the Bailey substation and met with Sgt. Hardey. Sgt. Hardey and I responded to the Keyes' residence to see what they had received. The family had opened the letter they received with a return address from Lancaster, Pennsylvania, read it and then put it in a plastic zip lock bag. They also received two other letters from two different towns in Pennsylvania but had not opened them. The two letters were put in a separate plastic zip lock bag. The Keyes' family indicated if the letters did not turn out to be anything they would like them back so they could send a thank you note.

I took the letters back to the substation and read the contents. The letter with the Lancaster address was from a male identifying himself via letterhead and return address label as Mr. Russell E. Landau 1917 Oregon Pike Apt. C5 Lancaster, PA 17601-6452. The letterhead caption was the same as the return address label with the exception of the middle initial E. and the last four of the zip code. The letter was dated September 29, 2006. The first page of the letter stated his condolences for the loss of Emily. Landau also said he was 36 years old and worked for the Postal Service. He included a "goal poem" and other poems for luck and support. Mr. Landau said he lived in Colorado from 1978-1981. The second page of the letter contained a Best of Luck on Your Goals with a poem underneath. Then Landau referenced a man Keith Stevens Memory Paper and talked bout Mr. Stevens dying in a car crash. Landau referenced living in Boulder and attending school in Boulder, Colorado from 1978-1979. Landau also referenced Jon Benet Ramsey Memory Paper titled Here Yesterday Gone Today. On the third page Landau spoke about his favorite teacher's aide and a friendship they shared. Landau continued with other poems. After I read the letter the contents seemed weird and somewhat out of the ordinary. I logged onto the Internet to see if a suspect had been named in the Lancaster County School Shooting. The suspect had been named and it was not Mr. Landau. I logged onto the Law Enforcement website Accurint to see if I could obtain a date of birth for Russell Landau. I obtained a social security number

, a date of birth of and a telephone number of 717-519-0235. I contacted Communications and asked if they could run a nation wide criminal history on Russell E. Landau. I also asked for a telephone number for Lancaster County Sheriff's Office. Communications advised they could not find any criminal history on Russell E. Landau and provided me a telephone number for Lancaster County as 717-664-1180. I contacted Lancaster County telling them who I was and what I was investigating. The dispatcher said she would have an officer contact me. After a short time, I received a phone call from Officer Dierwechter with Lancaster Police. He told me Lancaster is small and he is an officer for Lancaster. Officer Dierwechter looked up in their computer records the information I provided them on Russell E. Landau. The only contact with Landau was he was involved in an accident, was a key holder for some alarms and a 911 hang up. Officer Deirwechter said nothing in their computer raised any red flags about Landau. I thanked him for his help and expressed our condolences on behalf of the Park County Sheriff's Office for the school shooting they were experiencing at that time.

On Tuesday October 3rd, I contacted Boulder Police and spoke to Detective Jane Harmer. I told Detective Harmer about the letter and the reference to Keith Stevens and Jon Benet Ramsey and told her about the year Russell E. Landau said he lived in Boulder and attended school. I asked Detective Harmer if they had any contact or anything in their records reference Russell E. Landau date of birth 12-20-69. Later I received a call back from Detective Harmer saying they had not had any contact or record of Russell E. Landau.

During my investigation of this letter I notified Sheriff Wegener of what I was doing to investigate the letter from Landau. I also told Sheriff Wegener the other letters from Pennsylvania were just condolence letters and there was nothing suspicious about them.

I contacted Sgt. Hardey and told him my investigation of the Landau letter was complete. I gave all the letters we had taken from the Keyes' family Monday night back to Sgt. Hardey so he could return them to the family.

Also that afternoon I spoke with Chris Schaefer with CBI. Chris told me he was the agent in charge of the school shooting and at that time I told him about the letter and what I had done to investigate it. Chris stated he would stay in constant contact with me as the investigation progressed. I explained to him about my planned vacation and told him Detective Morgan would be the contact during my absence.

On October 4th I completed an inner office memo stating how our reports were to be written and asked the reports be completed as soon as possible and set a deadline of October 20th. Reports were to be turned into the supervisors who would collect all deputies' reports and then turn them in to me and I would forward everything to CBI. The memo went to Sheriff Wegener, Undersheriff Gore, Lt. Muldoon and Sgt.'s Hardey & Brown.

That morning I received a call from secretary Sharon Clarke from the Bailey substation. Sharon received a call from 9 News wondering why News 4 received the autopsy results on Morrison and Emily and they had not. I immediately went to the News 4 website and saw an article about the autopsy with the spokesman being Lance Clem with CBI. Sharon stated the Sheriff was upset because he was to be notified of the results and provided a copy. I called Chris Schaefer and told him about the article on the News 4 website. Chris said he would look into and call me back. Chris called back and said nobody from his office authorized any release of information reference regarding the autopsies and said he was authorized to give me Lance Clem's telephone number if Sheriff Wegener wanted to speak with Lance Clem direct. I notified Sheriff Wegener and told him what I learned from CBI. Sheriff Wegener said there was nothing in the News 4 article that he hadn't stated in a press release with the exception of the toxicology report on suspect Duane Morrison.

Late that afternoon I received a call from Chris Schaefer with CBI. He received a call from an aunt of the Keyes' family and was wanting information about the letter from Lancaster Pennsylvania. Chris asked if I could fax him a copy, which I did. I told him Sgt. Hardey told John Michael Keyes the outcome of my investigation.

On October 6th, I received a call from Chris Schafer stating the family of Duane Morrison hired an attorney and CBI was working with the attorney on interviewing family members. Chris asked if I had a tape of the 911 call

and a CAD call printout of the incident at Platte Canyon High School. I told Chris I had those items and would send them down to him with Detective Morgan as Detective Morgan was going to CBI that afternoon.

Sometime during the week I spoke with Grif at CBI. I told Grif I had spoken to the teacher of the Middle School room 10 and had confirmed the clothes in the closet were the teacher's. Grif said he would release the clothes to us and they would not be considered evidence. Grif also said he was going to send back a pair of sunglasses that were found in a room adjacent to room 206. They were not of evidentiary value.

On October 7th I received a call from Dana in Communications. Dana wanted to tell me about some information a friend of hers overheard at the Loaf and Jug in Bailey. There were four boys at the Loaf and Jug the night before, October 6th approximately between 7:00 and 8:00 pm. Dana's friend overheard the boys talking about Emily Keyes and saying she was having computer sex with the suspect, Duane Morrison. I called Chris Schaefer with CBI and told him about this information. Chris told me he had all ready spoken to the Keves family about Emily's computer. Chris was aware of Emily possibly logging onto myspace.com and was working on that. Chris also told me thus far there was no indication at this time the suspect even knew how to use a computer.

On October 10th, I received a call from Chris Schaefer. Chris asked me what I knew about David Shaffer and a possible relationship with suspect Duane Morrison. I told Chris about a page I received from Communications Thursday morning September 28th, stating Deputy Brigham was at Platte Canyon Storage with some clothes he thought was related to the David Shaffer case. I told Communications I was not aware of what Shaffer's case was except what I had read in the newspaper. Deputy Brigham wanted a detective to respond to his location and look at the clothing. I told Communications I would get with Detective Goto because he was more familiar with the case than me and stated Deputy Brigham's situation was not a priority today. I met with Detective Goto and asked him to look at the items Deputy Brigham found. At some point during this time, Deputy Hannigan responded to Deputy Brigham's location and relieved him. For some unknown reason, Deputy Hannigan thought the clothes were associated with Duane Morrison and the campsite at mile marker 220. Chris asked if I could respond to the jail and meet with David Shaffer to see if he knew Duane Morrison or ever shared a hotel room with Morrison. I told Chris I would meet with Shaffer at the jail and find out what he knew. I responded to the jail and met with David Shaffer. I showed Shaffer a picture of Morrison and asked Shaffer if he knew Morrison. Shaffer said he did not know Morrison stating Morrison looked familiar to somebody he met over 10 years ago. Shaffer said the only thing he knew about Morrison is what he had seen on the news and said he was in jail the day of the shooting. I confirmed with Corporal Theobald from the jail that David Shaffer was in jail the day of the shooting and wasn't released until September 28th. I called Chris Schaefer back and told him what Shaffer told me. Chris was satisfied that David Shaffer had no connection to Morrison and Chris would not need to respond to the Park County Jail to interview Shaffer.

I have done nothing further in this case at this time. I have coordinated with both district Sergeants and all parties involved to get me their reports reference their involvement with the Platte Canyon School shooting. When the reports are done they will be turned into me and I will get them to CBI.

On September 27, 2006 at approximately 11:40am, I was advised by communications that there was a man with a gun in the Platte Canyon High School.

I arrived on-scene at Fitzsimons Middle School at approximately 12:15pm. Master Sergeant Brown, Corporal Wood and I cleared the Fitzsimons Middle School and made sure that all of the children were out of the building. We then moved into the Platte Canyon High School.

I went into the High School and went up the stairs leading to the upper level. I was met by two children running down the stairs. I grabbed them and assisted them out of the building. I then proceeded back up the stairs and assisted other deputies who were already on-scene. Deputies' on-scene had already cornered the suspect in a classroom with some hostages. I was originally told that there were five hostages in the room with the suspect. A few minutes went by before the suspect released his first hostage. I escorted the female hostage down to the command post so that she could be interviewed.

Approximately 30 minutes later, a second female hostage was released and I again escorted her down to the command post so that she could be interviewed. I then returned to the classroom were the other hostages were being held.

Over the next few hours I escorted two other female hostages out of the building as the suspect was releasing them. One of the female hostages stated to me that the girls inside of the classroom were being sexually molested. The fourth released hostage confirmed to me that there were now two female hostages left in the classroom with the suspect.

At approximately 3:30pm, I was staged up near the classroom were the suspect and hostages were located. At this time I witnessed a loud explosion coming from the classroom were the hostages were located.

I have no further information to report at this time. See "CBI" reports for further information.

On September 27, 2006 at approximately 11:43 AM I was advised by Communications of a male party in the Platte Canyon High School with a gun. We were advised that the male party walked into the School with a back pack carrying enough explosives to blow up the School. One round has been shot so far in room 206. I advised Communications that I would have Reserve Deputy Wheat on board with me and en route to Platte Canyon High School from the Fairplay area.

Upon arrival I assembled a four-man active shooter team at the south end of Fitzsimmons Middle School. We entered the building and went towards the threat. The threat was to be in room 206. This is located in the High School on the top floor. We advanced forward to that area clearing rooms and hallways on the way.

Upon arriving at room 206, I got behind Sergeant Detective Bonnelycke who was negotiating with the suspect through the door. I advised Bonnelycke that I had a key to the room. Other Officer's lined up on me. We waited and negotiated with the suspect for several hours. Bonnelycke was able to get five girls out of the room. As the girls came out they were saying that the suspect was sexually assaulting them. We continued to negotiate.

Once Jefferson County S.W.A.T. arrived on scene, they took over negotiation and overseeing operations on the room. During this time the suspect would no longer talk to the Officers. The two remaining girls would talk for him. During this time no more female parties were released. When asked if they were going to come out, the girls would continue to say it would be a little while, or any time now. This went on for another two hours. The girls finally said it would be over at 4:00 PM. This alerted the Officers on scene. Based on the time line and the threats involved a decision was made to make entry into the room in an attempt to get the remaining two girls out of the room and take the suspect into custody. Jefferson County S.W.A.T. led the team. The Door was breached (See CBI reports).

On September 27, 2006 at approximately 11:45am I was monitoring the Park County Dispatch via Radio and heard that there were shots fired at the Platte Canyon High School. I immediately went en-route from Fairplay. While en-route I monitored the radio traffic from Deputies that were on-scene and was given a description of a suspect and room number 206 located in the English department area of the high school. I was advised that the suspect had a backpack that was to have explosive in it.

As I arrived I was advised there was a need for deputies to go to the Middle School and assist with evacuations. I drove up the south doors of the Fitzsimmons Middle School. At the School I was let in and met with Cpl. Jeff Wood. I was advised to bring the students out to the south doors for evacuation. I had obtained a key from an administrator of the Fitzsimmons Middles School. I along with other Deputies evacuated the Middle School. I went through the Canyon room and cleared the lunchroom along with Cpl. Wood. I entered the High School through the north doors and met up with Mike Schmidt a coach for the Platte Canyon School. I noticed evacuations were in progress of the lower floor of the high school. I cleared several classrooms from the south to the north on lower level.

I met with the Principal Bryan [unk last name] who was on the telephone with Park County Dispatch. I spoke with Commissioner J. Tighe. After I spoke with Tighe, Bryan needed to go to the administration building to try to get the phone to work in room 206. I met with Sheriff Wegener on the lower level near the north doors.

I observed Jefferson County Deputies that started to arrive. I met with Detective Franck, Sheriff Wegener and members of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. During this time two female hostages were released and were spoken to with members of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. The Incident Command Post was moved and located to the football field.

I escorted a Jefferson County SWAT member to the upper level of the school. I assisted with radio communications and observed Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke negotiate with the suspect through the door to the room. I escorted members of the Jefferson County SWAT team as they arrived to the upper level of the school. I also met with two ATF Agents on the upper level. I did a threat analysis of the area with regards to sniper locations, Team locations and the possibility of an explosion from room 206.

As I observed the situation there were times that I could hear females screaming from inside room 206. I observed negotiations with Bonnelycke and a female Police Officer trying to communicate with the suspect. At one point it was thought that the suspect was in the duct or air conditioning system. I along with an ATF agent entered the room next to room 206. I climbed onto a ledge in front of the chalkboard and took off a roof panel to listen if there was anyone in the duct. No one was in the duct. I was checking the area and rooms and was listening to hear if anyone was in the duct.

I met with Cpl. Wood and we cleared a mechanical room and it was determined that someone could have gained access to the roof area. I climbed onto the roof behind Cpl. Wood. I asked Wood if anyone could hear someone if they were to walk onto the roof. Wood stated "No." We walked onto the roof and cleared the area. No one was found. I was informed via radio that the suspect and hostages could here someone walking on the roof. I believe they heard Cpl. Wood as he walked a different path back to the door.

After getting off the roof I escorted two ATF agents to the command area. I met with Park County SWAT Medic G. Stanley. I was advised by Sheriff Wegener to escort Stanley to the staged Fire units located near the northeast doors of the school. While staged with Stanley I was advised to escort another Jefferson County Deputy negotiator to the second floor of the school.

After a short time at the staging area on the second floor I was advised by Sheriff Wegener to escort Stanley to the second floor. While staging I was advised by the negotiators that the suspect gave a 4:00pm time line. I believe this was stated to me at approximately 3:15pm. I was advised that there were charges set for an explosive entry. At approximately 3:35 a dynamic entry was made. See CBI report for further.

On September 27, 2006 at approximately 1:00pm I was advised by telephone of a hostage situation at the Platte Canyon High School. I immediately put my uniform on and left my residence.

At approximately 1:10pm I arrived in the area of PCHS. I was directed by Sheriff Wegener to proceed to the roadblock at US Hwy 285 and PCR 64 in Shawnee. I arrived less than one minute later. While at the roadblock I was met by Deputies Brigham and Koopman. Brigham, Koopman and I maintained the roadblock for approximately 20 minutes.

At approximately 1:30pm Cpl. Flint arrived at our roadblock. Flint told me and Brigham to get our tactical gear and get ready to go to the School. I put my tactical gear on. Steve Bargas arrived at the roadblock while I was putting my gear on. Flint, Brigham, Bargas and I got into Brigham's marked patrol car. We followed several school buses to the school. As the buses turned around in the parking lot of the middle school we parked the patrol car in the middle of the Hwy near the entrance to the middle school parking lot and covered the buses from that location.

While covering the school buses Deputy Brigham was directed by the Sheriff to follow the buses to Deer Creek Elementary School. Flint, Bargas and I remained on scene after Brigham left. We walked to the south parking lot and took cover behind some vehicles. We met Deputy Carrigan and a Clear Creek SWAT officer. I stayed at this location for about 1.5hrs.

At approximately 3:10pm Flint, Carrigan, Clear Creek SWAT officer and I began checking vehicles that were parked on the west side of the south parking lot. We checked several vehicles and didn't find any suspicious items. As we began checking the 7th or 8th vehicle I heard over the radio, emergency traffic only in five minutes. Flint, Bargas and I began moving along the west side of the main school building.

At approximately 3:35pm Flint, Bargas and I began moving along the west side of the main school building. While moving I heard several loud explosions from inside the school. I also heard several small pops that I believed were gunshots. Then I heard over the radio, "suspect down, hostage down, we need medics". Flint, Bargas and I began running towards the west door of the main High school entrance. We entered the building and proceeded up stairs. As I reached the top of the stairs Sgt. Hardey told me to go get a stretcher and more medics. I went out the west doors and grabbed a stretcher from a PCRS ambulance. I pulled the stretcher into the school and up the north stairs. Several SWAT members took the stretcher from me and asked me to stay in the hallway. I remained there for approximately 20 minutes.

At approximately 4:00pm I was asked to leave the school. I went outside and met up with several Park County Deputies

On September 27, 2006 at about 11:40AM I was at the Substation in the town of Bailey located in Park County Colorado. I received a call from Communications advising me there was a man in the high school with a gun. Deputy Brigham, Sergeant Hardey, Lieutenant Hancock and I left the Substation and responded to the high school with lights and sirens. En-route to the high school Communications advised me the male suspect had taken hostages and was in the English pod in room 206.

Upon arrival at the high school I drove my patrol vehicle into the back section of the main parking lot and parked behind Lt. Hancock's vehicle. I got my AR-15 rifle out of the back of my vehicle and Lt. Hancock and I entered the high school through the northwest entrance. Lt. Hancock and I saw students coming through a set of double doors on the main level. We proceeded through the doors and down the hallway towards the south set of stairs leading to the second floor. Sgt. Hardey met up with Lt. Hancock and I and we went up the south set of stairs to the second floor. The three of us proceeded down the hallway towards the English pod. Sgt. Hardey took a position to cover the south entrance to the English pod and room 206. Lt. Hancock and I continued to the north entrance of the English pod and room 206. I heard a knock at the double set of locked doors at the north entrance to the hallway. I went over to the doors and heard Deputy Brigham identify himself. I tactically opened the door and Deputy Brigham was on the other side.

Lt. Hancock, Deputy Brigham and I opened the door that leads down the hall to room 206. We proceeded down the short hallway and saw the door to room 206. I moved across the hall for a better look at the Loor to room 206 and ended up right in front of the door. There was a narrow section of double paned glass with wire in between that ran the length of the door. The glass was on the left side of the doorframe as I was facing the door. I saw the suspect, later identified as Duane Morrison, through the glass. Morrison was standing approximately five feet inside the door. Morrison was standing between the wall and a tall AV cart that had a television on the top shelf. The lights inside the room were off. Morrison was hiding behind a young female with blond hair. Morrison was wearing a type of jacket that had a hood and he was wearing the hood. Morrison had a dark colored pistol in his right hand and was holding it to the female's head. I stated, "There he is, he's right there".

I raised my AR-15 and took aim at Morrison's head. I could only see from the bridge of Morrison's nose to the top of his head. The rest of Morrison was hidden behind the female hostage. I yelled for Morrison to drop the gun. I believe I repeated this several times. Lt. Hancock had proceeded past the door and Deputy Brigham was on my right side. While Deputy Brigham and I were standing in front of the door the Sheriff arrived at the entrance to the hallway. The Sheriff gave the okay to take the head shot if it was there. I looked past Morrison and there was a clear path behind him. I had a small target area to shoot at and I was concerned with a possible deflection when the round hit the glass. I was concerned that the round might deflect and hit the female hostage. I made the decision that I could not take a clear good shot. Morrison had been yelling at me to back away. Lt. Hancock attempted to start negotiations with Morrison. Morrison said he had "3 pounds of C-4" and demanded that we all back off. Deputy Brigham and I held our position until Lt. Hancock told us to move away from the door.

We moved away from the door towards the entrance of the hallway. We took up a position just out of sight from Morrison. Lt. Hancock continued attempts to communicate with Morrison. Lt. Hancock kept asking Morrison what it was he wanted and what could we do for him. Lt. Hancock expressed his concerns for the hostages and asked Morrison if he would release them. Sgt. Hardey had come down the hall to where we were positioned. Deputy Brigham had been off duty and did not have his ballistic vest on. Sgt. Hardey told Deputy Brigham that he had to leave the building until he found a vest.

I held my position while Lt. Hancock continued to try and communicate with Morrison. Shortly after Deputy Brigham left several other officers showed up at our location. Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke took over negotiations. Detective Corporal Morgan arrived followed by Corporal Greeley and Deputy Gaffner. Cpl. Greeley had a key to room 206. Team one was established if something happened that required us to enter room 206. Cpl. Greeley would use the key to open the door. Cpl. Morgan would enter first and move to the left. I would enter second and move to the right. Deputy Gaffner would enter third and take the middle. I am not sure of the timeline but we all remained in position for an extended period of time. Sgt. Bonnelyke continued communications with Morrison. Other officers had arrived at our location and were given various assignments.

Over an extended period of time Sgt. Bonnelyke performed well and managed to get Morrison to release five hostages. There were still two female hostages inside the room with Morrison. Jefferson County SWAT arrived at our location. Sergeant Brown told Team one to stand down because Jeffco SWAT was taking over. Feam one remained on location with new assignments. I took up a position covering the classroom adjacent to room 206. A new negotiator arrived at our location to assist Sgt. Bonnelyke a break. After an extended period of time communications with Morrison appeared to be shutting down. Jeffco SWAT developed a plan and got ready to take room 206 if ordered. A little later Morrison said, "that at 4:00PM it would all be over". The Sheriff gave the order for Jeffco SWAT to enter the room.

All units that were near room 206 were instructed to take cover. Jeffco SWAT detonated the charges and entered the room. Lt. Hancock entered the room and I followed a few seconds behind him. As I was entering the room Jeffco SWAT members were rushing one of the two remaining hostages out of the room. All available personnel in the room were instructed to get all the backpacks and take them outside as far as possible. I grabbed several backpacks and ran them outside with them. I was instructed to throw them down the hill towards US Highway 285 away from the school. I immediately returned to room 206 for more backpacks but they had all been removed. I saw Morrison on the floor by the back wall. I saw a female hostage, later identified I was told that Morrison had shot Emily in the as Emily Keyes, head. I saw a Park County SWAT medic on the floor beside Emily applying direct pressure to the wound in her head. I cannot remember who identified me as an EMT but I went over to Emily to provide assistance. A Jeffco SWAT member stood up to let me in to help the medic.

Response

On September 27, 2006 at approximately 11:40 AM I was working on paperwork in the Investigations Division Offices in Fairplay. Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke and Detective Corporal Goto were in the office with me. I heard Communications air that a man had gone into Platte Canyon High School and fired at a teacher. I heard a partial description of this man. I did not make out the entire description, but I heard something about him wearing some blue. I began responding code. Sergeant Bonnelycke rode with me and Corporal Goto followed us. While en route, Communications provided periodic updates. I heard on the radio that Deputy Reynolds was responding, Master Sergeant Brown was responding, and Corporal Greeley was also responding.

Approximately just north of Grant on US Highway 285 I heard Corporal Wood who was on-scene advise that kids were starting to evacuate on the south side of the school. Shortly after this I heard Master Sergeant Brown call out with Corporal Wood to assist. Just north of Shawnee on US Highway 285 I heard Sergeant Hardey who was on-scene ask for two officers to cover him near the main entrance of the school, near the counseling offices. I asked Communications if they knew which classroom the gunman was in. Communications advised that the gunman was in room 206. I had the school in sight at this time and I advised Corporal Hardey that Sergeant Bonnelycke and I would take this position. As I drove past the school I saw emergency personnel working to shut US Highway 285 down. I observed a long line of students exiting from the south side of the school (from Fitzsimmons Middle School). These students appeared younger and most had their hands in the air. I saw school buses in this area as well, and I also observed police personnel assisting the students.

Sergeant Bonnelycke and I pulled around to the north side of Platte Canyon High School (PCHS) between the main building and the administration offices. This was at approximately 12:10 PM. I observed another line of students exiting from the entrance here. These students looked older—around high school age. I exited my patrol car and put on my body armor (vest) and charged my Colt AR-15. I also equipped myself with my pac-set radio. Sergeant Bonnelycke also placed his vest on and he took my Remington 870 12-gauge shotgun. I also had my duty weapon, a Smith & Wesson 4006. I asked the students exiting the building if they knew where they were going. They responded that they did. Some of these students appeared scared, but most appeared calm.

I observed Sergeant Hardey standing outside the building signaling Sergeant Bonnelycke and I to follow him. Sergeant Bonnelycke and I ran upstairs with Sergeant Hardey. Here Sergeant Hardey appraised us of the situation. Sergeant Hardey advised us that an unknown white male was in room 206 with several female hostages. I am not certain of the exact count at this point, but I believe there were six hostages. I relieved Deputy Brigham who had come in off-duty to assist, though Sergeant Hardey wanted him out of the building as he didn't have a vest on.

Layout, Planning, and Negotiations

Room 206 was just off the main hallway. Another door led out onto the main hallway just south of room 206 and we initially believed that this door also provided access to room 206. We later found that this was not the case. Sergeant Hardey asked me to post on this door in case the suspect tried to come out of it. While covering this door from the main hallway, I heard Lieutenant Hancock apparently negotiating with a man in room 206. Looking down the main hallway I observed Sheriff Wegener and Detective Corporal Franck evacuate a classroom full of kids. These kids looked very frightened. These kids exited down the south Shortly after this I observed Deputy Reynolds and stairwell that comes out near the Canyon Room. Undersheriff Gore come up the stairs along with Corporal Greeley.

Sergeant Bonnelycke stood outside room 206 and he had taken over negotiations. I grabbed the Undersheriff, Deputy Reynolds, and Corporal Greeley and we made a quick plan to make immediate entry into room 206 if we heard shots being fired. Deputy Lougheed and Deputy Gaffner also showed up in this area as well, and later Master Sergeant Brown and Reserve Deputy Humke arrived in this area. Deputy Lougheed had seen into room 206 and he described to me what he had seen. Deputy Lougheed explained that the suspect was crouched behind a TV stand with a gun to a girl's head and that the other hostages were lined up along the south wall. Deputy Lougheed drew a quick diagram on a piece of paper. I later transferred this diagram to the wall next to the door leading into room 206. Sergeant Hardey left the area to see if he had a sniper shot into room 206. I heard via my pac-set radio that Sergeant Hardey did not have a clear shot due to glare on the window. Undersheriff Gore also left the area to go to incident command.

Corporal Greeley was the first man in our stack followed by myself and periodically followed by Deputy Lougheed, Deputy Gaffner, and / or Deputy Reynolds. These other deputies behind me periodically changed positions to relay information or to escort a hostage out of the school (see below). Corporal Greeley had a master key to the school and the plan was: if we heard shooting, Corporal Greeley would open the door to room 206 and hold it while I and the deputies behind me made entry, followed in the end by Corporal Greeley. We were all stacked behind Sergeant Bonnelycke. We could not move forward because there was a thin, vertical set of widows running along the door to room 206. Our suspect could apparently see out of these windows, and he became extremely agitated if he saw movement through these windows (see below).

Sergeant Bonnelycke had been negotiating for some time, asking the suspect what he wanted, what his name was, why he was doing this, etc. The suspect would not provide any of this information. Sergeant Bonnelycke wanted to know if the girls were okay so we could let their parents know they were okay. The suspect became agitated, stating that he had already told us the girls were text-messaging their parents, so their parents knew they were okay. Other than this, the suspect did not say much. The extent of most of his dialogue consisted of telling us to get away from the door. Deputy Lougheed informed me that prior to my arrival, the suspect had stated he had a backpack full of explosives and that he would blow-up the school if we tried to enter the classroom.

Eventually the classroom door opened and a white female exited. We sent this girl with Deputy Reynolds to be escorted from the school. Sergeant Bonnelycke continued talking to the suspect, though he received little in the way of a response. The suspect never mentioned wanting anything and he would not give us his name, the names of the hostages, what he wanted, or why he was doing this. Eventually another hostage , I recall she was wearing a gray shirt. She had dark hair was released. This girl looked and tears were running down her face. She looked terrified. Negotiations continued. Eventually another girl was released. I would estimate this girl was released approximately half-an-hour to 45-minutes after the previous hostage was released. I recall that this girl had short, black hair, was Caucasian, and was wearing a white t-shirt. This girl paused as she passed us. She was crying and she stated that the suspect was molesting them.

Shortly after this the Jefferson County SWAT team arrived. Master Sergeant Brown had those of us stacked behind Sergeant Bonnelycke pull back so the Jefferson County SWAT Team could take our place. Those of us in the initial stack moved out into the main hallway and from there we went around room 206 to a computer lab of sorts. This room is connected to the main hallway via a smaller, connecting hallway. The door to room 206 is located within this connecting hallway. From this computer room we could look down the connecting hallway, approximately 10-feet or so, to room 206. Sergeant Bonnelycke was still negotiating, but he was getting almost no response whatsoever from the suspect now. Eventually, a female negotiator for Jefferson County took over negotiations. This lady had no success in getting the suspect to talk, so she started alking through the hostages.

I heard bits and pieces of the continuing negotiations. During this time-period I assisted Jefferson County SWAT with communications via my pac-set radio. I observed the Jeffco SWAT Team use a fiber-optic camera and mirror to try and see into the classroom. I don't know what they saw, but at one point I heard one of the SWAT officers report to his team-leader that he had observed a black, semi-automatic handgun.

An issue arose over the air conditioning. The air conditioning was making enough background noise that the negotiator was having to yell to be heard. Likewise, the hostages were also having to yell to respond. The Jeffco SWAT team-leader asked if the ceiling tiles had been previously moving. Looking at the ceiling tiles, you could see some of them slightly moving. Deputy Lougheed advised us that the ceiling tiles did this when the air conditioning was running. Initially I was requested by the Jeffco negotiators to have the AC shutdown. Shortly after this, the SWAT team-leader asked that it be left on as it masked our movements in the hallway.

At some point, during the time when the Jeffco negotiator was talking, the suspect became extremely agitated, yelling for us to get off the roof. I heard the hostages screaming and the suspect was yelling repeatedly and loudly for us to get off the roof. I heard a rumbling sound from the floor. I cannot be certain, but my feeling regarding this rumbling sound is that the hostages were being made to repeatedly stomp their feet up and down on the floor. The Jeffco SWAT team-leader asked if anyone was on the roof. I told him that no one had gone to the roof to my knowledge, and that if they had, they didn't tell us. The Jeffco negotiator responded to

the suspect, saying that no one was on the roof and that the noise was being caused by the air conditioning. I later learned that Corporal Wood and Master Sergeant Brown had gone up onto the roof.

Negotiations continued. Eventually another hostage was released. I recall this hostage was a Caucasian female with blonde hair and a blue shirt. This girl was crying and she paused by the Jeffco SWAT Team and said something. I couldn't hear exactly what she said.

Eventually Sergeant Bonnelycke began negotiating again. The suspect was still not saying anything and I would estimate he didn't say anything for almost two-hours at this point, other than yelling about people on the roof. A plan had been made to make entry into room 206. A breaching charge was placed on the door, and another charge for a gun port had been placed onto the east wall of room 206. There were two hostages remaining in the room. One of the hostages identified herself as Emily, and she did most of the talking. I learned that the other hostage was named Emily and that told Sergeant Bonnelycke that she wanted to go to law school when she graduated and that She said she was scared.

When the Jeffco negotiator was talking, she asked Emily and (if they could get up and leave. Emily responded that they could in a couple of minutes. Later, when asked this same question, Emily responded, "In a minute." The negotiator asked why they couldn't leave now. Emily said that they couldn't eave. An hour or so would go past, and the negotiator would again ask if the girls could leave. Again the response was that they could leave in a couple of minutes. The negotiator pointed out that they had said that an hour ago. The negotiator wanted to know why the girls couldn't leave now. Emily said they could not leave. The negotiator wanted to know what was going to happen in a couple of minutes. Emily did not know. Eventually, around 3:15 or 3:20 PM Emily said that they could leave at 4:00 PM. The negotiator asked what happened at 4:00 PM. I did not hear Emily's answer. Emily was crying and she sounded terrified. Emily told the negotiator she was scared. The suspect was not saying anything.

Prior to making entry, Sergeant Bonnelycke tried again to gain the release of the hostages. Sergeant began talking to I heard a response but Bonnelycke, I don't know who responded or what was said. I heard Sergeant Bonnelycke ask if the suspect didn't want him I don't know what was said, but I didn't hear Sergeant Bonnelycke speak in

Eventually a Jeffco Officer told us that as soon as the negotiators came back into the computer room we were in, to plug our ears because they were going to make entry. I heard Sheriff Wegener advise us that there was a SWAT medic standing-by outside and someone needed to come and get him. Master Sergeant Brown left and when he returned he had with him Gene Stanley, a medic on our SWAT team. Sheriff Wegener asked if Gene had his medical supplies with him. Gene indicated he had a bag with the basics.

Sergeant Bonnelycke talked to the suspect one last time, ordering him to come out of the room. There was no response. Just after 3:30 PM the negotiators came back to the computer room. There was a tremendous blast and I ran to room 206.

Entry

Per my instructions from my supervisor, refer to my report made to CBI regarding the rest of this incident and the subsequent shooting.

Follow-up

On August 28, 2006 at approximately 11:05 AM Detective Corporal Goto and I responded to the Cutthroat Café in Bailey to follow-up on a lead. During a briefing that morning with CBI, we were told that in the past a student at Platte Canyon High School by the name of Jeremy Black had made unwanted advances toward Emily. CBI also advised us that Black may have been harassing Emily recently at her job at the Cutthroat Café. During this briefing CBI also advised that there may have been an instance involving Black in the past wherein he molested Emily in some way.

While at the Cutthroat Café Corporal Goto and I first spoke with IP/ Michelle Anderson, DOB: 04-28-1977. Michelle stated that she knew Emily but that Emily had not mentioned being stalked to her. Michelle said that Emily never mentioned anyone stalking or harassing her. Michelle said that Emily did talk about a group of girls at the school whom she (Emily) referred to as the "mean girls." Michelle recalled that one of Michelle explained that Emily told her these "mean girls" were generally unkind these girls was named to other girls they considered beneath them. Michelle said that she felt that if Emily was being harassed or stalked, she (Emily) would have told her (Michelle). Corporal Goto and I showed Michelle a recently obtained booking photo (Jefferson County-July 11, 2006) of the man who murdered Emily, S/ Duane Morrison. Michelle looked at the photo but said she didn't recall seeing Duane at the Cutthroat Café. Corporal Goto and I asked if Michelle noticed anything unusual about Emily the last time they worked together. Michelle said that she worked with Emily the night before Emily was killed, but that Emily did not show any signs of being distressed and that she appeared to be physically and emotionally okay. Michelle did not recognize the name "Jeremy Black" nor did she recall hearing Emily speak of this person.

After speaking to Michelle we spoke to another waitress identified to us as IP/ Bobbie Sterling, DOB: 12-18-1952. Corporal Goto and I asked Bobbie the same general questions we asked of Michelle. Bobbie also said that Emily appeared to be fine the evening before she was killed. Bobbie did state that she knew Jeremy Black, but that she did not recall there being an issue between he and Emily. Bobbie said that she felt that Jeremy just had a crush on Emily, but that this was not real recent. Bobbie said that Emily did not mention any concerns she had about harassment or stalking. We showed Bobbie a picture of Duane Morrison, and Bobbie said the man in the picture looked very familiar to her. We gave her a color copy of the picture to keep and she said she would show it around to the owner and the other waitresses.

I arrived at the Substation around 11:30 AM. I was talking with Lt. Hancock and Dt. Franck when I heard a call come over the radio. Communications aired over the radio that there was a man with a gun in the Platte Canyon High School.

Deputy Brigham, Deputy Lougheed, Dt. Franck, Lt. Hancock, and I ran out of the Substation and responded to the High School with our lights and sirens activated. As we approached the high school I was the second car in line. Deputy Brigham was in the lead. He went into the first driveway near the district offices. I went in the second entrance and around behind the building to the west doors into the high school. While in route communications aired that the suspect was in the English pod room 206.

On September 27th, 2006 at approximately 11:43am I was advised by communications of a male party in the Platte Canyon High School with a gun. We were advised that the male party walked into the School with a backpack carrying enough explosives to blow up the School. One round has been shot so far in room 206. I advised Communication that I would be en route to Platte Canyon High School from the Fairplay area.

Deputy Deberry let me in the front doors to the high school by the Canyon Room. I proceeded down the hall on the bottom level towards the main office. I went up the stairs to room 206. Upon arriving at room 206, I got in a line that was behind Sergeant Detective Bonnelyckee who was negotiating with the suspect through the door. We waited and negotiated with the suspect for several hours. Bonnelycke was able to get five girls out of the room. As the girls came out they were saying that the suspect was sexually assaulting them. We continued to negotiate.

Once Jefferson County S.W.A.T. arrived on scene, they took over negotiation and overseeing operations on the room. During this time the suspect would no longer talk to the Officers. The two remaining girls would talk for him. During this time no more female parties were released. When asked if they were goring to come out, the girls finally said it would be over at 4:00PM. This alerted the Officers on scene. Based on the time line and the threats involved a decision was made to make entry into the room in an attempt to get the remaining two girls out of the room and take the suspect into custody. Jefferson County S.W.A.T. led the team. The Door was reached (See CBI reports).

On September 27, 2006 I was off-duty at my residence on U.S. Hwy 285 in Jefferson Colorado at approximately 1150 when numerous Park County Sheriff's Office vehicles displaying both lights and sirens passed going northbound.

I immediately called the Park County Jail Master Control to learn the nature of the emergency and not tie up Communications with my curiosity. Master Controller Fred Boyce told me that there was an "active shooter" situation at Platte Canyon High School.

I put on a uniform and drove to Platte Canyon High School using emergency lights and siren.

I arrived on scene at 1228 and contacted Undersheriff M. Gore who was Incident Command and located in the parking lot between the high school and the middle school. While being briefed, Park County Emergency Operations Manager Lori Hodges, inquired over the radio about bussing the evacuated students from the middle school to Deer Creek Elementary School. Undersheriff Gore stressed the need to have an accurate accounting of the bussed students and I moved to the middle school to assist with that project. I contacted Lori Hodges and with her we told school staff of our need for a student roster and a careful accounting of students as they boarded the buses. Office staff began to create the required lists. Evacuated students were assembled in the gymnasium. An off-duty female Jefferson County Deputy who had walked in from the roadblock contacted me it this time and offered to help. This deputy (first name "Cindy") used to be an animal control officer for Park County and assisted in the assembling and loading of the students.

I learned that some hostages had been released and Detective Corporal Amy Franck was locating all the released hostages and escorting them to the ambulances on the football field. Detective Franck gathered some former hostages from another gymnasium in the middle school and took them to the football field.

At one point I exited the front door of the middle school and noticed a young lady walking up the sidewalk toward the front entrance. I asked her if she was a student and she told me she had just been released from Room 206. I escorted her to the football field and the ambulances. As we crossed U. S. Highway 285 she told me her name was

over to Detective Franck I contacted Detention Sergeant M. Jones who was acting as scribe for Incident Command, which had been relocated to the football field. I learned from Sgt. Jones that buses were en route to transport the evacuated students and the roadblock just north of the footbridge over Highway 285 may be an obstacle. I drove to the roadblock and contacted Animal Control Officers B. Priestly, M Sexton and T. Purcell who were manning that post. The parents who were at the roadblock immediately approached and I gave them what little information I had. I requested that they move the vehicles to the side to allow buses to enter and advised them that they would learn more if they were at the Bailey substation. They declined to leave.

At some point I returned to the football field and Sgt. Jones advised me that Incident Command might have a lead on the identity of the suspect. I learned that two children of the possible suspect were in the school and I returned to the middle school to attempt to locate before they were transported.

I contacted Lori Hodges and she contacted teachers who moved the two students to an office room so they could be interviewed by investigators.

By this time the transport of the students had occurred and I was at Incident Command at approximately 1525 when the decision was made to make a tactical entry if the opportunity presented itself. Shortly after that at approximately 1535 I heard an explosion from the high school and soon there were reports coming in of a hostage injured along with the suspect.

I saw the first hostage delivered to the football field and soon I saw an injured hostage, later identified as Emily Keyes, brought to the waiting helicopter and loaded for transport to a hospital.

After that I was involved in other minor tasks associated with the end of the incident until approximately 2000 when I left the scene.

History / Investigation:

On September 27th, 2006 at approximately 1251 hours, I received notification of an "active shooter" at the Platte Canyon High School located on US Hwy. 285, Park County, Colorado. I responded directly to that location from my residence in the Fairplay area.

At approximately 1330 hours, same date, I arrived at the southern most checkpoint located at U.S. Hwy. 285 and Park County Road 64. As I exited my patrol vehicle I was met by Deputy Brigham and Sonnenberg who began to brief me. They also advised that an order had been given that all additional police units were requested to "hold" their current positions.

Per my SWAT and Active Shooter Training, I began to set up a "Rescue Team." I found three officers who were SWAT or SORT trained and did not have current assignments. I formed the composite "Rescue Team" as follows;

- 1.) Cpl. G. Flint SWAT / SORT / First Responder Trained
- 2.) S. Bargas SWAT / Team Medic
- 3.) Deputy Sonnenberg SORT Trained
- 4.) Deputy Brigham SORT Trained

I ordered these individuals to report back to me with all their equipment and clear out a marked patrol vehicle for a quick response. A few minutes later these officers were prepared to move and the team medic was carrying a medium sized field response bag. I contacted the command center by way of the Information Channel and advised them that we had a four-man team ready to accept assignments. This transmission was acknowledged by the command center.

A short time later several buses overshot the turn to pick up students who were hiding on the hill south of the Fitzsimmons Middle School parking lot. Officers were requested to assist in their evacuation and provide security for them. Officers moved to a position near the southern most exit to Fitzsimmons Middle School on US Hwy. 285 to cover the students and buses withdrawal from the area. After the buses were loaded, Deputy Brigham was requested to escort the buses back to the drop off point. Deputy Sonnenberg, Medic Bargas and I remained at the south end of Fitzsimmons Middle School awaiting further assignment.

Officers picked up a SWAT member from Clear Creek County as our fourth man. While interacting with this officer, a sniper team from his agency reported finding a magazine to a rifle. The magazine was described as being for .30 caliber rifle and fully loaded. This magazine was located on the hill on the west side of the high school complex, approximately centered on the middle buildings. This information was being reported on this officer's Clear Creek radio channel. I reported this intelligence to the command center on the information channel. This transmission was acknowledged.

Approximately forty-five minutes later, same date, officers were requested to search all motor vehicles on the south and east side of the Fitzsimmons Middle School buildings for evidence of explosives and/or additional weapons. The four-man team plus Deputy Carrigan initiated a search of these vehicles. Officers proceeded up a row to the east side of school one vehicle at a time. The Clear Creek officer and I provided security while the remaining officers searched the vehicles. Deputy Carrigan wrote down license plates of any suspicious vehicles and reported them to the command center.

While clearing these vehicles officers were advised that Jefferson County SWAT Team would be initiating a breech on the interior of the building at some point. Officers continued searching the vehicles located on the east side of the building. Officers were notified that it was five minutes to the interior breech. I moved the team into secure position using a brick wall and alcoves on the southeast side of the Canyon Room Cafeteria to await the breech.

The breech occurred and officers could hear a flash bang and several gunshots being fired. Officers then heard numerous requests for medical assistance on both the information and tactical radio channels. I ordered a team to move the most northern east entrance of the high school.

Rescue Team Response:

We were met in the lobby by Cpl. Wood and led straight to room 206 on the second floor of high school. I observed smoke and floating debris in the air. There was heavy damage to the ceiling tiles outside room 206. I observed several members from the Jefferson and Park County SWAT teams in the main corridor and pod hallway. I observed several officers carrying backpacks, sports bags and bundles from room 206 to be thrown from the building's second floor. None of the officers in this area of the incident appeared to be injured.

As I entered the interior of room 206, I noticed more scattered debris. I observed a white male in a partially upright sitting position. The white male had some unknown gunshot trauma to his chest area and blood spatter on the wall behind him. I visually scanned past the white male subject and observed a white female subject, later identified to me as Emily Keyes lying in a prone position. I could see

'Sgt. Brown, Deputy Lougheed and Team Medic Bargas all simultaneously approached Emily's body. I secured Sgt. Brown's weapon so that he could go hands on to treat Emily. Deputy Sonnenberg was able to bring the stretcher through the debris on the floor. Deputy Sonnenberg and I supported the gurney, while Brown, Bargas and Lougheed assisted in loading the victim. Deputy Sonnenberg and another officer quickly removed Emily from room 206 and took her to the "Flight for Life" location.

I checked on the status of SWAT team members and the rescue team members as they recovered their medical and entry equipment. I stood by until our members had been properly relieved or were otherwise able to leave the scene on the interior of the school.

On September 27, 2006, I was on duty at the Park County Jail, working as the Dayshift Sergeant when a call came across the radio in the control room stating that there was a shooting at Platte Canyon High School in Bailey, Colorado.

At approximately 1147, I received a phone call from Communications that a van was needed immediately at Platte Canyon High School. I retrieved van keys from the key locker, proceeded out doors 3 and 4, entered the van and proceeded to Platte Canyon High School. I called the vehicle in service and left the jail at 1150. I traveled through South Park and proceeded up Kenosha Pass at which time I engaged the vehicles emergency lights. I listened to radio traffic and found that there was an individual in the school holding students hostage. I arrived at the parking lot of Fitzsimmons Middle School at approximately 1220, where I was directed by Deputy Nathan Carrigan to proceed to the parking lot between Platte Canyon High School and the Administrative Building. I went to the back of the parking lot behind Platte Canyon High School, which was designated as the staging area for Incident Command, where I met with Deputy Jerry Brigham. Deputy Brigham was monitoring the radio and beginning to scribe for Incident Command. At approximate 1225 Undersheriff Monte Gore approached Deputy Brigham and myself, took control of IC and directed Deputy Brigham to proceed with his duties while I took over as scribe for IC.

At approximately 1327 Sheriff Fred Wegener informed Undersheriff Gore to move IC staging area from the back of the school to the football field across the street from the school.

At approximately 1445, I was directed by the Sheriff to find Deputy District Attorney Shawn Paris. At this time I left my post and went to the administrative building where I contacted Mr. Paris and brought him to IC at the lootball field.

I continued as scribe for the incident until approximately 1600 when the Sheriff left the area to go to the school.

On September 27, 2006 while at the Investigations office preparing equipment for a crime scene search, I heard radio traffic come over a handheld radio in the office in reference to an armed gunman located at the Platte Canyon High School and the gunman was holding students as hostages. It was further advised the gunman had already fired his weapon while inside the school. After learning of this Detective Morgan and I left the office and began responding to the High School in one vehicle (Detective Morgan's). While enroute to the school dispatch further aired that the gunman made a statement advising he had a backpack full of explosives.

Prior to our arrival at the school, Sgt. Hardey requested the next two available law enforcement personnel to respond to accompany him to the second floor of the school. Upon our arrival at the north side of the High School, (unknown time) Detective Morgan and I met with Sgt. Hardey and followed him into the northwest entrance of the school and to the second floor of the building. After Detective Morgan took a position to cover a doorway in the main hall, I met with Lt. Mark Hancock who was standing by room 206. Lt. Hancock pointed to the door of 206 advising that the gunman and hostages were located inside. At this point Lt. Hancock requested that I take over negotiations with the gunman.

For additional information pertaining to the negotiations with the gunman, refer to CBI Agent Rosa Perez's report based on an interview she conducted with me on September 28, 2006.

On October 27, 2006 at around 11:00 am I (Animal Control Officer Sexton) was in the Bailey Substation. The deputies, animal control officers and I heard the call of a gunman at the Platte Canyon High School. The deputies responded to the call, and shortly after they left I heard a call for someone to bring the ballistic shield. I took the shield with me in my unit and transferred them to Detective Franck at the school, along with a handheld radio. After I left the school, I heard instructions on the radio for Animal Control to stop southbound traffic on Highway 285.

I found Officers Priestly and Purcell at a location near the school on Highway 285, where they had stopped traffic. For the next hours we advised motorists to turn around and assisted semi truck drivers to turn around. Many parents and a reporter from the Fairplay Flume began to congregate at the roadside. At one point Sheriff Wegener radioed us and told us to keep the people on the side of the road and off of the right of way so that they would not go up the hill toward the school. I understood that only emergency traffic was to be permitted past our post.

The parents who were congregated at our roadblock asked us several times for information. Three males in particular were loud and aggressive in their demands. They wanted to know if their child was being held hostage. On at least two occasions these males said that if the sheriff didn't come talk to them, they would break through the roadblock, or that if the sheriff wasn't going to go in after the gunman, they would (go into the school after the gunman). Officers Priestly, Purcell and myself used verbal de-escalation techniques to talk to these males, and to request that they stay where they were.

While some of these parents were asking us for information, a firefighter came to talk to the parents. He was able to answer some of the questions we were not, and he indicated that he would come back with more information. After he left, a male who had been standing in the group of parents received a call on his cell phone. Then he came and told Officers Purcell, Priestly and I that his wife had received a call from a news company, and they had told her that their daughter was one of the hostages. He told me his name was:

IP/ John Michael Keyes.

Keyes demanded to be let through the roadblock. Keyes then made some comments about how he would make a run for it through the roadblock. He asked me if I were a fast runner. I responded yes. He asked me how my tackling skills were. I responded that they were excellent. Keyes was visibly upset, alternating between crying and demanding to be let through. During these incidents I observed Keyes with his cell phone, which I heard ringing. Keyes said that he had received a text message from his daughter and he read it to us. He said that it said "I love you guys". Keyes wanted to show me the text message. Several times he came very close to myself or another officer. At one point he came up close behind Officer Purcell while her back was turned and I warned him away. I asked if he was carrying any weapons on him. He responded that he was not. He then approached me in a manner I felt was threatening and I told him to "get back". Keyes retreated back to the other parents. Soon after that the firefighter returned and told the parents the names of the students that were hostage. As soon

as the firefighter said the name "Emily Keyes", Keyes broke into tears and sat down on the ground. Officer Priestly radioed for a victim's advocate, who arrived a short time later, talked to Keyes, then left again. Two ATF agents arrived shortly and Keyes went with them to Incident Command.

As the afternoon progressed the people at the roadblock dispersed, went back to their cars, and drove away until none was left. Under orders from the Sheriff, Officers Priestly, Purcell and I checked identification of all persons entering the scene at our roadblock. About 8:00 pm we were told we were no longer needed and we left the scene.

I then returned to District 1 because no deputies were patrolling that area.

On September 27, 2006 I responded to the Platte Canyon High School for a report of a male with a gun in the school. At approximately 11:55am I arrived on scene at the southwest entrance to the middle school. Upon my arrival an entry team was entering the southern most doors of the middle school and there were numerous children walking across the parking lot to go to a pre determined evacuation point. I Spoke with Reserve Deputy Wheat and handed him my AR-15 to help set a perimeter on the south end of the building. Wheat covered the doors from the Canyon room and the main doors of the middle school while I covered the southern most doors and the rear of the middle school. Trooper Kenney arrived on scene and took perimeter along with Wheat and I. At an unknown time a blonde female exited the doors from the middle school closest to the hillside. Trooper Kenney contacted the girl who identified herself as being just released from the English room. Deputy Reynolds exited the same doors and then escorted the girl to incident command. At a later unknown time Jefferson County and Clear Creek County Officers joined at the perimeter. Corporal Flint and Deputy Sonnenberg arrived and began to form a medical rescue team. While waiting for a call for assistance from the building Sonnenberg, Flint, and I checked vehicles in the parking lot for suspicious items and contents within the vehicles.

During the incident I performed the following duties;

- Monitored TAC channel and relayed information to Incident Command.
- Provided assistance at roadblocks for irate parents.
- Maintained Perimeter on south side of middle school.
- Inspected vehicles in middle school parking lots.

I was at the roadblock from the time I responded at approximately 11:50 AM until 8:02 PM. I was given strict orders by Sheriff Wegener to stop all unmarked vehicles and check for identification. While at the roadblock several parents were waiting for any news regarding the safety of their children.

At approximately 8:02 PM Under Sheriff Gore advised Officer Sexton and I to go home and we left the area. There is no other information available at this time. End of report.

On September 27, 2006 at about 1140 hours I was notified by dispatch of a hostage situation at the Platte Canyon High School. I immediately activated emergency lights and siren and responded from Fairplay. I listened as dispatch aired information on the suspect such as he was a middle aged white male, balding, one shot had been fired and he was holding several hostages in room 206 at the Platte Canyon High School. I continued to monitor dispatch. I later heard information that the suspect had stated that he had a backpack full of explosives, and that it was enough to blow up the school.

I was asked by dispatch who was in command. At this time I was unsure where the Sheriff was, I advised them that I was in charge of the incident. I was asked if I wanted the Jefferson County Bomb Squad to respond to the Platte Canyon High School. I advised dispatch that I did. I was asked if I wanted their SWAT team to respond I advised dispatch to put them on standby.

An unknown deputy who was on scene at the Platte Canyon High School radioed into dispatch and wanted to know if they should begin evacuation of the High School. I intercepted this communication and ordered deputies to begin evacuation of the Platte Canyon High School.

At about 1215 I arrived on scene at the South end of the Fitzsimmons Middle School, (This is the same building as the High School.) I observed that several deputies had arrived at the same time. We immediately put on our oad bearing vest and retrieved our AR-15 rifles from our vehicles.

I assembled a four-man entry team consisting of Detective Goto, point: Deputy DeBeberry, left flank: Cpl. Greeley rear guard and myself on right flank. Detective Goto was assigned point as he had been previously assigned to the Platte Canyon High School as their School Resource Officer. I knew he had a better knowledge of the School than the rest of us. We were unable to enter the South entrance of the school because the door was locked. I ordered Reserve Deputy Wheat, who was standing in the parking lot to, "Grab the Teacher that was escorting children out of the parking lot, and get her keys!"

Reserve Deputy Wheat did so and we unlocked the door and made entry into the school. We advanced through the school quickly in a four-man formation. We encountered children who were being evacuated and told them to get out right now! As we proceeded to the second floor I observed Sheriff Wegener on scene along with other deputies staged tactically outside of room 206.

I quietly observed Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke attempting to talk to the hostage taker inside room #206. I observed Lt. Hancock on the East side of door covering Sgt. Bonnelycke. I quietly advised deputies that if any shots were fired in the room I wanted to make an immediate entry into the room and engage the hostage taker. As for now it appeared negations were going well. I began to quietly inquire if anyone had breaching tools.

At this time I was notified that Sheriff Wegener wanted me in the hallway. I met him in the hallway where he asked me to take over and coordinate Incident Command. I briefly asked the Sheriff about the need to make

immediate entry into the room if any shots were fired. The Sheriff advised me he actually had the key and could make an immediate entry if necessary. I then left the school and contacted Deputy Brigham at his vehicle at the North Side of the Platte Canyon High School. I relieved him and took over Incident Command at around 1225 hours. I notified dispatch that I had relieved Deputy Brigham and that I was now the Incident Commander. Sergeant Monica Jones was already at the incident command and was acting as a scribe. I continued to utilize her in that position.

I was approached by Jeff Davis, Chief of the Platte Canyon Fire Department, and advised that he had set up his Incident Command on the South end of the football field. I was also notified that he had a flight for life on scene incase we needed it. I thanked him for his efforts. I thought that the Chiefs Incident Command location was superior to our present location, as I felt we were too close to the school. I remembered the hostage taker had reported he had explosives.

I did observe a ', leave the school. I called her over to my location and questioned her. I found that she had been a hostage, I questioned her concerning the hostage taker and specifically if he had been wiring the room with explosives or placing any kind of plastic explosive in or around the room. I was informed that the hostage taker was molesting all of the girls in the room, and that he had a handgun. The girl advised me that he was not wiring anything or doing anything with putty. The girl informed me that he had thrown his backpack oward one end of the room and did not seem to be paying too much attention to it. I asked her if she thought he had explosives in the backpack. She informed me she didn't think so. I the allowed her to go with Detective Amy Franck to a safer location where she could be further debrief.

At about this time Lt. Muldoon arrived on scene where he assisted me with Incident Command. I received a request from dispatch. They wanted to know if they could start sending busses. I advised them to go ahead. I requested that they ACCOUNT for every child.

Sheriff Wegener came out of the School and asked me to relocate to the Incident Command at the football field. I followed the directive and drove Sergeant Jones and myself to the football field. There I met with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Command Staff and others who were arriving. At this time I began to coordinate with Jefferson County and our District Attorney's Deputies to take in information and make coordinated decisions on the current situation.

I stayed close to Jefferson County as their communications were superior to our own and we were able to obtain up to the instant information from their SWAT commanders in the school. The hostage taker was releasing a hostage approximately every 30-40 minutes. We began to have information relayed to us that indicated the level of violence against the hostages was increasing. We conferred with District Attorney Molly Chilson and Deputy District Attorney Sean Paris to ascertain their opinion on breaching the door, lethal force and performing a rescue. District Attorney Molly Chilson gave us the go-ahead.

I received several cell phone calls from individuals around the area offering assistance. Joe Morales, the Director of Public Safety for the State of Colorado called and offered assistance. I requested additional Troopers for traffic control and later assistance.

Sgt. Bonnelycke was continuing to negotiate with the hostage taker, however at this time we learned that Sgt. Bonnelycke was only able to obtain responses from the hostages. The hostage taker had stopped talking. Meanwhile S.W.A.T. were continuing to set up for a tactical entry and preparing the door and wall for a breech. At approximately 1530 hours word was relayed to us that the hostage taker was making statements that the situation was going to be over at 4:00 p.m. We were very concerned by this; Sheriff Wegener, Sheriff Mink, his Command Staff, and I conferred on this information. The unanimous decision was made that we could not wait. We were additionally advised that the molestation of on the two remaining hostages was intensifying, and the hostage taker had stopped releasing hostages. Our joint recommendation to Sheriff Wegener was that we could not wait until the 4:00 p.m. deadline and we needed to make an immediate breech in an attempt to rescue the two remaining hostages. My personal opinion was that the hostage taker was going to murder the two hostages and then kill himself at or around 4:00 p.m. Based on the interview by the one hostage I spoken with earlier with I did not feel he had explosives in his backpack.

Although we made the recommendation, this was Sheriff Wegener's call. Sheriff Wegener made the right lecision and ordered the breech in an attempt to rescue the two remaining hostages. A few minutes later we heard a loud explosion and a few moments later we received information that the hostage taker was down and one of the hostages was down.

The injured hostage, Emily Keyes was rushed to the football field and placed on a Flight for Life Helicopter, where she was airlifted to a hospital in Denver.

I made arrangements with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office for one of their deputies to transport Emily's Parents to the hospital. I then walked over to Mr. Keyes' location. He was on the football field bleachers. I introduced myself to him and informed him that his daughter had sustained a gunshot wound, and was going to be transported to a hospital in Denver. Mr. Keyes asked me where Emily had been shot. I told him she had been shot in the head. I told him how sorry I was. I told Mr. Keyes I had made arrangements to have him and his wife transported to the hospital where Emily was being taken.

I reported back to the Incident Command Center where Sheriff Wegener called all of our staff together, he thanked everyone for what they did and dismissed us.

I received requests from our S.W. A.T. team to go back into the school and insure it was clear, and to make sure that all the children had been evacuated. I authorized the request. I also wanted the Jefferson County Bomb Squad to Search the school for any explosives.

I responded to the school and left word with Sgt. Mike Brown to stay on scene and advised him to tell Lt. Hancock that I placed him in charge of incident command at this time. Lt. Hancock was clearing the school and due to our poor communications I was unable to contact him directly.

I responded to the Bailey sub-station where I met with Sheriff Wegener and others to determine and assist with the mountain of the follow up that was needed on this incident. At this time we met with Joe Morales. I requested assistance from CBI and asked that they be assigned to lead in the investigation. Mr. Morales indicated he would pull Agents from around the State to assist us with the follow up investigation.

I continued to work with other agencies and attended a meeting at the school later that evening. I thanked all the other agencies for all their help and assistance. I formally identified the Colorado Bureau of Investigation as the agency who would lead this investigation. I advised everyone that this was Sheriff Wegener's and my decision.

I met with Park County Attorney Steve Groome and Joe Morales to discuss the day's events. After this I went to the crime scene. I did not actually enter the room, but inquired about getting a picture of Duane Morrison. I felt we needed to release a picture to the press the next day.

Two teachers then asked me if I could give them a ride to their residences, which I did. I then drove home and vent off duty.

Overview:

These events were some of the worst I have ever had to deal with in my career. I feel that everyone performed outstandingly. I felt the assistance we received from other agencies was a blessing and we couldn't have done it with out them. I feel that the decision to enter the school by Sheriff Wegener was a hard one, but the absolutely right one.

On September 27, 2006 at about 11:40 am, I was working on paperwork in the Investigations Division Office in Fairplay in Park County Colorado. Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke and Detective Corporal Morgan were in the office with me. I heard Communications air that there was a man with a gun in the Platte Canyon High School and fired at a teacher. I also heard that the suspect was carrying a backpack full of explosives. I responded emergent. I followed Detective Corporal Morgan.

As I approached Platte Canyon High School, I saw a long line of students exiting from Fitzsimmons Middle School. These students had their hands in the air.

At Fitzsimmons Middle School, Undersheriff Gore informed me that he, Corporal Greeley, Deputy DeBerry and I would enter the Middle School from the south entrance. We entered the middle school. I heard on the radio that the suspect was in the English Classroom 206 in the high school. We advanced toward room 206. As I started to go up the stairs leading to the south-end of the second floor, two students came running down the stairs. I ordered the students, "Police Stop, Show me your hands". I ordered them to stop and raise their hands at gunpoint. The two students appeared to be shocked and very scared. The two students turned around and ran back up the stairs. Deputy Reynolds grabbed the two students and escorted them out of the building. I continued advancing toward room 206. I guarded a classroom entrance next to room 206 because we had information that room 206 and the next room were connected together.

saw Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke enter a classroom hallway leading to room 206. I heard Detective Sergeant Bonnelycke start negotiations with suspect. I heard Detective Sergeant telling the suspect that he wanted to end the incident peacefully with nobody getting hurt. I never heard the suspect reply. Sergeant Hardey told me there was a window in room 206 that connected to the library where the suspect could jump to the first floor. Sgt. Hardey reassigned Deputy DeBerry and I to the first floor to secure the hallway in case the suspect made an attempt to escape the classroom from the window.

While I was guarding the hallway, Sergeant Brown advised me the SWAT team was preparing to breach the door with an explosive. Sergeant Brown advised me to plug my ears. I did not know what time I talked with Sergeant Brown. After 30 minutes or so passed by there was a big explosion and two small explosions followed by at least six quick gunshots from multiple calibers. I then heard someone's voice repeatedly requesting medical. Unknown medical personnel told me that he could not run anymore and asked me if I could deliver their equipments to the scene. I grabbed a vital sign monitor and a defibrillator from medical personnel and ran into classroom 206. I handed the vital sign monitor and a defibrillator to a medical personnel in room 206 and I stepped out of room 206.

After (V) Emily Keyes was removed from room 206, Lt. Hancock asked me to secure the crime scene and I guarded the classroom. At about 4:36 pm, I let Bomb Technician Searle and Foley with Jefferson County Sheriff's Office enter room 206. Bomb Technicians told me that they needed to clear room 206 for possible explosives. At about 4:40 pm, Bomb Technician Searle and Foley left room 206. I guarded room 206 until agents from CBI relieved me.

At about 7:30 pm, I was assigned to go to the CBI office in Denver as a representative from the Park County Sheriff's Office while CBI executed a search warrant at the suspect's last known address. CBI agents later indicated the suspect was not living at his last know address, 1300 S. Birch Street in Denver. CBI agents asked me to call two phone numbers possibly related to the suspect to find out the suspect's current address. I called a phone number in Illinois at 630-357-1741 with an address of 117 E 12th Ave Apt 6 Naperville, Illinois 60563. I

I spoke with a female party who verbally identified herself as (OP) Carol Morrison (D.O.B. 07-06-1947). I identified myself as a detective with Park County Sheriff's Office. I asked Carol if she knew or was related to Duane Morrison from Colorado. Carol said she was not related to Duane Morrison and she did not know who he was. I thanked Carol for her time.

According to CBI agents, the suspect possibly shared an address, 2424 W. Argyle Place, in August of 1986 with (OP) Mary Louise Morrison (D.O.B. 02-01-1926). I called Mary Louise Morrison at 710 Locust Street Fort Collins, Colorado 80525 with a phone number of 970-482-7633. I identified myself as a detective with the Park County Sheriff's Office. I asked Mary if she knew or related to Duane Morrison who lived in Denver area. Mary said she did not know any Duane Morrison in Denver or in Colorado. I told Mary that she might have shared an address with Duane Morrison in 1986. Mary said she did not know Duane Morrison at all. Mary asked me why I was looking for Duane Morrison. I told Mary that I could not tell her the details of the case but 't was very important to find out if she was related to Duane Morrison. Mary asked me if this was a criminal nvestigation and I told her, "Yes". Mary sounded very disappointed. I thanked Mary for her time.

CBI agents told me the suspect might have used Rodger or Garry as his first name. I immediately called Mary back. I asked Mary if she knew Rodger Morrison or Garry Morrison. Mary said Rodger sounded familiar. Mary said there was a family that lived near her house which had two sons but that was about 20 years ago. Mary said she believed one of them was Rodger Morrison. I again asked Mary if she could remember sharing the address with anyone in 1986 and she said, "No". I asked Mary if she was related to Rodger Morrison and she said, "No".

CBI agents and I were unable to locate the suspect's current address.

On September 28, 2006 at about 6:30 am, Detective Corporal Morgan and I attended the CBI briefing at the Platte Canyon School District Building. During the briefing that morning with CBI, we were told that in the past a student at Platte Canyon High School by the name of Jeremy Black had made unwanted advances toward Emily. CBI also advised us that Black may have been harassing Emily recently at her job at the Cutthroat Café. During this briefing CBI advised that there might have been an instance involving Black in the past where he molested Emily.

I researched Jeremy Black and Emily Keyes in the in-house database before I went to Cutthroat Café. I did not find a report regarding harassment or stalking issue with Jeremy.

At about 11:05 am, Detective Corporal Morgan and I went to the Cutthroat Café in Bailey to follow-up on a lead. Detective Corporal Morgan and I spoke with (W) Michelle Anderson (D.O.B. 04-28-1977), a waitress at Cutthroat Cafe. Detective Corporal Morgan asked Michelle if someone stalked Emily in the past.. Michelle said she knew Emily but Emily never told her about being stalked. Michelle said Emily talked about a group of girls at the high school that Emily referred to as the "mean girls". Michelle stated one of these "mean girls" was named Michelle did not know last name. Michelle said if Emily was being harassed or stalked, Emily would have told Michelle. I showed Michelle a booking photo of the suspect Morrison, taken at Jefferson County Jail on July 11, 2006. Michelle looked at the photo and said she didn't remember seeing the suspect at the restaurant. Detective Corporal Morgan and I asked Michelle if she noticed anything unusual about Emily the last time they worked together. Michelle worked with Emily the night before Emily was killed amd that Emily did not show any signs of being distressed.

Detective Corporal Morgan and I spoke with another waitress, (W) Bobbie Sterling (D.O.B. 12-18-1952). Detective Corporal Morgan and I asked Bobbie the same questions we asked of Michelle. Bobbie said Emily appeared to be fine the evening before she was killed. Bobbie knew Jeremy Black, but did not recall there ever being an issue between Jeremy and Emily. Bobbie felt Jeremy just had a typical crush on Emily. Bobbie said Emily did not mention any concerns she had about being harassed or stalked. Detective Corporal Morgan showed Bobbie a picture of suspect Morrison, and Bobbie said the man in the photo looked very familiar to her. Detective Corporal Morgan and I did not find a connection between Jeremy Black and this case.

At about 4:30 pm, a CBI agent (I could not remember his name) called me and requested me to respond to 9600 West Colfax Ave. in Lakewood, where Morrison lived, to meet with ATF agents and CBI agents as a representative from the Park County Sheriff's Office while they executed a search warrant. The motel manager evicted Morrison and cleaned out room 10 where Morrison stayed. There were security cameras in the motel parking lot. I assisted CBI agents reviewing the tape from the security cameras. CBI agents collected Morrison's belongings and the tape from the security cameras.

At about 11:00 pm, I assisted Detective Corporal Franck in collecting suspicious male clothing in the closet at Fitzsimmons Middle School Room 10. The clothes seemed out of place in an art classroom. I videotaped the clothes. Detective Corporal Franck placed the clothes into paper bags. Detective Corporal Franck showed the clothes to CBI Agent Grif and it was decided the Sheriff's Office would hang onto the clothes because there was a chance they could be from the teacher of room 10. I was going to try and find the teacher in the morning to see if they were his clothes. I maintained custody of the clothes until later afternoon on September 29, 2006.

On September 29, 2006, after I attended a CBI briefing at 8:30 am at Platte Canyon School District Office. I asked a member of the school staff to provide me some contact information for the teacher in room 10 at Fitzsimons Middle School. The district office staff told me (W) Rob Henry, art teacher & Athletic Director, teaches in the room 10. The school district office staff gave me Henry's home phone number and she told me he did not have a cell phone. I attempted to contact Mr. Henry on the phone but he did not answer the phone. I

left a message for Mr. Henry to contact the Park County Sheriff's Office as soon as possible and speak with a detective. I learned that Mr. Henry would be at the community church in the morning from unknown teachers.

At about 11:05 am, I was dispatched to assist Deputy Hannigan in an old stalking, harassment and seconddegree burglary case involving (SB) David Shaffer (10-08-57) with a new lead at Platte Canyon Storage located in downtown Bailey. I spoke with Deputy Hannigan at the scene and he requested me to take photograph and collect evidence for the David Shaffer's case. Deputy Hannigan told me that David Shaffer was known to camp out in Bailey area and leave his belongings behind. There were two couch pillows, three pornographic video jackets, one yellow outdoor electrical extension cord, one hand saw and one small Dustbuster handheld vacuum cleaner outside the storage building. I took pictures. I asked Deputy Hannigan to book them into property as found items right away. This case is not related to Duane Morrison. On September 28, I read the letter sent by Duane Morrison to his brother. The letter mentioned about Duane's personal property and how they should be distributed. None of the items matched the items mentioned by Morrison in his letter sent to his brother.

I went to the community church to contact Mr. Henry and he was gone. I spoke with other teachers who told me that Mr. Henry went to Denver and would be back later in the evening. I was not able to contact Mr. Henry. I transferred the suspicious clothes to CBI in the late afternoon.

CBI had a lead that Morrison may have been at the homecoming football game played at Platte Canyon High School Football Field. I spoke with Mr. Schmidt, Assistant Principal with Platte Canyon High School and Coach for the high school football team. I told Mr. Schmidt I was interested in any pictures and videotapes that might capture the audience of the game. I asked Mr. Schmidt if anyone videotaped the homecoming game. Mr. Schmidt told me the school videotaped the game but only the game and would not show any audiences. I asked Mr. Schmidt for a list of his football players but he did not provide me with the list. Mr. Schmidt said he did not know which families videotaped the games from the stands. I asked Mr. Schmidt to ask his football players if anyone videotaped their homecoming game and he said he would ask his players. I have not heard from Mr. Schmidt and any football players.

Detective Corporal Franck told me about threatening emails related to the Platte Canyon High School Shooting received by a female in Aurora. Detective Corporal Franck gave me the contact information for the female party who received threatening e-mails. Detective Corporal Franck gave me the female's phone number. I contacted the female at the phone number 720-949-0957 who verbally identified herself as (OP) Gloria Poole (D.O.B. 08-17-1949) with an address of 13686 E. 14th Ave. #305 Aurora, Colorado 80011. Gloria said she spoke with Detective Corporal Franck on the phone. Gloria told me she received very bizarre e-mails referencing the Platte Canyon High School Shooting and Sheriff Wegener. Gloria said she didn't know how she got the e-mails and had already forward them to Sheriff Wegener and the FBI. Gloria said e-mails mentioned the shooting at the Platte Canyon High School but did not tell me in detail. Gloria wanted me to investigate and prosecute whomever sent these e-mails to her and find out why. I asked Gloria to forward me all e-mails she received

with full header information to me as soon as possible. I advised Gloria to contact her local police department if she felt threatened by these e-mails.

On September 30, I received 10 e-mails from Gloria. Gloria forwarded me the e-mails she received with their header information. Six e-mails appeared to be commercial SPAM, unsolicited RX online store advertisement using current news topic as their subject line to get reader's attention. Three e-mails contained one line of text that did not make any sense. Gloria explained to me in her e-mail that 1 line text contain the word "erosive" and she thought it was similar to "explosive" and another word "scopic" was a reference to some kind of scope on a rifle.

I called Gloria back and explained to her that six of bizarre e-mails she received appeared to be a type of SPAM and three other did not cross the threshold for a criminal case. I again advised Gloria to contact her local law enforcement agency if she felt threatened or in danger.

I have no further information, end of report.

On September 29, 2006 at about 9:00 am I received a call at the Bailey sub-station regarding some suspicious items found at a local storage facility. The reporting party told me he had found some items on the ground outside his storage locker and he thought perhaps they were related to the incident at the high school. The Reporting party identified himself as:

Jay Vanish, Youth Minister, Platte Canyon Community Church.

I asked Jay to remain where he was and not to let anyone in the area. I responded to the storage units located next door to Platte River Auto and met with Jay. Jay told me no one else had tried to get into the area. Jay showed me the items he found. I observed a blanket, some pornography videos, a small car vacuum and an extension cord.

Detective Franck had asked me to respond to the school and assist her. I called Deputy Hannigan on the radio and asked him to respond to my location at the storage units and secure the scene until a detective arrived. I explained to Deputy Hannigan that the items found looked more like something we would find with a locally known drunk, identified as David Shaffer, but it was reported as being related to the school incident and we should treat it as such. I asked Deputy Hannigan to explain the situation in detail to the detective or CBI when they arrive.

Later I spoke to Detective Goto regarding the storage units and he told me Deputy Hannigan had told him only that the items where left by David Shaffer. Detective Goto asked Deputy Hannigan why he did not handle the items from Shaffer himself. Detective Goto took pictures of the location of the items found and told Hannigan to collect them for evidence regarding Shaffer not knowing the scene was to be treated as if it were related to the school incident. I told Detective Goto what I had told Hannigan to explain to him and that he had not done what I asked.

I advised Detective Franck and Sgt. Hardey about the situation upon arrival at the high school.

I have no further information, end of report.

On Wednesday, September 27, 2006 at approximately 12:20 p.m. I was off-duty in Denver at C-470 and University Blvd. in my personal vehicle when I received a cell phone message from my Daughter that there was a "shooter in the high school."

As a member of the active shooter contact team, I called Communications via cell phone and asked "Do we have an incident at the school?" The Communications Officer informed me "Yes." I instructed Communications to advise Sgt. Hardey that I was *en route*.

I arrived at the Platte Canyon High School at approximately 12:50 p.m. and staged at the Command Post where I met with Sheriff Wegener and Undersheriff Gore. At that time, I was dressed in casual business attire but was armed and had an over-vest bearing insignia that identified me as a member of the Sheriff's office, to which I visibly affixed my badge.

At approximately 1:15 p.m., Undersheriff Gore instructed me to return to the Bailey Substation and accomplish three tasks:

- 1) Be a point of contact for the parents trying to get to the High School. I was instructed to remain at the Substation to relay information to the parents.
- 2) Establish an area for the news media.

3) Establish a roadblock to prevent further access south bound from the Substation.

I arrived at the Substation at approximately 1:20 p.m. Within about 20 minutes, I was informed over Bailey 2 to instruct the parents at the Substation that children were being evacuated from the High School and relocated to Deer Creek Elementary.

On 9/27/06 at approximately 11:50 AM, I, Reserve Deputy Humke, was at the Bailey Sub Station and I was told by Sharon in the office that there had been a report of a shooter at Platte Canyon High School. I was not on duty and in plain clothes. I went to my personal vehicle and drove to the High School.

I arrived at the school at approximately 11:55 AM and contacted Corporal Wood on the north entrance of the High School. Corporal Wood went to his vehicle and gave me a shotgun. I initially took a position at the north entrance to the school. I then went to the south side and covered there for approximately 20 minutes and then went inside and contacted Deputy Gaffner. We both went to the second floor where we covered the east side until Sheriff Wegener came out and instructed us to go to the room where the suspect was held up in.

We set up outside and I covered the hallway while Sgt. Bonnelycke negotiated with the suspect. Shortly after I arrived Sgt. Hardey came into the hallway and said he believed he had a shot from an adjacent room at the suspect. I notified Sgt. Bonnelycke what Sgt. Hardey had said.

I continued to cover the hallway and directed the Jefferson County SWAT to the room as they arrived. I observed Detective Bonnelycke negotiate with the suspect and the first female was released and escorted out of the building by Deputy Reynolds at approximately 1:00 PM. She appeared to be shocked and was not crying. The second female was released approximately an nour later and was visibly upset and crying. There were two more females released shortly later and escorted out of the building. Deputy Reynolds told me that one of the females had said she had been

Shortly later one of the Jefferson County SWAT members told me that he believed the suspect might be trying to get into the ceiling because he heard him stacking furniture inside the room. I went to the room where Sgt. Hardey was located and notified him to be aware that the suspect might be trying to get into the ceiling.

At that time Sgt. Hardey opened the door to where the ladder went to the attic area. Sgt Brown and Cpl. Wood went up the ladder and cleared the attic. Jeffco Swat told me that Sgt. Brown and Cpl. Wood were making too much noise and the suspect was getting irritated because he could hear this noise. I immediately went to the ladder and went up to the top and told Sgt. Brown to come down as he was making too much noise. He and Cpl. Wood came down and the door was secured.

The suspect continued to be agitated, as he said he believed the SWAT was still in the attic above him. The negotiator assured him that there was nobody in the attic. The suspect continued to be concerned about what he was hearing and the negotiator told him that the wind was causing the shingles to rattle and that they were hearing the same thing in the hallway.

Sgt. Bonnelycke had taken a break, and a Jeffco negotiator took over for approximately an hour.

I saw the Jeffco SWAT member who was on the floor in the hall pull his eye protection down and it appeared he was getting ready to detonate the device, so I closed the steel doors. About two minutes later the device went off and it pushed the metal door open approximately 3 to 4 inches. I opened the door and went into the hallway. There was a great deal of smoke and noise, but through the smoke I saw a female standing in the hallway in front of the room where the suspect had them hostage. I yelled at her to come to me and she appeared to be disoriented, so I went closer and a SWAT member pushed her in my direction and I grabbed her hand and told her to follow me. We ran out of the hallway and down the stairs. I went with her until we reached the Jeffco patrol cars parked on the sidewalk and told her to go with them.

I returned to the high school building where I observed Lt. Hancock and two other deputies coming down the stairs with backpacks. I assisted in carrying the backpacks to the south side of the high school where they threw them down the side of the hill towards Hwy. 285. As I was returning to the building a Platte Canyon EMS Medic asked me what the situation was and I told her that I believed there were two people down with gunshot wounds to each.

I returned to the second floor location where I assisted Sgt. Hardey in holding the doors open so the EMS personnel could transport Emily through the doors and to Flight For Life.

I returned to the north side of the high school and met with Cpl. Wood, Sgt. Hardey, and Deputy Deberry. I returned Cpl. Wood's shotgun to him and we were notified to meet with Sheriff Wegener at the command ctr. We were briefed by Sheriff Wegener and he told us we were released. I cleared the scene at approximately 5:00 PM.

I have no further information at this time.

On September 28th, 2006, I was assigned to escort and security duties at the Platte Canyon Community Church located on Park County 64 in the town of Bailey. Sgt. West and Cpl. Angeloff of the Jail Division were assisting me on this detail. Our primary duties were to escort family members into the church for debriefing and to keep the media out.

While making a tour of the outer doors, I was contacted by a female party who identified herself as;

was visibly shaken and asked to speak to me. We found a quiet corridor on the basement level of the church and we began to speak. advised that she had brought something up during the grieving process and a "grief counselor" ask her to report that information to a police officer.
advised "I've seen him before. The suspect (referring to Morrison)." I asked her when? "I saw him at the homecoming football game. I didn't put it all together, until I saw his picture on the news." "began crying and her body was shaking.
continued by stating; "I got there late, around 2:00pm. He looked right at me. I didn't think anything of it, he was wearing a blue and white sweatshirt. He had it pulled in real tight around his face. He kept walking around the stands. Just looking into the stands."
Based on my past training and experience, reaction to the information she was providing me appeared to be appropriate. Her relaying of this information appeared to be accurate and honest. I did have some knowledge of the suspect's manner of dress on the day of the shooting (09-27-06) and was aware that report was consistent in part with that information.
As to not taint any future in depth interview, I ceased any further questioning of her. I gained personal information and contacted Cpl. Wood immediately. I requested that Cpl. Wood relay this information to the command center at Platte Canyon High School.
I advised that due to the nature and intensity of this investigation, that should not be contacted in a reasonable amount of time, to feel free to re-contact me.
R/O had no further involvement with this witness at the time of this report.

Chris also told me that he and Jim wanted to and asked if I could contact and see if she would talk with CBI and when would she be available. I told him I would speak with when I interviewed the other victims.

On October 20th, I spoke with Mary Pat Bowen and told her about needing to speak with the hostage victims again for some follow up questions. Mary Pat told me she had to speak with the hostage victims about other items so offered to set up a time frame for the interviews and to get consent from the parents to speak with their children. Mary Pat was also going to ask the parents for their consent to interview the victims at school. I thanked Mary Pat for her help.

On October 21st, I was at the substation in Bailey and spoke with Deputy Brigham. I asked Deputy Brigham about how the information with David Shaffer and the items found at Platte Canyon Storage came about a day or two after the incident. Deputy Brigham told me Jay Vanish found the items outside the storage facility and called police. Deputy Brigham responded and thought the items looked suspicious and did not know if they were related to Duane Morrison. I asked Deputy Brigham to write another supplemental to the report stating how it was thought the items belonged to either David Shaffer or Duane Morrison. Deputy Brigham said he would write a supplemental. As we were talking about the events at Platte Canyon High School, Deputy Brigham told me he was the one who yelled at me stating was a hostage that was just released and needed to be interviewed. I told Deputy Brigham I thought it was Lt. Muldoon who was telling me I needed to interview and Deputy Brigham stated no it was him. (We were across the parking lot from each other and I just didn't recognize Deputy Brigham.)

On October 23rd, I called Chris Schaefer with CBI and told him the information about the confusion of the David Shaffer case. Chris told me David Shaffer was ruled out as having any information on Duane Morrison.

On October 24th, I received in my mailbox at the Sheriff's Office a letter from the Department of Transportation in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. This letter was reference my request for information on Russell Landau the night I was investigating the suspicious letters received by the Keyes family. Sharon thought perhaps when we had the snowstorm in October, which knocked out computers, fax machine and the computers at the substation that perhaps the calls I relied that she contact Rarbie McRee with the county who handles telecommunications and see if

got lost. I asked that she contact Barbie McBee with the county who handles referentiations and see if Quest can check to see if those calls can be retrieved. I am currently working with Barbie reference this issue.
Last week I received another call from Larry Brown asking if any Park County deputies took a written statement from On November 7 th I sent a memo out to the two district Sergeants addressing if any deputy took a statement from I have not heard from any deputy stating they took that statement. Larry told met anded it to a uniformed officer but had no idea what agency.
On Friday November 11 th , I received a voicemail message from Chris Schaefer. Chris wanted to know if I knew anything about student was the student who went shortly after the shooting and said he something to the affect he tried to help the girls in the classroom then later said about his involvement. Chris was reading the report from the agency that interviewed him and had some conflict as to where was that day. Chris asked if I could talk to and find out exactly where he was the day of the shooting.
On November 15 th , I worked a shift at Platte Canyon High School and tried to talk to hadn't shown up for class that day. I left the high school and completed my tour of duty at Deer Creek Elementary and never talked to
On November 16 th , I contacted Corporal Wood and asked if he could speak with about where he was that day. Corporal Wood talked with and stated he never had contact with Morrison and wasn't in room 206 at all. was in the computer area of that particular classroom pod, which was near classroom 206.
At this time I have not been requested to complete any further follow up investigation for CBI.

On September 27, 2006 at about 1200 hours, I; Park County Sheriff's Detentions Deputy Jeremiah Carrigan; heard the report of shots fired at Platte Canyon High School broadcast on my brother's radio. After I heard the local news state that parents were to meet at the Bailey Substation of the Park County Sheriff's Office. I then responded to the substation to volunteer in any way I could. When I arrived at the substation there appeared to be only a few staff members working inside as most other personnel had already reported to the schools. I immediately began answering phone calls from news agencies, and parents demanding information on the events. At the time there had been no information given to the employees at the substation, so I stated that deputies were responding to an unknown incident at Platte Canyon High School. I apologized for the lack of information but asked that they continue to call the substation periodically to check for updates.

After answering several calls, I was asked by an unknown victim's Advocate to go to the Bailey Self Serve gas station to ask that the manager begin a running tally of items given to deputies or riff's Office personnel that come in to purchase food. When I arrived back at the substation I noticed that a large group of parents had formed outside the substation. Two of the parents were walking on the side of the road towards the High School. I reported back to the Victim's Advocate and advised them that I had spoken to the manager at the Bailey Self Serve and that the tab had been set up. I then made contact with the two adult females walking along highway 285. As I approached I was able to visually identify one of the parties to be a parent of a student at Platte and the unidentified party to return to the substation Canyon High School. I then asked. with me. Both women refused and continued walking on the highway. I repeated my request several times, stating that for the safety and security reasons I could not allow them to go to the school. The parties became very agitated and continued to be verbally non-compliant, stating, "I had no idea what they were going through." I explained to them that I did understand and that I had family members at the school, but I still was required to perform my duties as a deputy. At this time became very distraught, and began throwing the items she was carrying at me. Her cellular phone, purse and keys struck me in the chest and legs, but did not cause injuries. I pick her belongings up and returned them to her, and again asked that she return to the substation. At this time she and the other party complied without further incident.

Upon my return to the substation I began directing vehicles into the substation parking area and performing various other crowd control measures. Park County Reserve Deputy Connell arrived and took command of the roadblock we had established at the entrance to the substation. This direction we began checking identification of any vehicle without and markings, regardless of the presence of emergency lights. Detentions Deputy Baker and Auxiliary Deputies Steve and Randy also arrived on scene and began assisting in the operation.

This roadblock was maintained until approximately 2300 hours, at which time Deputy N. Carrigan, Auxiliary Deputy Steve, Auxiliary Deputy Randy, and I moved the road block up to the predale Resort at about mile marker 219 on highway 285. At about 0000 hours on September 28, 2006 the auxiliary deputies were allowed to go home. Deputy N. Carrigan and I continued our watch

at mile marker 219 until about 0300 hours. At 0300 hours we moved the roadblock to the entrance of high school as Lieutenant Hancock requested. At approximately 0420 hours Deputy Hannigan ed at the high school to relieve Deputy N. Carrigan and I. At which time I left the scene and reported to the jail for my scheduled shift. Sergeant Jones was made aware of my involvement in the incident and allowed me to go home to rest.
