My gut says the "less said, the better" and to resist the temptation to respond further at this point. Dave did a nice job defending you. I am a little confused that Dave said it was not an intermediate class and you say it was, but the more you respond, the more fuel you add to the fire. Some people will complain no matter what and, if he is irrational, how can you ever win? If this is in your private business and he uses a mailing list for pima students, then I think you have to contact the dean at the CC for assistance in protecting your reputation, but I would probably take a wait and see stance before acting further.

As you know in the credit classes, we have the syllabus to guide the students and help them understand what is being covered. The course bank, which was developed with the assistance of experts (I believe you and Dave had an opportunity to participate in that process last year), becomes the framework of what will be covered, but individual instructors have the freedom to modify the order and pace. If the material listed is not covered, a student could complain, but at that point, the instructor would also have the opportunity to present his side of the argument on why, with this group of students, it might not have been advisable to move to more advanced skills. In your private practice, where student actually pay a good deal more than for the credit classes per hour of contact with you, claritty on your flyers and in the first session, with an option to get a (prorated) refund if it is not what they wanted expected, might be good business. (Might be bad business, too, if you end up with unethical people who wait untilt he last day of class to tell you it was not what they thought it would be, so I don't want to get into advising you on that particularly.)

Not being an expert on Tai Chi, other martial arts, yoga, pilates (aerobics or really much else for that matter), I would rely on the instructors to teach to the spirit of the course outline even if different philosophies have different terminology. If you had a student who was very caught up in one method over another, or set of terms over another, I would take time to explain the similarities and differences and try to show how I was meeting those objectives using a different philosophy.

I did not have complaints about you for the credit classes, so in my mind this is a non-issue for future employment, except, perhaps, for the conversation on how your style differs from the course bank and what you could do to honor the intent. (It is not practical to change the course bank every time a new instructor is hired, so the terms in the course bank should be generic enough to include multiple philosophies. If they aren't then, perhaps, we should be looking at making a modification that would allow numerous philosophical orientations to be presented. Since multiple campuses could offer the courses, we need to be more broad than narrow in the course bank.)

I'm glad Jason's course is going well. I assumed so as I am most likely to hear from dissatisfied students than the ones having a good time. It's a shame, isn't it? Take care and I hope this was like the lighting of a match - a flash of hotheadedness on the part of this student that burns out in a short time. If, however, he pursues his complaint with the college, contact the appropriate administrator at the CC for advice as soon as you hear of further action on his part.



I met with Jared Lee Loughner today to discuss the incident that occurred yesterday.

I arrived to his math class at 8:20am, introduced myself to the Instructor, quietly introduced myself Jared and informed him that I wanted to hear his perspective, about the incident that occurred yesterday, in the privacy of my office.

He stated, "I am offended" and I informed him that I would like to hear about it outside of the class. He followed me outside of the class, and returned to the class briefly to get his belongings.

As we walked out of the class, he asked me if I was a cop, I told him no, but there could be one if we could not find a way to meet a happy medium. I followed up by letting him know that my goal was to find a middle ground that would benefit everyone concerned. He questioned why he had to leave the class when he was only exercising his freedom of speech.

When we arrived to my office, I asked him to explain what transpired yesterday in his math class, and he said, "I don't know what you are talking about." I reminded him that a complaint was made that he was disruptive in class and he said, "I was not disruptive, I was only asking questions that related to math."

I asked him to tell me the questions he asked? He said, "My Instructor said he called a number 6 and I said I call it 18." He also asked the Instructor to explain, "How can you deny math instead of accept it?"

I asked him to explain how this was pertinent to the subject at hand? He said these questions caused students to think. I asked him to describe his views on time and place. He said he paid \$200 for the class so he should have the right to speak. He added that he has taken other courses and was scammed so he was going to do everything to ensure that he passed this class. I asked him to explain scammed and he said he took prior classes, failed, and did not get his money back.

I asked him if he felt he was being scammed in this math class, he said that he wasn't, but added that it scared him that his freedom of speech rights were being taken away. He also complained about being removed from class to talk to the Counselor.

I told him that I wanted to talk about rights as well as time and place. Every student has the right to have a safe learning environment; how are you meeting the rights of other students when you must exercise your right to call the number 6, 18. Have you considered the rights of the students who are sitting in class struggling to understand 6, while you argue with the instructor?

I informed him that the students are making the same complaint about being robbed of their educational experience that he was making to me, and asked him to explain the difference. I further informed him that the Instructor has to cover material in 5 weeks that is generally covered in 16 weeks, so there might not be time for students to ponder his questions, so his questions might have to be asked after class.

He was reassured that when he becomes an Instructor he will have the right to teach a class based on his teaching style, but in the meantime, his Instructor will conduct the class the way he sees fit and if Jared had a problem with this, I would be happy to drop him from the class.

Jared said he wanted to remain in the class and he showed proof that he was doing the assignments. He asked me if I was saying that he could not speak in class and I informed him that he could ask his philosophical questions after class, and ask "how do I solve this problem questions in class."

He reassured me that he did not want to be expelled from class. I asked him to tell me what he planned to do to remain in this class, and he said that he planned not to ask any questions.

He mentioned in closing that he spoke to some guy (another Counselor in this office) about asking questions in class, and reiterated again that it scared him that his right to freedom of speech was being squelched. This student was informed that the formal code would go into effect if this should happen again.

This student was warned. He has extreme views and frequently meanders from the point. He seems to have difficulty understanding how his actions impact others, yet very attuned to his unique ideology that is not always homogeneous. Since his resolution was to remain silent in class and successfully complete the course, I had no grounds to keep him out of class.

Since he reported that an incident such as this occurred in another class, Administrators will have to help this student clearly understand what is appropriate classroom dialog.

I arrived to his math class at 8:20am, introduced myself to the Instructor, quietly introduced myself Jared and informed him that I wanted to hear his perspective, about the incident that occurred yesterday, in the privacy of my office.

He stated, "I am offended" and I informed him that I would like to hear about it outside of the class. He followed me outside of the class, and returned to the class briefly to get his belongings.

As we walked out of the class, he asked me if I was a cop, I told him no, but there could be one if we could not find a way to meet a happy medium. I followed up by letting him know that my goal was to find a middle ground that would benefit everyone concerned. He questioned why he had to leave the class when he was only exercising his freedom of speech.

When we arrived to my office, I asked him to explain what transpired yesterday in his math class, and he said, "I don't know what you are talking about." I reminded him that a complaint was made that he was disruptive in class and he said, "I was not disruptive, I was only asking questions that related to math."

I asked him to tell me the questions he asked? He said, "My Instructor said he called a number 6 and I said I call it 18." He also asked the Instructor to explain, "How can you deny math instead of accept it?"

I asked him to explain how this was pertinent to the subject at hand? He said these questions caused students to think. I asked him to describe his views on time and place. He said he paid \$200 for the class so he should have the right to speak. He added that he has taken other courses and was scammed so he was going to do everything to ensure that he passed this class. I asked him to explain scammed and he said he took prior classes, failed, and did not get his money back.

I asked him if he felt he was being scammed in this math class, he said that he wasn't, but added that it scared him that his freedom of speech rights were being taken away. He also complained about being removed from class to talk to the Counselor.

I told him that I wanted to talk about rights as well as time and place. Every student has the right to have a safe learning environment; how are you meeting the rights of other students when you must exercise your right to call the number 6, 18. Have you considered the rights of the students who are sitting in class struggling to understand 6, while you argue with the instructor?

I informed him that the students are making the same complaint about being robbed of their educational experience that he was making to me, and asked him to explain the difference. I further informed him that the Instructor has to cover material in 5 weeks that is generally covered in 16 weeks, so there might not be time for students to ponder his questions, so his questions might have to be asked after class.

He was reassured that when he becomes an Instructor he will have the right to teach a class based on his teaching style, but in the meantime, his Instructor will conduct the class the way he sees fit and if Jared had a problem with this, I would be happy to drop him from the class.

Jared said he wanted to remain in the class and he showed proof that he was doing the assignments. He asked me if I was saying that he could not speak in class and I informed him that he could ask his philosophical questions after class, and ask "how do I solve this problem questions in class."

He reassured me that he did not want to be expelled from class. I asked him to tell me what he planned to do to remain in this class, and he said that he planned not to ask any questions.

He mentioned in closing that he spoke to some guy (another Counselor in this office) about asking questions in class, and reiterated again that it scared him that his right to freedom of speech was being squelched. This student was informed that the formal code would go into effect if this should happen again.

This student was warned. He has extreme views and frequently meanders from the point. He seems to have difficulty understanding how his actions impact others, yet very attuned to his unique ideology that is not always homogeneous. Since his resolution was to remain silent in class and successfully complete the course, I had no grounds to keep him out of class.

Since he reported that an incident such as this occurred in another class, Administrators will have to help this student clearly understand what is appropriate classroom dialog.

The instructor contacted Delisa saying that he does not want the student to return to class.

Since there has been no direct threat from the student and since he has completely complied with the directive given to him by Delisa, I did not feel comfortable rushing in to remove the student from class. I spoke at length with Anne Vosberg and she shared my qualms. It is a matter of balancing the disruptive student's right to due process with the rights of the other students in the class. Anne has put a call into Manny Amado for guidance for Monday morning's class.

Depending on the direction that he gives us, our plan right now is to allow the student to attend class on Monday. If Aubrey is back by 8:30, we would ask him to take him aside and remind him that they've already had this same conversation and see his reaction. We would like to have an officer present on the sidelines, and Anne and I will be there as well.

I met with Jared Lee Loughner today to discuss the incident that occurred yesterday.

I arrived to his math class at 8:20am, introduced myself to the Instructor, quietly introduced myself Jared and informed him that I wanted to hear his perspective, about the incident that occurred yesterday, in the privacy of my office.

He stated, "I am offended" and I informed him that I would like to hear about it outside of the class. He followed me outside of the class, and returned to the class briefly to get his belongings.

As we walked out of the class, he asked me if I was a cop, I told him no, but there could be one if we could not find a way to meet a happy medium. I followed up by letting him know that my goal was to find a middle ground that would benefit everyone concerned. He questioned why he had to leave the class when he was only exercising his freedom of speech.

When we arrived to my office, I asked him to explain what transpired yesterday in his math class, and he said, "I don't know what you are talking about." I reminded him that a complaint was made that he was disruptive in class and he said, "I was not disruptive, I was only asking questions that related to math."

I asked him to tell me the questions he asked? He said, "My Instructor said he called a number 6 and I said I call it 18." He also asked the Instructor to explain, "How can you deny math instead of accept it?"

I asked him to explain how this was pertinent to the subject at hand? He said these questions caused students to think. I asked him to describe his views on time and place. He said he paid \$200 for the class so he should have the right to speak. He added that he has taken other courses and was scammed so he was going to do everything to ensure that he passed this class. I asked him to explain scammed and he said he took prior classes, failed, and did not get his money back.

I asked him if he felt he was being scammed in this math class, he said that he wasn't, but added that it scared him that his freedom of speech rights were being taken away. He also complained about being removed from class to talk to the Counselor.

I told him that I wanted to talk about rights as well as time and place. Every student has the right to have a safe learning environment; how are you meeting the rights of other students when you must exercise your right to call the number 6, 18. Have you considered the rights of the students who are sitting in class struggling to understand 6, while you argue with the instructor?

I informed him that the students are making the same complaint about being robbed of their educational experience that he was making to me, and asked him to explain the difference. I further informed him that the Instructor has to cover material in 5 weeks that is generally covered in 16 weeks, so there might not be time for students to ponder his questions, so his questions might have to be asked after class.

He was reassured that when he becomes an Instructor he will have the right to teach a class based on his teaching style, but in the meantime, his Instructor will conduct the class the way he sees fit and if Jared had a problem with this, I would be happy to drop him from the class.

Jared said he wanted to remain in the class and he showed proof that he was doing the assignments. He asked me if I was saying that he could not speak in class and I informed him that he could ask his philosophical questions after class, and ask "how do I solve this problem questions in class."

He reassured me that he did not want to be expelled from class. I asked him to tell me what he planned to do to remain in this class, and he said that he planned not to ask any questions.

He mentioned in closing that he spoke to some guy (another Counselor in this office) about asking questions in class, and reiterated again that it scared him that his right to freedom of speech was being squelched.

This student was informed that the formal code would go into effect if this should happen again.

This student was warned. He has extreme views and frequently meanders from the point. He seems to have difficulty understanding how his actions impact others, yet very attuned to his unique ideology that is not always homogeneous. Since his resolution was to remain silent in class and successfully complete the course, I had no grounds to keep him out of class.

Since he reported that an incident such as this occurred in another class, Administrators will have to help this student clearly understand what is appropriate classroom dialog.

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As we walked out of the class, he asked me if I was a cop, I told him no, but there could be one if we could not find a way to meet a happy medium. I followed up by letting him know that my goal was to find a middle ground that would benefit everyone concerned. He questioned why he had to leave the class when he was only exercising his freedom of speech.

When we arrived to my office, I asked him to explain what transpired yesterday in his math class, and he said, "I don't know what you are talking about." I reminded him that a complaint was made that he was disruptive in class and he said, "I was not disruptive, I was only asking questions that related to math."

I asked him to tell me the questions he asked? He said, "My Instructor said he called a number 6 and I said I call it 18." He also asked the Instructor to explain, "How can you deny math instead of accept it?"

I asked him to explain how this was pertinent to the subject at hand? He said these questions caused students to think. I asked him to describe his views on time and place. He said he paid \$200 for the class so he should have the right to speak. He added that he has taken other courses and was scammed so he was going to do everything to ensure that he passed this class. I asked him to explain scammed and he said he took prior classes, failed, and did not get his money back.

I asked him if he felt he was being scammed in this math class, he said that he wasn't, but added that it scared him that his freedom of speech rights were being taken away. He also complained about being removed from class to talk to the Counselor.

I told him that I wanted to talk about rights as well as time and place. Every student has the right to have a safe learning environment; how are you meeting the rights of other students when you must exercise your right to call the number 6, 18. Have you considered the rights of the students who are sitting in class struggling to understand 6, while you argue with the instructor?

I informed him that the students are making the same complaint about being robbed of their educational experience that he was making to me, and asked him to explain the difference. I further informed him that the Instructor has to cover material in 5 weeks that is generally covered in 16 weeks, so there might not be time for students to ponder his questions, so his questions might have to be asked after class.

He was reassured that when he becomes an Instructor he will have the right to teach a class based on his teaching style, but in the meantime, his Instructor will conduct the class the way he sees fit and if Jared had a problem with this, I would be happy to drop him from the class.

Jared said he wanted to remain in the class and he showed proof that he was doing the assignments. He asked me if I was saying that he could not speak in class and I informed him that he could ask his philosophical questions after class, and ask "how do I solve this problem questions in class."

He reassured me that he did not want to be expelled from class. I asked him to tell me what he planned to do to remain in this class, and he said that he planned not to ask any questions.

He mentioned in closing that he spoke to some guy (another Counselor in this office) about asking questions in class, and reiterated again that it scared him that his right to freedom of speech was being squelched. This student was informed that the formal code would go into effect if this should happen again.

This student was warned. He has extreme views and frequently meanders from the point. He seems to have difficulty understanding how his actions impact others, yet very attuned to his unique ideology that is not always homogeneous. Since his resolution was to remain silent in class and successfully complete the course, I had no grounds to keep him out of class.

Since he reported that an incident such as this occurred in another class, Administrators will have to help this student clearly understand what is appropriate classroom dialog.

Background on this student issue is pretty thoroughly outlined in the email below from Delisa after she spoke to the student and by the earlier series of emails starting at the bottom. Since Delisa wrote wrote her update, the following has happened:

The student returned to the MAT class on Wednesday without incident. On Thursday, however, while he did comply with Delisa's directives to not ask questions that are not pertinent to solving math problems, he did exhibit behavior that could be called "intimidating." Included in that behavior was writing: MAYHEM Festival on his quiz with the word: Imagination; staring at the instructor and some classmates with "an evil" big smile and laughing very inappropriately at a math point the instructor made. The instructor contacted Delisa saying that he does not want the student to return to class.

Yesterday, after the Active Shooter scenario training, I spoke to Officer Amado who recommended that we file a report to open a background investigation. Officer Reeve responded and told me that he would begin the process to take the student out of the class and expel him. I told him that we were not ready to do that because we need more investigation.

I spoke to the instructor this morning to ask if there had actually been an overt and threatening behavior and he said no just bizarre behavior. I also spoke to Aubrey long distance for his insights into this student whom he dealt with last semester on a similar complaint.

Since there has been no direct threat from the student and since he has completely complied with the directive given to him by Delisa, I did not feel comfortable rushing in to remove the student from class. I spoke at length with Anne Vosberg and she shared my qualms. It is a matter of balancing the disruptive student's right to due process with the rights of the other students in the class. Anne has put a call into Manny Amado for guidance for Monday morning's class.

Depending on the direction that he gives us, our plan right now is to allow the student to attend class on Monday. If Aubrey is back by 8:30, we would ask him to take him aside and remind him that they've already had this same conversation and see his reaction. We would like to have an officer present on the sidelines, and Anne and I will be there as well.

That is subject to change pending Manny Amado's recommendations. If anything else happens, I will let you know right away.

Background on this student issue is pretty thoroughly outlined in the email below from Delisa after she spoke to the student and by the earlier series of emails starting at the bottom. Since Delisa wrote wrote her update, the following has happened:

The student returned to the MAT class on Wednesday without incident. On Thursday, however, while he did comply with Delisa's directives to not ask questions that are not pertinent to solving math problems, he did exhibit behavior that could be called "intimidating." Included in that behavior was writing: MAYHEM Festival on his quiz with the word: Imagination; staring at the instructor and some classmates with "an evil" big smile and laughing very inappropriately at a math point the instructor made. The instructor contacted Delisa saying that he does not want the student to return to class.

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I spoke to the instructor this morning to ask if there had actually been an overt and threatening behavior and he said no just bizarre behavior. I also spoke to Aubrey long distance for his insights into this student whom he dealt with last semester on a similar complaint.

Since there has been no direct threat from the student and since he has completely complied with the directive given to him by Delisa, I did not feel comfortable rushing in to remove the student from class. I spoke at length with Anne Vosberg and she shared my qualms. It is a matter of balancing the disruptive student's right to due process with the rights of the other students in the class. Anne has put a call into Manny Amado for guidance for Monday morning's class.

Depending on the direction that he gives us, our plan right now is to allow the student to attend class on Monday. If Aubrey is back by 8:30, we would ask him to take him aside and remind him that they've already had this same

conversation and see his reaction. We would like to have an officer present on the sidelines, and Anne and I will be there as well.

That is subject to change pending Manny Amado's recommendations. If anything else happens, I will let you know right away.

Depending on the direction that he gives us, our plan right now is to allow the student to attend class on Monday. If Aubrey is back by 8:30, we would ask him to take him aside and remind him that they've already had this same conversation and see his reaction. We would like to have an officer present on the sidelines, and Anne and I will be there as well.

That is subject to change pending Manny Amado's recommendations. If anything else happens, I will let you know right away.

If I've missed something or not framed it correctly, please jump in. Pat

I met with Jared Lee Loughner today to discuss the incident that occurred yesterday.

I arrived to his math class at 8:20am, introduced myself to the Instructor, quietly introduced myself Jared and informed him that I wanted to hear his perspective, about the incident that occurred yesterday, in the privacy of my office.

He stated, "I am offended" and I informed him that I would like to hear about it outside of the class. He followed me outside of the class, and returned to the class briefly to get his belongings.

As we walked out of the class, he asked me if I was a cop, I told him no, but there could be one if we could not find a way to meet a happy medium. I followed up by letting him know that my goal was to find a middle ground that would benefit everyone concerned. He questioned why he had to leave the class when he was only exercising his freedom of speech.

When we arrived to my office, I asked him to explain what transpired yesterday in his math class, and he said, "I don't know what you are talking about." I reminded him that a complaint was made that he was disruptive in class and he said, "I was not disruptive, I was only asking questions that related to math."

I asked him to tell me the questions he asked? He said, "My Instructor said he called a number 6 and I said I call it 18." He also asked the Instructor to explain, "How can you deny math instead of accept it?"

I asked him to explain how this was pertinent to the subject at hand? He said these questions caused students to think. I asked him to describe his views on time and place. He said he paid \$200 for the class so he should have the right to speak. He added that he has taken other courses and was scammed so he was going to do everything to ensure that he passed this class. I asked him to explain scammed and he said he took prior classes, failed, and did not get his money back.

I asked him if he felt he was being scammed in this math class, he said that he wasn't, but added that it scared him that his freedom of speech rights were being taken away. He also complained about being removed from class to talk to the Counselor.

I told him that I wanted to talk about rights as well as time and place. Every student has the right to have a safe learning environment; how are you meeting the rights of other students when you must exercise your right to call the number 6, 18. Have you considered the rights of the students who are sitting in class struggling to understand 6, while you argue with the instructor?

I informed him that the students are making the same complaint about being robbed of their educational experience that he was making to me, and asked him to explain the difference. I further informed him that the Instructor has to cover material in 5 weeks that is generally covered in 16 weeks, so there might not be time for students to ponder his questions, so his questions might have to be asked after class.

He was reassured that when he becomes an Instructor he will have the right to teach a class based on his teaching style, but in the meantime, his Instructor will conduct the class the way he sees fit and if Jared had a problem with this, I would be happy to drop him from the class.

Jared said he wanted to remain in the class and he showed proof that he was doing the assignments. He asked me if I was saying that he could not speak in class and I informed him that he could ask his philosophical questions after class, and ask "how do I solve this problem questions in class."

He reassured me that he did not want to be expelled from class. I asked him to tell me what he planned to do to remain in this class, and he said that he planned not to ask any questions.

He mentioned in closing that he spoke to some guy (another Counselor in this office) about asking questions in class, and reiterated again that it scared him that his right to freedom of speech was being squelched. This student was informed that the formal code would go into effect if this should happen again.

This student was warned. He has extreme views and frequently meanders from the point. He seems to have difficulty understanding how his actions impact others, yet very attuned to his unique ideology that is not always homogeneous. Since his resolution was to remain silent in class and successfully complete the course, I had no grounds to keep him out of class.

Since he reported that an incident such as this occurred in another class, Administrators will have to help this student clearly understand what is appropriate classroom dialog.

- Jared Loughner, 22 y/o male, NW campus and West Campus
- Numerous contacts with Aubrey Conover and police regarding disruptive behavior in class
- Challenges teachers in class, says he has right to earn "A" regardless of what answers he gives because of free speech,
- Students in different classes have expressed concern, think he is "dark" and "creepy"
- Feb 2010, Pima DPS contacted after student made very "strange" comments after another student read a poem in class, comments were completely out of context, talking about abortion, wars, killing people, and "strapping bombs to babies", police documented concerns and ran A&W but no further police contact regarding this incident
- 4/6/10. NWC Police called to Library to check welfare of student who was using computer and making loud noises, police came- student was listening to music with headphones, told police he would sometimes get excited and utter phrases from the songs, police told him that not okay for public setting, student says okay
- 5/17/10 WC, instructor reported to police that student became very angry when he received a B in the class, instructor and chair felt intimidated and that it could have become "physical". Police waited outside CFA because both instructor and chair felt scared, no student contact
- 6/3/10. Dean Pat Houston referred to police after math instructor reported student behavior problems in class. Student is argumentative, challenges instructor, strange behavior and a reference to "Mayhem Fest" written at top of one of his math papers, police asked Dean if wanted him to write a referral letter and suspension and Dean said not at this point but did want DPS to look into the student's conduct. References on math paper were to a music festival and band (Lamb of God) Police looked up. No police follow-up but police recommendation for further review. Students are uncomfortable in the class with him too.
- 9/23/10 NWC Instructor called the police for student disturbance in the class when she had informed a student that he would only receive half credit on an assignment because he had turned it in so late. He became loud and belligerent and told the instructor that she was taking away his freedom of speech. They went on like this for awhile and she contacted police. According to the police report one of the officers is concerned about his reasoning and thought process.

Quick Summary of Police Contacts and Behavior Issues Jared L Loughner

- Jared Loughner, 22 y/o male, NW campus and West Campus
- Numerous contacts with Aubrey Conover and police regarding disruptive behavior in class
- Challenges teachers in class, says he has right to earn "A" regardless of what answers he gives because of free speech,
- Students in different classes have expressed concern, think he is "dark" and "creepy"
- Feb 2010, Pima DPS contacted after student made very "strange" comments after another student read a poem in class, comments were completely out of context, talking about abortion, wars, killing people, and " strapping bombs to babies", police documented concerns and ran A&W but no further police contact regarding this incident
- 4/6/10. NWC Police called to Library to check welfare of student who was using computer and making loud
 noises, police came- student was listening to music with headphones, told police he would sometimes get
 excited and utter phrases from the songs, police told him that not okay for public setting, student says okay
- 5/17/10 WC, instructor reported to police that student became very angry when he received a B in the class, instructor and chair felt intimidated and that it could have become "physical". Police waited outside CFA because both instructor and chair felt scared, no student contact
- 6/3/10. Dean Pat Houston referred to police after math instructor reported student behavior problems in class. Student is argumentative, challenges instructor, strange behavior and a reference to "Mayhem Fest" written at top of one of his math papers, police asked Dean if wanted him to write a referral letter and suspension and Dean said not at this point but did want DPS to look into the student's conduct. References on math paper were to a music festival and band (Lamb of God) Police looked up. No police follow-up but police recommendation for further review. Students are uncomfortable in the class with him too.
- 9/23/10 NWC Instructor called the police for student disturbance in the class when she had informed a student that he would only receive half credit on an assignment because he had turned it in so late. He became loud and belligerent and told the instructor that she was taking away his freedom of speech. They went on like this for awhile and she contacted police. Student told police same thing about his freedom of speech. Police note strange behavior, head tiltled to left, eyes were jittery and looking up to the left. According to the police report one of the officers is concerned about his reasoning and thought process.

- You tube video found by Pima DPS on 9/29, student is taping NWC at night, talking very rapidly about torture by Pima College, Pima genocide, illegal behavior, appears very angry, illogical speech, http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FfGk-S93Z0Q
- Aubrey Conover has had at least two additional contacts NWC-for disruptive behavior by this student——

Notes for EAP clinical guidance:

Jared Loughner, 22 y/o male,

- Numerous contacts with police and campus representatives (see above)
- Observed behavior by faculty, students, counselors, police, APM's. Department Chair, just about anyone who
 has met with him causes concerns, "creepy", stares, talks nonsense, talks about his rights a lot but not in
 context with situation and does not seem to understand what is being said to him, police noting eyes darting
 around
- Students have reported concerns with his behavior, scares them
- Meeting with Advanced Program Manager and PIMA counselor (background in behavioral health) to discuss conduct issues in class. Counselor there as an observer: scattered speech, illogical and incoherent at times, seems to cycle in speech, bizarre presentation, clean and dressed simply, no disclosure of previous behavior or mental health issues
- Her concerns- poor insight, poor judgement, no behavioral inhibitions,
- Pima DPS very concerned, immediate suspension, welfare check and refer to Behavior Assessment Committee to give advice on restrictions for return
