I see 10 11 that you're wearing your glasses today. Are those 12 prescription glasses? Yes, they are. 13 INMATE SPENCER: PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: 14 Do you see well 15 with those? 16 INMATE SPENCER: Yes. Okay. Also, on the 17 PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: 18 table that you are seating, there's a magnifying device, 19 if should you need those, you can call the attention of the officer and they will provide that to you. I also see 20 21 that you wear your foot orthosis. Are you wearing those 22 today? 23 Yes, I am, sir. INMATE SPENCER: 24 PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: <inaudible>. So, 25 Ms. Spencer, have you been a part of the mental health

9	take any psychotropic medications?

11	PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: When was the last
12	time that you took any of those medications?
13	INMATE SPENCER: This morning.
14	PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: Do you believe are
15	those going to affect your ability to communicate with us
16	this morning?
17	INMATE SPENCER: No, they're not.
18	PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: Thank you. Uh, to
19	Counsel, does your client require any other reasonable
20	accommodation for this hearing today?
21	ATTORNEY RUMMEL: Yes. Oh, I'm sorry. I concur.
22	She, her to come at her, she's, she's adequately
23	accommodated.
24	PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: Thank you,
25	Counsel. So, based on those answers to our question and

the information we do have, this Panel does not see a reason why this hearing cannot go forward today. Counsel, before we get on the re— go on the record, you indicated that your client would like to make a request to the Panel this morning. You may proceed.

ATTORNEY RUMMEL: Yes. We are requesting a, um, three-year stipulation so that my client may continue to develop and firm up parole plans and be prepared for the hearing.

PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: Thank you. So, Ms. Spencer, your, uh, Attorney has made a request that she indicated that you want to have a three-year stipulation. In order to make further improvement regarding a program. Is that correct?

INMATE SPENCER: Yes, it is, sir.

PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM:

Spencer, understand that you do have a he- a right to a hearing today?

Do vou, Ms.

13	PRESIDING COMMISSIONER NDUDIM: Thank you. So, uh,
14	at this time, the time is 8:51. Uh, Commissioner Harrell
15	and I are going to drop off temporality to review the
16	request for stipulation. Uh, now, we'll come back and
17	announce our decision with regards to the request. Uh, the
18	time is 8:51 AM. We are off the record.
