OFFENSE: 1st Degree Criminal Trespass (F5), Theft (F4), and Criminal Mischief (M2). On 1/30/98, Dylan Klebold and his codefendant Eric Harris were driving around their neighborhood when they decided to park near the intersection of Deer Creek Canyon Rd, and Wadsworth Blvd to "mess around". They noticed a van parked on the other side of the lot, and went to look inside. They saw alot of electronic equipment, they broke the van's window, and took the items that were inside. They left the scene, and went and parked at the Jefferson Co. open space nearby. Eric and Dylan were looking at the electronic equipment they took when a Jefferson Co. Sheriff knocked on the window, and began questioning them about the equipment. Dylan and Eric admitted guilt, they were arrested, booked, and released to their parents.

PRIOR RECORD: None.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS: Dylan and his parents went to family counseling after his brother was kicked out of the house.

DRUG/ALCOHOL HISTORY: ALCOHOL: Light. Dylan has drank alcohol 5 or 6 times, and has been drunk the same amount. The first time he tried alcohol was at age 15, the last time was two months ago. He doesn't like the taste or effects of alcohol, and said he decided to stop because it "wasn't worth it". Dylan thinks that drinking alcohol is okay as long as it is in moderation. DRUGS: Light/none. Dylan has tried Marijuana twice, the last time was 9 months ago. He feels that Marijuana is a "waste of time and money". He makes a big distinction between Marijuana and other "harder" drugs, he said that other drugs can be



"devastating". Dylan has never been offered or used other illegal drugs. Dylan's brother has a substance abuse problem, and was kicked out of the house for continued drug use. Dylan said that he has seen first hand how drugs can ruin your life, and that is why he decided to stop.

**EDUCATION/EMPLOYMENT HISTORY:** Dylan is a junior at Colombine High School. His grades range from A's to D's. He mostly takes honors classes, and said that even though he has trouble with some of them, regular classes don't challenge him enough. Dylan said he makes a good effort towards school, but admits he could try harder. Dylan was suspended last October for three days for possessing student locker combinations. No attendance problems. Dylan gets along well with teachers and administrators, and has many friends. He is currently looking for a job for the summer. Dylan plans to graduate from High School, go to College, and major in computer science.

**FAMILY HISTORY:** Dylan describes his relationship with his parents as "better than most kids", and says they are supportive, loving, dependable and trustworthy. His parents said that Dylan has a difficult time communicating with them, but he is getting better. Mr. and Mrs. Klebold are very proud of Dylan's past accomplishments, and can't understand why he committed this offense. Dylan has a 19 year old brother Byron, he doesn't see him much because he was kicked out of the house for drug use. He said that he loves his brother, but cannot condone his behavior. His punishments usually consist of being grounded, and not being able to use the computer. Mr. and Mrs. Klebold feel involved in Dylan's life, and said they know where he is and who he is with most of the time. After this incident occurred he was grounded for a month, and was not allowed to spend time with Eric (codefendant). Mr. and Mrs. Klebold are happy that Dylan got caught, and were bothered that his actions were so "unethical". They believe that Diversion is a good program and feel it will be beneficial. They are "thankful" that Dylan has the opportunity to complete this program. No criminal history in the family.

**PEER RELATIONSHIPS:** Dylan enjoys spending time with friends, listening to music, working on the computer, reading, and playing pool. His parents know the majority of his friends, and he feels comfortable having friends over. A few of his friends drink alcohol on occasion, none of them use drugs. Eric Harris (codefendant) is his only friend with a criminal history. Dylan said that gangs are "pointless", and he has no interest in them. He does not currently have a girlfriend, and has never been sexually active. He is well educated on sexually transmitted diseases, and birth control.

INTAKE IMPRESSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: Dylan was cooperative and open during his intake. He said that Diversion is an appropriate consequence for his actions, and that his contract items are fair. His parents were surprised at his past usage of drugs and alcohol. It is my belief that even though Dylan knows what he did was wrong, he still lessens the seriousness of his offense. Dylan is a 12 mo CA, his contract includes; 45 hrs of community service, drug and alcohol evaluation, the CJ class, an ethics class, bimonthly progress reports, and an apology letter to his victim.

Attempt phone contact with juvenile and/or family within 24 hours of being assigned case. Explain the Diversion program and why the case was referred to us. The phone interview should be a quick call to determine obvious initial ineligibility. If you cannot quickly determine that the juvenile is ineligible and/or you need additional information, err on the side of caution and schedule an intake group date. When scheduling the family for an intake group, provide them the option of the next two upcoming intake dates only. Allow yourself two individual intake time slots (new format) each week for overflow or complicated cases. Also schedule an orientation group date and then provide directions to the intake site (D.A.'s office or the Taj).

1) Verify juvenile's address. If the Juvenile lives outside of Jefferson County, he is not eligible for Diversion. If the number you have is incorrect and you cannot contact the juvenile or family, give the information to Parti so she can contact George Mumma to do an investigation

2) Ascertain culpability for the referring charge. Does the juvenile take responsibility for the alleged criminal offense? Explain limited immunity and that what he says will not be used against him in a court of law. However, we need to know if he is accepting responsibility which is required for acceptance onto Diversion. If the juvenile does not take responsibility for the offense and does not think the charges are fair, then he is not eligible for Diversion. Sometimes discussion around guilt is required and an intake is warranted even if they appear to deny guilt ("I thought I had permission."). Blatant denials are not eligible for intake ("you have the wrong guy," "I wasn't there.")

3) Does the juvenile have any prior or pending charges? If the juvenile has prior district level adjudication(s), pending district level charges, past sex offenses or past violent offenses he is not eligible for Diversion.

4) Has the juvenile ever been part of a gang or involved in gang activities? If the juvenile states he currently belongs (within the last year) to a gang he is not eligible for Diversion. If there is any question regarding level of involvement, obtain additional information at intake.

5) If possible, determine if there is an obvious safety issue. If parents report that the juvenile's behavior remains out of control or he is an immediate threat to himself or others (continual runaway, recent attempt of suicide, assaultive, etc...), his case may be more appropriately handled through court. If it is not immediately clear there is a safety issue, gather additional information at the intake. If there appears to be many issues at hand, the case may be better suited for an individual intake date.

AND PROCEDURES

You have the following constitutional and legal rights. Read each one carefully. If you do not understand these rights or have any questions, those will be answered in your first meeting with Diversion.

1. The District Attorney's office has reviewed the charges against you and believes that it has a valid case to prosecute in court. However, the District Attorney's office has decided to offer you an alternative to prosecution: Juvenile Diversion.

2. During your intake with Juvenile Diversion you have limited immunity. That means that you can discuss the charge against you with the Diversion Officer, and the Diversion Officer cannot use that information to testify against you in Court.

3. If after meeting with Diversion you decide that you want to go to court, You may have a Petition in Delinquency filed against you with the Court. That is a request to the Court to find that you are a delinquent child. The Petition will be based upon the charge or statement that you committed an act or acts which are in violation of the law and, therefore, are delinquent acts if committed by you. you have these rights under Colorado State Law:

A) You have the right to be silent; that is, the right to make no statements or explanations to anyone about these matters. Anything you do or say must be voluntary and can and will be used against you in Court. You have the right to have a parent or lawyer present before you say anything; and even if they are present, you still do not have to say anything.

B) You have a right to have a lawyer at all times. If you cannot afford one, the Court will appoint one to represent you at no expense to you.

C) You have the right to have a hearing or trial to determine if the allegations of the offense(s) are true. That hearing would be in front of a Judge unless you request a jury of six people.

D) You would have to request a jury trial in person before the Court if you wanted one.

E) At the hearing, witnesses would be called against you and you could ask them questions. You could call witnesses to testify for you and could subpoena them and make them come to Court if they would not agree to come voluntarily.

F) You could testify yourself and make your own explanation of what happened if you wanted; however, you would not have to testify; no one could make you, and it cannot be held against you if you do not.

G) It is the responsibility of the State through the District Attorney to convince the Judge or jury beyond a reasonable doubt that you committed one or more of the acts charged in the Petition, or the case would be dismissed. If you did not agree with the decision of the Judge or jury, you could appeal the case to a higher Court.




2) If the Judge or jury finds the allegations in the Petition to be true, or if you admit them, then a hearing would be held to determine what to do with you. This hearing is called a dispositional hearing. The possible dispositions are that you could be placed on probation; you could be fined up to three hundred dollars (\$300.00); or you could be placed in a hospital or other place for examination and evaluation of any mental health problems by a physician or psychologist; you could be committed to the custody of the Division of Youth Corrections or Department of Social Services for placement in a foster home, group home, youth camp, or a locked facility for up to two years.

3) You may petition the Court for the expungement of your record, which involves the sealing of all records, including those of police agencies, one year after you are released from probation as provided by law.


4) If you choose to participate in the Diversion Program, you are waiving any right you may have to have the charges which are the subject of the Petition of Delinquency filed in a speedy manner. In addition you are consenting to participate in the Diversion Program for a period of up to eighteen months from the time of your acceptance into the Program.

If you choose to participate in the Diversion Program, you have these additional rights.

1. You may be represented by an attorney at every stage of the proceedings.
2. The child and his parent(s), guardian, or other legal custodian must freely and voluntarily consent, in writing, to the Diversion Program.
3. Any admissions made by you, in writing or verbally, pursuant to this Diversion Program shall not be used against you.
4. You may petition the Court for the expungement of your record; which involves the sealing of all records, including those of police agencies, one year after you are released from supervision of the Diversion Program.



## CA CONTRACT

I, Dylan Klebold, exchange for being accepted into the First Judicial District's Diversion Program, do hereby agree to the following programs and conditions in addition to court conditions.

10. VALE Fund Fee (\$125.00 for Felonies) (\$60.00 for Misdemeanors) as directed by Diversion Representative -- remit by money order payable to "Clerk of the Combined Courts"
11. JDP Insurance (\$3.25) -- remit by personal check or money order payable to "Jeffco Commissioners"
12. Community Service Work (30 45 ~~X~~ hours min.) as directed by Diversion Representative DEADLINE: 8/3/98
13. Orientation Group for Client and Parent
14. Mental Health evaluation/treatment (individual and/or family) ---- (as required)

16. Report any change of address or phone number to Diversion Officer within three (3) working days of said change

## DIVERSION EXPECTATIONS

As a participant with the Jefferson County Juvenile Diversion Program, I *Dylan Klebold*, understand and agree to follow these expectations.

### 1. Juvenile Diversion is based on Personal Responsibility and Personal Accountability.

Responsibility means you will answer for your actions and obligations. You will act in socially acceptable ways and strive to complete all your legal and moral obligations.

Accountability means that you will admit your actions and accept the consequences of those actions, good and bad.

According to these definitions and by accepting Diversion, you are agreeing to these principles.

Being honest is expected at all times and does not excuse your behavior.

You will not make excuses or hold others to blame for your mistakes and failures. Rather, you will hold yourself accountable for your actions or lack of actions while on Diversion.

One way of demonstrating accountability and responsibility while on Diversion is understanding that no one has to help you succeed on Diversion. Friends or family may be willing to take you to your appointments or elsewhere and your parents may be willing to help you pay your fees. If they are unable, unwilling or simply do not follow through with helping you, they will not be held accountable. YOU WILL.

If you have the ability to accomplish something on your own, do not take advantage of another's generosity.

Remember -- If others are willing to help you, out of common courtesy, you should show your appreciation. (ie...cooking dinner, cleaning house, monetary payments).

You are responsible for keeping all your appointments with Diversion and provide 24 hours notice when you cannot do so. Failure to provide notice will be considered a contract violation. If you are late, it will be considered a tardy (with possible consequences if you establish a pattern of being late)



Some reasons are ok for rescheduling and others are not:

- Genuine Emergency (may require verification)
- Illness (may require verification)

Not Okay

- Work schedules (you are expected to have planned well and coordinated all your obligations)

- No "sagging"
- No obscene or suggestive clothing.
- No Violent sayings or pictures on clothing.

Remember: Use good judgement when deciding the difference between what is offensive or disrespectful and what is different.

You will be prepared to provide a urine scan each time you attends a Diversion appointment, or upon request.

You will treat all referral agencies with respect and follow their rules.

You will give 100% effort toward completing your Diversion requirements and nothing less will be accepted.

PROGRAM PARTICIPATION: Dylan accepted Diversion on the presenting charges of 1st Deg. Criminal Trespass (F5), Theft (F4), and Criminal Mischief (M2). Dylan's Diversion contract included a Drug and Alcohol Evaluation, Ethics Class, CJ Class, Progress reports, Apology Letter, Community Service, Fees, Adult Legal Issues and Daytimer.

Dylan did a very nice job on Diversion. He quickly completed the drug evaluation and no further tx. was recommended. He was able to attend the Discovery Class at ISAE although, he did not feel that it was of much use to him. Dylan's attitude while on Diversion was solid and he remained motivated even when I added the Adult Legal Issues Packet to the contract. As a result of the responsibility he displayed I removed the CJ Class from the contract in August. 45 hours of CSW were complete at various locations in the community and Dylan felt like this was the most effective piece of Diversion. He learned a lot from having to give up free time to work for no money. All fees and the two negative UA's provided while on Diversion were paid in a timely manner. Dylan had a tendency to struggle with motivation around school work so we focused on this area for some time. He was able to maintain a good grade point average after some confrontation and is set to graduate in the Spring 1999.

PROGNOSIS: Good Dylan is a bright young man who has a great deal of potential. If he is able to tap his potential and become self motivated he should do well in life.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Successful Termination

Dylan has earned the right for an early termination. He needs to strive to self motivate himself so he can remain on a positive path. He is intelligent enough to make any dream a reality but he needs to understand hard work is part of it.

## Discovery Class

I attended the I.S.A.E. discovery class on December 12, 1998. This was an all-day class, instead of the four 2-hour class option. I chose the all at once method because I understand things quickly. The class, truthfully, was not worth my time. If I wasn't me, I would be voicing a different opinion. The teacher was informative, and the information was valuable, but I already knew almost all of what the teacher had to say. She talked about influences, and how they affect us. Family, friends, media, T.V., radio, almost everything around us is an influence. I already knew this. She pointed out that influences make us sometimes act differently. I knew that too. Our class also talked about how to get what we wanted out of life. This is by making positive, right choices and also by persevering toward these goals. We talked about coping mechanisms. A coping mechanism is what one uses to handle/manage stress, or how to deal with problems. Some of these include counting, exercising, taking a walk, reading, and many other tasks. A coping mechanism is a positive alternative to making a wrong decision. I, unfortunately for my boredom, knew these things too, and use them and have used them on a regular basis for quite some time. For the other kids in the class, however, this is a valuable tool for them to use in their lives. The class talked about values, and what was valuable to each of us. Some of the topics that came up were friendship, knowledge, family, money, respect, health, happiness, love, pleasure, and others. I, as any other person, value these things too. The teacher linked these values to the crimes we committed and the way that we depleted these values by committing crime. I think this came thru to most of the people in the class. And again, I already knew my values. All in all, the class was a waste of time for me, and even though it went over important skills that would be greatly beneficial to someone else hearing them for the first time, it was an eight hour day of pointless review and cramped conditions. I feel that I shouldn't have had to take that class, but I'm just trying to get out of the diversion program, as evidenced by my reluctant attendance to this fit-for-an-uneducated person's class.

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## time management

time management is an essential aspect of society in the twentieth century. since the invention of clocks in the middle ages, people have become more productive, efficient, and have had better life styles. knowing how and when to do certain things is one key to a happy lifestyle.

some examples of controlled time management are the daylight savings hour switching every spring and fall, and also the designated time for people to sleep. since we sleep at night, when doing work is not feasible because of the lack of sunlight, we can utilize the entire day for consciousness, when we can be as productive as possible. time management is a skill that some people have trouble obtaining, but those people, like me, can find ways of making useful time management schedules. every species integrates effective time management into its society, its survival. predators know to hunt at night, when other nocturnal animals will be active. the bear successfully uses time management, as he hibernates during the cold months of winter. without time management,



productivity is decreased dramatically, sometimes to certain doom. In a seventeenth century battle during the seven years' war, the French had established an impenetrable stronghold on British land, a veritable beachhead for further invasion. The French cannons dug in, and the British had to retaliate. Their final maneuver would be to scale the cliff walls opposite the cannons. The French general knew that a small British force was climbing these cliff walls but he expected the main force to come from the hills where the cannons were located. However, all cannons failed to fire because the British surprised and destroyed the cliff scaling British, and thus general united. It turned out that the entire army climbed the cliff walls, breaking the French citadel and securing the land from any further invasion. "As I looked upon the bodies dying in the sun, I knew that he who hesitates is lost". This general did not know time management, as he hesitated when he should have acted. An experienced time management counselor would have retorted the cannons sooner, ending the British threat. In conclusion, this and other examples show the importance of time management.
